

## Grafty Garden Cuttings – January

A few days' rain and cabin fever sets in: it is too wet to dig, too wet to clear leaves and too wet to squelch across the lawns, but no complaints if the aquifers are, at last, filling up. We have completed moving the shed, so we are now down to the indoor jobs that have been put off for the last 20 years. (We had more rain in the first week of December, than in the whole of November).

The aforementioned shed has been taken to the very top of the garden ready for our retirement, when we shall sit, blanket covered, hot flask to hand, bird watching or rabbit scaring. Really, it is mostly for the grandchild/children - mostly. The rabbits are still on the attack, now burrowing right through the bank to gain access, chewing at more trees and shrubs and generally causing my stress levels to rise. Further unsightly wire surrounds are appearing.

The unusually warm weather means that I was able to pick strawberries at the end of November and raspberries into December, piles of leaves are still blowing about the garden, although I have raked up a huge bin full, and trees and flowers are in bud, either months ahead or months later, than their time. A friend reported her lilac in bloom at the beginning of December.

By the end of the month, we have to think about buying seed potatoes, onion sets and, if not already planted, garlic, sowing early tomatoes and basically notching up a gear, for the new season. Soil can be dug and generally prepared, then covered with polythene to warm it up for early spring sowings. Indoor plants need frequent checks for pests and diseases, picked over and treated with Provado Bug killer or sprayed with soft soap, if pests are found and any dead or dying leaves and flowers taken off back to the main stem, to stop the spread of fungal diseases.

Apple and pear trees should be pruned and if woolly aphid have been at work try spraying with dilute washing up liquid (1 good squirt to about 1 litre water) and scrub them off. Mowers and tools should be serviced and cleaned, ready of the new season and used pots and trays washed.

### **Grafty Green Heating Oil Club**

Grafty Green has a successful Heating Oil Club. We have to date nearly 100 members all taking advantage of cheaper heating oil when ordered in bulk. To make this club work all members have to have at least the minimum 500 Litres every time we order, that is about 3 to 4 times a year. It makes sense to have a bulk order delivered over 2 to 3 days every 4 months, rather than have tankers clogging up our village every week.

### **Have the *'Time of Your Life'* ~ Happy New Year!**

*"To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven"*

At this annual celebration of another New Year, we stand in awe and expectation at the mystery of the passage of time. In the course of one night, at a particular moment, we witness the turning of time, and as day dawns we greet another year, sometimes a decade, a century or, not so long ago, a new Millennium. It's only the passage of one night, arguably little or no different from any other, but we invest that night with great hope for what may lie ahead.

You may recognise the headline quote: it was the sub-title of a hit record way back in 1965. It was sung by a group called The Byrds and is often to be heard on radio play-lists to this day. The song was written in the 1950s by the American folk-singer and song-writer, Pete Seeger. It had two titles: the first was *Turn! Turn! Turn!* and the second, *'To Everything There Is a Season'*. This latter title is a direct quote from the Bible, from the Old Testament Book of Ecclesiastes, so too are the words of the song, for example in its first verse:

*A time to be born, a time to die  
A time to plant, a time to reap  
A time to kill, a time to heal  
A time to laugh, a time to weep.*

The song was written in 1954 in the light of the horrors of World War II and continuing conflicts such as the Korean War. It became an anti-war anthem for the peace movement and the song-title, *'Turn, turn, turn'*, was to urge us to turn away from war and violence. From time to time, we feel that turning points have occurred in world history as, for example, in 1989 with the fall of the Berlin Wall and the beginning of the end of the Cold War. It seemed that peace was breaking out all over but within a very short time more conflicts raged in all too many places.

This past year has seen the continuation and escalation of war-fighting, terrorism and violence on a near-unprecedented scale short of global war, but it has also been filled with much for which we can be thankful.

This New Year, as we bid farewell to 2006 and welcome 2007, I pray for that time when nation will truly live at peace with nation, and neighbour with neighbour; I pray too that we may all find in our hearts and lives: *'the peace of God which passes all understanding'*.
