# 2009 LONDON MINIFEST

This event will take place on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> November at Faraday house, Old Gloucester Street, Holborn, London.

It will be a full day of writing, publishing and performance related workshops, celebratory readings and networking with community writing and publishing groups from all over the UK. The attendance fee will be £15 per head (£10 Concessions) payable to TheFED.

Lunch and refreshments are included.

GROW will be hiring a small coach to take us there and back. Seats on the coach for MiniFest attendees cost £8 each. Seats must be paid for in advance.

Any seats left over may be taken by people who'd like to have a cheap daytrip to London, but not attend the MiniFest. Coach seats for London Day-Trippers cost £10 each.) Please ask your friends and family if they would like to support GROW in this way.
