PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

The village survey has been completed so thank you to all those who participated and to Andrea Cook for organising – we still need to analyse the data but, as promised, the results will be published and likely to be included within next month's WIN. We continue to receive updates on the dog fouling on the recreation ground and other areas of the village and we will be actioning a range of measures in an attempt to address this unacceptable behaviour. West Berkshire has published an updated report on the speeding at the eastern end of the village along with suggestions for a Vehicle Activated Sign (similar to the temporary sign that has been installed for the past months). We will be able to provide a full update on this at the next PC meeting. The new flooring in the Village Hall has been completed and although I haven't seen the work for myself, I have been told that it has made a big difference, so well done to all involved. Please note that the next PC meeting is on Monday 13 September and, who knows, we might be able to hold this in the Village Hall (but still to be confirmed) and look forward to seeing some of you then. Lastly I would like to thank SWIWI for organising the 'Picnic on the Pitch' what a great idea and look forward to seeing everyone and welcoming the new residents of WI for a proper social event - it has been a while!



MALTHOUSE WELL

The Malthouse well level peaked in March this year at about 6.3 metres below ground level and since then it has steadily dropped over the Spring and Summer by approximately 9 metres. It currently stands around 15.4 metres below ground level. Unless we have a deluge of biblical proportions, it will typically continue to drop until around the end of the December.

Groundwater levels in West IIsley rise and fall with the seasons, normally reaching a peak in the Spring following replenishment through the late autumn and winter when losses by water evaporation and plant uptake are low. The Malthouse well water level is

typical in this regard and this year it peaked on 8th March.





I was asked recently by the Editors to write something about the IIsley Evergreens, "just something about your trips maybe".

When I took over as secretary from Jim Hughes he passed on to me <u>lots</u> of paperwork including letters, files, invoices and note books. Having recently had the time to look at these items I have discovered a notebook containing the first ever minutes of the meeting held at the invitation of Mrs S Gore at the "Manor" to form the West Ilsley "Evergreens" Club on the 16th of February 1967.

I will try to write a brief history of the Evergreens and submit it to the WIN for future issues and for the West Ilsley Village website.
