PARISH MATTERS

The dog area is still closed. A bin has been taken from the main part of the park by the purple climbing frame. The community warden has obtained a salt bin for the village, which will be placed on Preston Road. The flooding by Bradgate has returned following the heavy rain

PLANNING

the application of Land on South side of Manston Court Road and West Side of, Haine Road, Ramsgate – comments to be submitted. Against the proposal.

HIGHWAYS

Flete Road update – Cllr Dolan advised that 4 separate farmers have been consulted with 2 definite yes's to close the road and 1 doesn't mind either way. 21 residents live in the road and 18 have responded to agree to close the road.. Clerk read the response from KCC regarding the process of obtaining road closure. Cllr Dearing proposed a traffic survey be undertaken as suggested by Highways Department, Seconded Cllr Samme, 4 in favour, Cllr Champs abstained. Clerk to contact KCC to instruct survey.

MANSTON PARK

Dog area is still closed, and will stay closed until grass grows again. Dog waste bags have run out, Clerk to contact TDC.

WW1 BEACON

Cllr Dolan gave an update on the Beacon lighting – she has contacted RAF air cadets to perform the last post – Cllr Dearing has offered to investigate a contact he has regarding a bugle player.. Climagate will be repairing the beacon basket. The event will be very informal, the names of those lost in WW1 will be read out.

INDIVIDUAL COMMITTEE REPORTS

Cllr Dawson advised the slow signs on Spratling St can be discussed in a meeting with Paul Valek, Cllr Samme & Cllr Dearing will meet with him. Pothole have been filled very quickly - £8.1 m was spent, some complaints have been received as some of the pot holes have been reappearing. Tony Gander (Community warden) confirmed he has obtained a grit bin for the village and will be sited in Preston Road. Bins will be filled up later on in the year, he is also arranging for salt bags to be delivered, He encouraged residents to use Country Eye to report any issues.

QUESTIONS

Preston Park Right of Way - Cllr Dearing confirmed that the public rights of way officer has advised the issue has been resolved? However, he has not been informed of the outcome, he will write and find out. .

The next Parish Council and Annual Parish Meeting will be held 14th May 2018 at 7:00pm in the RAF Manston History Museum.

Bicycle CRIME PREVENTION

MAKE / TYPE

Take a photograph of your bike and on the reverse note down the make, colour and serial number

MARK IT

Mark the frame of your bike with your postcode and house name / number using an ultraviolet marker pen. When recovered it helps the police to find the owner.

LOCK IT

Always lock your bike as most of the bikes that are stolen are either not locked or locked up incorrectly. Ensure that you place the locking mechanism around the frame of the bike and secure it to something solid and not moveable i.e a lamp post or cycle rack.

ALWAYS

Secure your bike whenever leaving it unattended. When at home do not leave your bike lying around either the front or rear garden insecure. Lock your bike away either in a shed or garage

NEVER

Leave your bike insecure even when you are just popping out to either a friends house or a shop.
