# Welcome to this year's schedule for the 70<sup>th</sup> Denmead Village Show

We would like to thank the PCC and vicar of All Saints Church for making us welcome for another year.

2020 was our 70<sup>th</sup> year but as we were unable to hold the show this is our 70<sup>th</sup> Summer Show. If you are new to exhibiting, or need some reminders, please read on. Horticultural, homecraft and handicraft exhibits will be staged in the main hall, floral art, quilts and photography classes may be staged in the Church, depending on available space. All the outside areas, including the car park, will be used for stalls and entertainments so please note that there will be **no parking on site**.

### **Exhibitors in the Horticultural Show**

There will be a one way route to drive in and drop off your exhibits. You will then need to park in the village centre or Kidmore Lane car park before returning to stage your exhibits. We do ask you to be patient and for everyone's safety, to follow the steward's instructions. Please allow plenty of time for dropping off and placing your exhibits between 7.30 and 9.30am on the day or on Friday between 6.00pm - 8.00pm.

If you have never entered a show before, here are a few hints to help you

- Read the schedule and rules very carefully, especially where a number of items or size are specified
- If you are not sure about the requirements of a particular class, contact the Show Secretary for advice (see inside back page)
- Send in your entry form and fee before the deadline (Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> August) and keep a note of what you are entering
- Make sure you arrive in good time to stage your exhibit(s) all exhibitors must leave the hall by 9.30am for judging to begin
- Please do not touch other people's exhibits, if you need more space ask one of the stewards to help
- Don't take it all too seriously, learn from any mistakes and most of all, have fun.

Exhibitors will be issued a **free entry pass** by the Show Secretary on the day. We look forward to seeing you there.

### **GENERAL RULES FOR EXHIBITORS**

- 1 All classes are open to members and non-members alike.
- All exhibits, shall be the **bona fide** work of the Exhibitor and except in Floral Art (Section II) and class 213, all plant material must be grown by the exhibitor in his or her own garden or allotment.
- All entries shall be made on the Form provided and delivered to 1 Frenchies View, Denmead PO7 6SH or the Show Secretary ON OR BEFORE TUESDAY 17<sup>th</sup> August. Earlier entries will be appreciated. NO LATE ENTRIES OR ALTERATIONS TO CLASSES ENTERED CAN BE ACCEPTED.
- 4 Entry Fees: Junior Classes 10p
  All other Classes 25p
- 5 <u>All Exhibits are to be staged by 9.30am</u> on Show Day and Exhibitors must vacate the Show Area for judging to commence (or 6pm 8pm on Friday evening, see p 2).
- 6 Exhibitors must not move other exhibitors' entries. Should more space be needed, please ask the Show Secretary or Stewards.
- Any entry deemed to be in the wrong class may be moved by the Show Secretary.
- 8 No more than 3 entries in any class may be entered by the same Exhibitor, and only one cash prize in any one class will be awarded to the same Exhibitor.
- The Judge's decision is FINAL regarding the merit of Exhibits. All matters of dispute shall be settled by the Society's Show Committee. Any protest shall be made to the Show Secretary by 3 pm with a payment of £1 which will be refunded if the Exhibitor's complaint is upheld.
- Exhibitors may leave their Exhibits to be auctioned at the end of the Show for the Society's funds. Those willing to do so should collect a 'FOR SALE' card from the show secretary to place by their exhibits.
- NO EXHIBITS or prize cards shall be removed until prize giving, at approximately 4pm. Not for sale items should be removed promptly.
- Cups, Medals and Diplomas will be awarded on the Judge's decision of merit and points will be awarded as follows:
  - 1<sup>st'</sup> 4 points 2<sup>nd</sup> 2 points 3<sup>rd</sup> 1 point HC ½ point.
  - In Section IX, Novelty Classes 215-220, 4 points will be awarded to each of the winners. No other points will be awarded in these classes.
- 13 The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 14 The Committee cannot be responsible for Exhibits or personal property.
- All prize money will be paid out **after 2.30 pm**. All prize money must be checked before leaving the Treasurer's Tent and money not collected on show day will be assumed to be a donation to the Society.
- Exhibits in Section I and Homecraft may be cut at the Judges' discretion. Cake covers (9cmx30cm) are provided. Please unwrap your exhibit

- and use the covers provided. Leave the covers when collecting.
- Exhibitors may provide their own plates and vases, although vases are available. A "vase" has a greater height than the width of its mouth. A "bowl" has a width measurement at least equal to, but usually greater than, its height.
- 18 Spring sown Onions shall be shown "as pulled" with roots well washed.
- 19 In all horticultural classes, varieties should be named, if known.
- Novice Classes are restricted to entrants who have never won a first prize for that class in any of the Shows held by this Society.
- All trophies must be returned, cleaned, to Anne Hughes, The Poplars, Hambledon Road (opposite Lincoln Green Nurseries), Denmead, **in July.**
- 22 All litter must be put in the containers provided.

### ADDITIONAL RULES FOR BEEKEEPERS CLASSES (Classes 225 – 238)

- Honey and Wax must be the produce of the exhibitors own bees.
- Exhibitors must label every entry with labels supplied by the show manager which must not be altered or marked.
- 25 Beeswax may be exhibited polished or unpolished at the entrants discretion.
- Frames must be enclosed in a case visible from both sides and removable by the judge.
- Extracted honey must be exhibited in matching clear unlabelled one pound 454g squat jars, with standard gold lacquered commercial screw tops or twist offs.
- Honey colour. British Standards Institute (Number 1656) grading filters (glasses) will be used. Grading filters are available from the show manager on show day. (Grading glasses should be viewed against a standard 1lb honey jar with a matt white background, not against a direct light source).
- 29 Mead must be shown in clear glass wine bottles of approx 750ml capacity. No alcohol may be added.
- 30 Exhibitors should provide a candle stick for one of each pair of candles entered.

### Ingredients:

6 oz plain flour

Pinch of salt

4 oz butter

1 egg yolk, beaten

Half a cup sour cream

For the Filling

Honey

Caster sugar

Chopped walnuts

### Method:

Sift together the flour and the salt and rub in the butter. Add the well-beaten egg yolk and the sour cream, and mix.

Leave the pastry in a cold place for about 1 hour. Roll out the pastry, cut into rings and line well-greased tart or patty tins with it. Fill each one with 1 teaspoon each of honey, caster sugar and chopped walnuts.

Bake in a hot oven, 400F (200C) Gas 6, for about 15 minutes, until the pastry edges are golden brown.

### SET RECIPE FOR CLASS 151 - Orange polenta cake

Ingredients: 250g unsalted butter For the Orange glaze

250g golden caster sugar 100ml orange juice

4 large eggs 100g golden caster sugar

140g polenta

200g plain flour

2 tsp baking powder

Zest and juice 2 oranges (less 100ml juice for the glaze)

**Method**: Preheat oven to 160c/140c fan/gas 3. Line the base and sides of a round 23cm cake tin with baking parchment. Cream the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Add the eggs one at a time and mix thoroughly. Once the mixture is combined, add all the dry ingredients and the zest and juice after you have measured off 100ml for the glaze.

Transfer the mixture to the tin, spread evenly, then cook for about 45 mins or until a skewer inserted in the centre comes out clean. Remove from the oven and turn out onto a wire rack to cool.

To make the glaze, put the juice and sugar in a medium saucepan and bring to the boil. Let it simmer for 5 mins, then remove from the heat and allow to cool. Drizzle the orange glaze over the top of the cooled cake.
