Platinum Jubilee



A joint group from the Hall Committee, the church and the Parish Council are organising three events – lighting a beacon at 9.45pm on Thursday 2^{nd} June, and on Sunday 5^{th} June a short service in the church at 2pm and a Jubilee Tea in the village hall at 3.00pm.

Beacon: The current outline plan is for a bonfire beacon in Adrian and Jackie Mitchell's field on the east side of the

road at Herdicott Cross. We're looking at providing a hot snack (probably barbecued sausage in a roll) and a bar. Contributions of bring and share desserts will be invited.

Church Service: A short service of thanks for the life of the Queen will be held in the church at 2pm on Sunday 5th June and will end in time for the start of the Jubilee Tea.



Jubilee Tea: A bring and share tea will start at 3.00pm on Sunday 5th June. Contributions of savoury snacks and cake are invited, ideally in finger form (because it will be served to tables rather than buffet-style). Sandwiches will be made at the hall by the catering volunteers and we're not planning to offer desserts. It is hoped some form of entertainment can be arranged.

Planning Applications - Paul Grafton

There are three applications under consideration by Torridge which affect the centre of the village as well as several others relating to farms in the parish. The three village centre ones are:

- Land Opposite Clawton Primary School Clawton Devon (Ref. No: 1/1346/2021/FUL): This includes some low-cost units for rent and purchase. Some parking space is offered for community use and there is some debate as to whether they are needed given that the application to demolish the garages at the entrance to Claw Park and replace them with parking for the school has been approved. Also, the spaces if used by the school would mean crossing the main road. The Parish Council did not object to the development in principle but made some comments as can be seen in the minutes (a link on the Clawton website https://www.clawton.org.uk and on the noticeboard by the bus shelter) and on the Torridge planning website where all details of the proposal and all comments and objections can be found. If you have a comment or objection you can add it via that website.
- Land To The Rear Of Riverside Cottage Clawton Devon (1/0632/2015/FUL): The builder who purchased the land has now purchased the rest of the field and is looking to change the original planning approval (5 houses) to bungalows. The Parish Council is held a special meeting on 21st April to discuss this and agreed to support the change to bungalows in principle. It was also agreed that the developer would be encouraged to include a variety of sizes to cater for those who wouldn't need a 4-bedroom bungalow.
- **Mazoe Clawton Holsworthy Devon EX22 6QJ (Ref. No: 1/0326/2022/FUL):** This is the cottage opposite the Claw Park garages, next to Moor Park Barn. The (part retrospective) planning application is for the front fence to be reduced to I metre. The fence between the 2 cottages to stay at 2 metres and the large storage pod(shed) nest to the house. It appears to be of a half round construction with doors or windows in each end, made of timber and on the plans in front of the building line. The Parish Council had no objection.

Clawton Parish Hall - Maralyn Bailey

Now the brewery is open again on Saturday afternoons our meetings in the hall have come to an end, but it is intended to restart the afternoons once Dave shuts for the winter. We have raised more funds for the hall by doing this. Thanks to Ken for organising the beer, and to anyone who helped to make these afternoons so successful, maintaining the companionship we all have enjoyed since lockdown restrictions.


Jubilee update:

Lastly we hope (suppliers are in control) that new chairs will be in the hall for all to use, no more racing to get the most comfortable seats!!

On a different note: does everyone know about the Ring & Ride service which operates in all



surrounding areas of Holsworthy, reaching out to Morwenstow, Torrington, St Giles, Broadwoodwidger, and Shebbear and Sheepwash.

The days out are varied, shopping trips to local supermarkets and places of interest, for May some of the locations covered are Totnes, Tavistock, Padstow, Topsham, Ottery St. Mary, & Barnstaple.

Holsworthy Walk and Talk from Gill Aston

Last month we walked my favourite route at Buckland Filleigh. Of the 48 routes we have around the area this walk has it all. It is one of the more adventurous Level 3 walks with lots of undulations taking us through the parkland of Buckland House, forestry and farm tracks, over stiles and through fields which, this time, were full of playful baby lambs under the vigilant gaze of their mothers. The views across the valleys towards Dartmoor are spectacular.

Our AGM has taken place which resulted in the retirement of our



Chairperson, Gordon Bennett. Gordon wasn't a founding member of the Group when David Arney started it back in 2000/01, but he joined soon after following a referral from the Cardiac Rehab Group having had surgery, as a way of improving his health and getting more exercise. He has stayed with the Group, eventually moving up to become a walk leader and then, when David formally constituted the group in 2015, Gordon took on the Chairperson's position, which he has held until now. We are pleased to welcome Jaquie Shapland as our new Chair who will be a very valuable member of the Committee.

We often refer to research showing the benefits of walking in the management of various chronic health conditions such as heart disease, but Gordon's story brings those benefits to a personal level. Gordon has been an active member of the Group for almost 20 years and continues to be a very valuable member of the Monday Walk in the Park team. He has made friends and helped many others along the way.

Free wellbeing support offered to help with Devon's COVID-19 recovery

Monthly Walks from Evelyn Sharman

On Monday 11th April, fourteen of us met in the car park behind Pyworthy Village Hall.

A serious consideration when organising these walks is whether there is suitable parking for everybody. We are so fortunate in Devon to have our lovely Village Halls with their facilities. I am pleased to read in our Parish magazines that the usual activities are getting going again. I was interested to see that several residents from Pyworthy, both current & previous, joined us. I was delighted to have their company. My goodness, they had such a wealth of local knowledge between them & we learned such a lot about Pyworthy as it is today & how it used to be. It would be very easy to stroll through the village not realising that Pyworthy used to have a School & Post Office as they have been converted into housing. It would be easy to stroll past the entrance to The John Sanders Park without realising that there is a gem behind the gates that is beautifully managed by volunteers. Gill led us through the village, pointing out these features & then along the lane past Hoppatown. Further down the lane, one of the group pointed out an entrance gate on the right hand side that I had never noticed previously. It used to provide access to the Rectory Barn which stands in the grounds of the Old Rectory. There hasn't always been a Village Hall in Pyworthy & so Rectory Barn used to be used for village functions. We listened to snippets about Reverend Edward Andrew Donaldson who used to reside there from 1904 until his death in 1935. Apparently, he had a private income & did a huge amount of good in the locality, not just in Pyworthy. He had cottages built on a piece of land that he owned in the village for his Chauffeur & Head Gardener. He also had fish ponds constructed within the grounds & there is still evidence of them. It must be a challenge keeping them maintained given their position within the woodland. He also planted an avenue of beech trees. They will look amazing in the coming days as their young leaves start to unfurl. If you are interested in following this up, there is a book called Pyworthy - A Devon Village. It includes a collection of notes & photographs from local people complied by Joyce Crutcher. There is a copy available in Holsworthy Library.

My feeling was that we could have stood & soaked up the peace & tranquility for much longer but we knew that Gill had more to show us so we followed her along the track towards Crinacott Farm. We joined the footpath on the left that took us between the solar panels. It was a bit uneven underfoot so be careful if you venture down there especially when the ground dries up as it could cause an ankle to twist. I know the panels serve a purpose but I was pleased to get past them as their buzzing masked the bird song. We crossed the wooden footbridge & walked up hill across the most beautiful lush green fields which brought us



out at Yeomadon. We turned left & followed the lane which joins the North Tamerton road. It was only a little way before we turned left again at Brook's Cross & followed this lane back towards the village. Gill pointed out the beautiful Church of St. Swithun. Reverend Donaldson was Rector here & I would have liked to have had a peek inside having heard so much about him. I will have to return another day. We had already walked for two & a half hours & covered approx. 3.9 miles. The time had flown!!

Our next walk will be on Monday 9th May. We will set off from Milton Damerel Parish Hall at 10am. Everyone is most welcome. Contact me if you would like more information.
