A Defibrillator paid for by donations from the family of the late Alice Sewell will be installed outside the lower Hall of the Village Centre before the end of September. If you wish to attend training on the use of the Defibrillator please contact Rachel, the Clerk at clerk@farnsfield-pc.uk. The training sessions will be 2 hours long and will be delivered at the Village Centre by Peter Tether.

The Allotments are up and running. 23 have been allocated and there is a waiting list! The community garden has been identified and Cllr. Healy holds the development of this close to her heart.

Parking signs directing traffic to park at the car park off Hadleigh Park near Parfitt Drive are in the process of being sited along Main Street. It is hoped that this will help to reduce congestion caused by cars parked on the road.

Following the launch of the Council's Strategic Plan work is afoot progressing the numerous projects. ***The feasibility study into relocating the Village Centre*** is underway and a consultation meeting with residents is to be held on Tuesday 27th September at 7.30pm in the lower Hall of the Village Centre.

The working party looking at developing a 'young person's facility' in the village has had its first meeting and will be seeking opinions from villagers, young and not so, in the near future.

Farnsfield

Domestic:

Some very well maintained properties and gardens and tidy verges but some weeds in gutters. There were some very colourful and tidy gardens.

Community facilities:

St Michael & All Angels Church had a very welcoming appearance and was really lovely. The path leading to the church door had attractive borders of perennial flowers. The war memorial area was extremely well-maintained. The churchyard as a whole was easy to walk around and showed considerable effort had gone into maintaining it to the highest of standards. Other public areas were found to be tidy and with little litter.

The school and its playing fields looked free of litter. The footpath close by was also free of litter.

The children's play area near Parfitt Drive was in excellent condition and had no evidence of litter or graffiti.

Farnsfield hosts premier rural event!



Southwell Ploughing Match will be returning to Farnsfield on the 24th of September, after last being here in 2010.

For anyone who has never been to this event it provides a fantastic day out for all ages. You can immerse yourself in rural life, with everything from Horses Ploughing to Local Food, Crafts and

Quality Shopping. All day there are fascinating agricultural demonstrations, dogs, ponies, baking classes and children's activities guarantee a thrilling and memorable experience.

Since 2010, it has grown to become the premier agricultural show in Nottinghamshire. The Ploughing Match now attracts around 10,000 visitors and will be held on land South of Farnsfield, jointly on Carr Banks Farm and Combs Farm.

The show was established in 1855 and was primarily a competition for ploughmen, it has now grown into a much more diverse event. Still an important part of the show, there are classes for horse, vintage and modern tractor ploughing.

The event also hosts a horse show with over 800 entries, classes include Ridden Hunters, Show Jumping and Shire Horses to name but a few.

There are also classes for Cattle, Sheep, Dogs, Roots, Horticultural, Domestic Produce and the traditional craft of Hedge Laying.



Entries for the Dog show can be made on the day, this event has become extremely popular with pedigree and non-pedigree dogs in the last few years.

There will be demonstrations of Steam Ploughing, Threshing and new for this year, a Harvesting demonstration with Vintage Combine Harvesters, Tractors and Balers.

The ever popular rural crafts and 160 trade stands offer something for everyone. A wide variety of local food is available at the Farmers Market and food court. Free trailer rides with drop off points around the show site make it easy to get around, enabling all visitors, young and old to see the wonderful variety of activities.

The main ring attractions will include The IMPS Motorcycle display team, who appeared at the Edinburgh Tattoo this year, The Tough Farmer Challenge, along with Cattle and Vintage Tractor Parades. Throughout the day Horse classes will be staged in the main ring, ending with the exciting, and very competitive Pony Club games.

The shows continuing success is its commitment to its rural roots, and also the dedicated team of volunteers. Many thanks and much gratitude must go to this army of enthusiasts who work behind the scenes.
