Harby Parish Council Update

I do hope that everyone had a safe and happy Christmas and New Year!

At this time of the year the Parish Council has already started planning for the financial year and the precept request has been submitted to Newark and Sherwood Council and will be included in your Council Tax bill in the very near future. The Council have been careful to ensure that the precept has not been increased too much, whilst trying to maintain the services it provides and also properly maintain the assets for which it is responsible. Historically the Parish Council has relied on its reserves to provide services, but as these reserves have dwindled in recent years the Parish Council has been forced to increase the precept to ensure that it could continue to operate. It is hoped that this year will see the first of many when reserves are no longer required for the Council to carry out its functions and legal obligations on your behalf.

There still remains one vacancy for anyone who may be interested in being part of the Parish Council and helping to improve the lives of the residents of Harby? Why not come along to the next Parish Council meeting and see if you would like to offer a very small amount of your time to your community?

What 3 Words

I do hope that you have heard of this free app, but if you haven't you might find this of interest. Sometimes we all know we have a postcode or an address that we just can't find, this could be the solution to the problem! The world has been divided into 3 x 3 metre squares each with a unique 3 word reference so you can direct people to your exact location.

For example the front door of the village hall is ///muscular.gums.budgeted, whilst the committee room door is ///corn.signed.applied and the entrance to the car park is ///likes.prowling.submerged. Never before have we been able to direct people so easily to which door they should be using or how to get into the car park! Take a look at the website <u>https://what3words.com/</u> or download the app W3W.co/iOS or W3W.co/Android.

The emergency services will accept this as a way of giving them a very accurate location, which is crucial in an emergency so that they can find you quickly and easily.

ALL SAINTS' CHURCH, HARBY WITH SWINETHORPE – 2019-2020 – Bridget Wells

There is a regular, small congregation at the monthly services with numbers swelling for Harvest Thanksgiving (followed by lunch in the Village Hall), Remembrance and the Carol service (followed by mulled wine and refreshments). In March the P.C.C. sponsored the children in Years 5 and 6 to have a day of activities at Southwell Minster, and we welcome the school to church for their Harvest and Christmas services. Unfortunately the church heating broke down just as the children were starting their Christmas rehearsals, but thanks to Philip Thomas and Michael Hilton, it was repaired for the Wednesday evening, after the delay with wrong parts being delivered.

It is now 12+ years since 11 local cyclists raised £11,000 for the church roof appeal, cycling on the route of the Queen Eleanor cross sites from Westminster Abbey to Harby and the link that was made then with St. Martin-in-the-Fields continues today. At the start of the August Bank Holiday their cyclists are met at Newark station and brought to Harby for brunch at the Village Hall and then are given a blessing in church before cycling to Lincoln Cathedral and eventually Westminster Abbey, raising money for charities.

You will perhaps have noticed that the church clock has stopped at 12 o'clock and it is about to be repaired at a considerable cost.

Thank you to Rev. Mandy and also to everyone who helps with the church and church-yard in any way.

ST HELEN'S CHURCH, THORNEY – UPDATE – Anna Dennison

This project is progressing well.

In November 2019 a village focus group meeting was held to update people, to answer their questions / queries & to share ideas & offers of help/support.

The meeting was very well attended & very positive.

The architect began by updating everyone re the plans & progress so far. He took questions & listened to ideas. Members of the Parish Council, the Parochial Church Council & the Thorney Community Led Plan group were present. Contributions from District Councillor Linda Dales, who has experience of delivering a similar project in South Scarle, were extremely positive & supportive,

Everyone present agreed that the project is deliverable & an exciting prospect. There were ideas for events & fund raising & an offer was made to head up a management committee to move the project on more quickly & to form a structure for running it once it is achieved.

Last year's survey re ideas for USE of the facility was also very encouraging with plenty of viable ideas for clubs, classes & events. Watch this space! Get ready to support the project in any way you can & look forward to using & enjoying a large, warm, equipped community space with a full range of activities!

Harby History Group – Louise Herrick 703662-harbyhistory@outlook.com

In November, guest speaker, Dave Crofts came to tell us about how he came to write a book that included John, Lord of Harby. Dave lives in the village of Weston and has made many archaeological finds, some dating back to the 13th century. He started researching and found out over the next 15 years about a rum sounding man called Richard de Weston, who seemed to get in trouble and had amassed debts. He married into money when he met Agnes and moved to her family home which was the Manor House in Harby. They had many sons, one of which was John who Dave decided to make into a hero in his novel about the Knights Templar. Agnes was a formidable woman in her own right and after being widowed fought to reclaim much of her lost land. Richard de Weston is best known to us as the homeowner of Harby manor House when Edward I stayed there, and his wife Queen Eleanor passed away. Edward subsequently had Eleanor Crosses erected at all places they rested overnight on the return of Eleanor's body to London.

Dave brought with him some of his historical finds, including a 14th century horseshoe, pottery, hide pegs used in the tanning process and even a bangle with a tiny engraving of a lion on it. All these items have been verified and are being moved to Derby University archives next month. We saw a short slide show with some of his other finds. Dave has offered to send information on his findings about the de Weston family to us to keep in our archives. We then had the opportunity to purchase signed copies of his book, "Templar Retribution".

Thorney, Harby & Wigsley Voluntary Car Scheme				



The Car Scheme has had another busy year. We have 82 people registered as users in the six villages we cover (Thorney, Harby, Wigsley, N & S Clifton and Spalford). We also have 15 volunteer drivers, mainly from Thorney and Harby who have been kind enough to cover most of the transport requests I have received. Sadly we have lost the services of two of our drivers this year as they have both moved out of the area. In addition a couple of drivers have been unable to drive for a significant period of time due to illness or injury. This makes the recruitment of drivers even more crucial if we are to continue to offer the level of service we are providing at the moment. In addition we only have a very small number of drivers willing to do late night pick ups eg.11pm to midnight and this is understandable given the age profile of some of our drivers. Bookings for night trips has become increasingly popular with people using us to allow them to go into Lincoln or Newark to socialise at night with family and friends. We really need a few slightly younger drivers, who perhaps work full time to step up to the mark and be willing to drive for us on a very occasional basis in the evenings. If this doesn't happen it is likely the demand for late night pick ups will not be able to be met in future. We will be offering free refreshments and a finger buffet after the meeting (which will not take long) to give people a chance to socialise together and meet our volunteer drivers. I hope to see lots of you there.


