

# From the Vicar

Dear friends,

I hope that you are well and enjoying the signs of spring. The daffodils have been lovely this year, and I love the longer days when the clocks change. Easter is approaching – probably the most joyful and hope-filled season of the church year and, for Christians, as significant as Christmas – if not more so.

During the Easter season, Christians celebrate Jesus's resurrection from the dead – his bursting from the tomb, and his victory over sin and death. Jesus's resurrection brings us a real and living hope that death will not be the end for us, either – that we, too, will rise to eternal life, and take our place in our Father's house, where God will wipe away every tear from our eye. We don't know exactly what heaven will be like, but many of us hope to be reunited with our loved ones there – with family, friends and, perhaps our pets, too. And so, for Christians, Easter is a season of joy, hope and celebration.

Before our Easter celebrations, we observe a season of preparation and – for some – a period of fasting and self-denial, with an increased emphasis on repentance (turning back to God), prayer and spirituality. As we attempt to draw closer to God during Lent, through prayer, Bible study and self-denial, many Christians find it helpful to go on a pilgrimage, or retreat. If that isn't possible, many find that taking a Quiet Day – away from work and other commitments – helps us to reconnect with God, and to prepare for Holy Week and Easter.

This year, I had the privilege of leading a small group on a Quiet Day at the Community of St Mary the Virgin, in Wantage. The Convent is a beautiful place, with a newly renovated Retreat Wing and Conference Centre, in addition to two chapels, the Sisters' rooms, and gardens. It offers a peaceful oasis; less than 10 minutes' walk from the shops in Wantage town centre. Quiet Days


can be beneficial for those of any religion, or none. Although we joined the Sisters for worship, and ended our Quiet Day with a Eucharist, attendance at both was optional and all participants were welcome to opt in or out of worship, short talks and a guided meditation. During the Quiet Day, participants enjoyed space to slow down and withdraw, temporarily, from the busyness of daily life. Some made use of the art room and resources there. Others read books, did some sewing, colouring-in, journaling, and enjoyed a stroll in the grounds and gardens. We were also well fed, with a two-course lunch and delicious cake. I would encourage anyone who has a busy life, and too many commitments, to consider taking an occasional or regular Quiet Day, to seek peace, to rest, to reconnect with God, and/or to reflect upon your life.

It will soon be Holy Week – the week leading up to Easter, in which Christians remember Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday; his last supper with his friends on Maundy Thursday; his arrest later that night; his crucifixion and death on Good Friday; the emptiness and grief of Holy Saturday; and Jesus's joyful resurrection on Easter Day. We will be holding a number of services in All Saints' Church, and around the Benefice, which all are welcome to attend. I always feel that the joy of Easter Day is much more powerful if we have first journeyed with Jesus the challenging way of the cross, and sat with Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane on Maundy Thursday, before gathering again at the foot of the cross on Good Friday, then experiencing the emptiness of Holy Saturday, before the lighting of the Easter fire leads us from death to new life.

My hope and prayer is that, this Holy Week and Easter, you will know the peace of God, which passes all understanding; the unconditional and abundant love of God; and the hopefulness and joy of Easter.

# Parish Council

The Bat and Ball is now closed, hopefully only temporarily, and the Parish Council is investigating having it listed as an Asset of Community Value (ACV). If the pub was an ACV then the community would have the opportunity to bid for it if it was put up for sale on the open market. We could then make sure that it was kept for everyone to enjoy as a pub, rather than being redeveloped for a different use like houses or flats.

The application process to become an ACV includes giving examples of how the pub furthers the social wellbeing of the community, a description of the impact of its loss, plans for its future management, and evidence of support for the proposal from the community. There will, of course, also need to be consideration of how the purchase might be funded.

It will take a while to make the application and the Parish Council is keen to hear from anyone who would be prepared to assist with this project.

Landscaping of the open areas at the Dove House development had been delayed because the Planning Department at the District Council had not agreed what should be done. Agreement has now been reached and the landscaping is going ahead. The Parish Council is disappointed that the District Council paid little attention to our views about the landscaping. Nevertheless, hopefully the general appearance of the area will improve dramatically, particularly the parts near the road.

The slopes of both ends of the path behind the wall at the development have been made more shallow, because there had been complaints that they were too steep which made the path dangerous, particularly in icy weather.

The planning application at 1 Dove House Lane (P23/S0094/HH) has been modified and no longer includes the garage, only the pergola.

## **John Howell MP writes...March 2023**

In order to meet the copy deadlines for many of the parish magazines published in communities across the constituency I have to write in the first part of the month. This month my deadline comes ahead of the Spring Budget which I know many await, hoping that some of the Government support towards the cost of living will continue. Much is widely heralded, and I have no advanced insights beyond those already published in the media. However I am optimistic that the energy support will be extended to get us through the rest of the colder months this year.

Most people will have received the energy support automatically through their energy provider. However there are a number of households not on mainstream supply or who have other specific arrangements, such as Park Homes. In February the alternative scheme to ensure that support is available to such households

went live for everyone and applications for support to the Alternative Energy Support Scheme. can be made online.

With the coming of Spring we are perhaps a little more aware of the countryside around us and in recent weeks I have had a number of people contact me to comment on the litter that we see on verges and in other public places. I agree that this is an eyesore and we need to keep drawing attention to the need for people to take their rubbish home or use the bins provided. In recognition of the problem the Government published its National Litter Strategy in 2017 which set out a number of ways to tackle the problem. This has been regularly reviewed and initiatives such as The Great British Beach Clean and the Great British Spring Clean have been well support by volunteers across the country. This year the Great British Spring Clean will take place between Friday 17th March and Sunday 2nd April. Our District Councils take the lead on this and will publish full details on their respective websites.

Thankfully most of our children progress through mainstream education with little problem. However there are some children who have special educational needs and I know that accessing this is not always easy. The delays can cause considerable stress for children and their families and the time lost can be critical. This is not just a local problem, and the Department for Education has been looking to see what changes need to be made to improve the system. Following consultation the Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) and Alternative Provision (AP) Improvement Plan has just been published with the aim of ensuring that the right support is given at the right time and in the right place. It is backed with substantial funding and oversight of reform will be provided through a new national special educational needs and disabilities and alternative provision implementation board, chaired by senior ministers.

# LOCAL ELECTIONS 2023

It's time to choose who  
represents you

**On Thursday 4 May 2023, everyone aged 18 or over who is eligible will have the chance to vote in the district council election.**

By voting in this election, you will help to choose local councillors to make decisions on important issues, such as where we should focus our efforts locally to help tackle climate change, where and how new housing gets built, how we work to ensure there's enough affordable housing and much more.

Residents in some areas will also be able to vote in parish council elections.

**New for 2023 – to vote at a polling station in this election you must bring photo ID!**

At this election, you will need to bring photo ID with you to be able to vote at a polling station. A wide range of photo ID will be accepted, including passports, driving licences, a disabled parking blue badge and proof of age PASS ID cards.

If you don't have an accepted form of photo ID, you can **APPLY NOW** for a free voter ID document known as a Voter Authority Certificate.

The deadline to apply for this election is 5pm on Tuesday 25 April.

### Vote by post

Several weeks before election day we'll send all registered voters a polling card confirming where you need to go to cast your vote on Thursday 4 May. You will also be able to find this information on our website.

On election day you will be able to vote anytime between 7am and 10pm – **just don't forget to bring your ID with you!**

### Get someone to vote on your behalf

Apply to allow someone you trust to vote on your behalf – this is known as a proxy vote. If you wish to apply for a proxy vote you must do so by 5pm on Tuesday 25 April.


