So, another year begins with the village precept being sent to South Somerset District Council. Over the past 6 years, the Parish Council has made some major investments in the village. Whilst some of the costs have been supplemented by grants obtained from a range of sources, a sizeable proportion of the required funds has had to be provisioned from the Parish Council reserve funds.

Whilst further grants can be sought to assist in completing both present and future planned projects, the reality is that the Parish Council is asking for the village precept to be increased. So, as an example, for those households in a Band D tax bracket, this would mean an increase of approximately 4.5 pence per day. The concern for the Parish Council is that some of the major projects are: incomplete, cost more than was previously budgeted, and have the potential to cost more to reach completion. The council is looking at ways in which to control this further cost to the parish, including accessing grants for support.

There are several projects on the horizon this year for the community:

- The refurbishment of the Skate Park on the big Recreation Ground. The Sports and Recreation Trust has already done a fantastic job in getting a good percentage of the funds for this venture, but the Parish Council believe that as a community we should help and support this project financially.
- The completion of remedial refurbishment work to the Hamdon Youth and Family Centre.
- The start of the speed watch scheme (we apologise for the delay in getting started).

The development of the Local Community
 Networks, of which there will be 18 across the
 whole of Somerset. This is due to begin in April as
 Somerset merges into one unitary authority. As I am
 writing this input, the Parish Council do not exactly

know where they will sit in these Networks, or the precise cost implications.

On a more local front, the Council would like to ask you to get out with your cameras and photograph any potholes in our parish's roads so that the Parish Clerk can quickly report them. What we need is for the residents to provide an exact street location and also an approximate measurement, so you could simply put your foot next to the hole whilst you are taking the picture to provide some comparative dimension.



As some of you may be aware our village bus service has been reduced to a two-hourly service for various reasons. The pandemic has caused fewer people to use the service, those who can have bus passes are not applying for them (renumeration for each pass is given to the bus services), and there is a lack of bus drivers. In an effort to encourage the use of the bus service prices are capped at £2 for a one-way journey till March 2023.
