Thank you once again to our fantastic Neighbourcare team for bringing invaluable information to us all in these constantly changing times.

We began the season of **Advent** on Sunday, a reflective time of preparation for Christmas. At our online services we enjoyed another new backdrop, purple for Advent, made by Mary Herbert and Sue Hopkinson. The design picks up on the theme of '**Comfort and Joy**', which the Church of England is using this Advent and Christmas.

Public worship in our church buildings resumes on Sunday, according to the regulations we had become used to (hand hygiene, face coverings being mandatory, social distancing, no communal singing etc) and we are returning to a mix of 'in church' and online services. This Sunday 6th December, we are in St Martin's, East Woodhay at 11am for Parish Communion.

Christmas Services and how to request attendance

May I remind you that 'in church' Christmas services will be different from previous Christmases and restrictions reduce the capacity of our buildings. Therefore, it is important to 'request a seat' for any service you wish to attend on 20th December or Christmas Eve/Day. **You can enter your request using our online form** HERE. Please also register via the form to receive news of family activities or to ask for the zoom code for the online Carol Service on 23rd December.

The **Scarecrow Nativity in Highclere** begins with Mary and Joseph (and the donkey!) journeying around the parish to 'Bethlehem'. See them on the corner of Rutherford Close (4th-6th December), corner of Tubbs Lane/Andover Road (6th-8th), corner of Tubbs Lane/Star Lane (8th-10th), Highclere Village Hall (10th-11th), Brook House, Church Lane (11th-13th), 28 Penwood Heights (13th-15th), (15th-17th location to be confirmed), Woodland Stores (17th-19th).... Then arriving outside the church, joined by other characters from the Nativity, in time for worship on Sunday 20th December.

There is also a **Bethlehem Stable** on the green in the centre of Ashmansworth, keep an eye on it because it will get more and more Christmassy over the coming weeks...
