## Footpath Success

Beginning with the success we had in working with our City and County councillors and officers to make the previous virtual footpath at Bedford Lane/London Road into a real one. Work has started and should take three weeks or so. On the flooding front, work is scheduled to alleviate standing water flooding on Springvale Road/Down Farm Lane. You will also recall that the new bus shelter on London Road was commissioned and it is proving a hit with travellers into the City. Much of the day to day maintenance in the village is now carried out by our Lengthsman - Craig. He is a hard worker and gets through quite a bit of work clearing gullies, sweeping leaves, cutting back hedges, cleaning the shelter and many other tasks. If you can identify work that would enhance the village do let us know.



## Down Farm Bridge

The replacement of the Down Farm Lane railway bridge was a real challenge. The Victorian edifice was to be demolished and replaced with a pre-cast concrete standard design box. We thought it would spoil an entrance to the village and increase traffic speed and density as well as vehicle size. Network Rail were very intransigent and high handed, but again after a tense dialogue with the land owner, and the local councillors, and residents they modified the

design and will clad the exterior with a brick facade to replicate the original.

Not all of our wish lists were completed, or completed to the extent we wanted, and we are very aware of the potential shortcomings of not having many levers to pull to make everything work. By some persistence and doggedness, and by working with our city and county councillors, and residents, we have been able to achieve quite a bit.

What are we hoping to achieve this year? The bridge will give us work to do in reducing traffic speed and density still further along this stretch

of road. We have a war memorial that needs cleaning and caring for, and this will be a financial challenge to the Parish, and perhaps there is some fund raising to be done. If you are interested in lending a hand, again let us know.

We are also planning to have a village design statement which seeks to find out what sort of village you want, what amenities we are lacking or need, what a development policy might look like, how we can integrate with Barton Farm but not at the expense of what you consider the essence of the village. We need your help in this and a sub group of residents working on behalf of and with the PC might be the answer; there will be questionnaires to air, paperwork to un-muddle, visions to be encapsulated, frustrations to be frustrated with all with the idea of

giving the village a framework which will guide us, and on which we can all work together for the village. Interested?

## Parish Councillors with lethal set of skills!

We have Tom and Claire W who both have young children approaching, and of, school age, and you will probably know that Claire is a local School Governor.
