MANSTON AIRPORT - A FURTHER UPDATE

It seems that another bidder has entered the arena for the airport (I say airport because that is what it still is). It has been stated that a US logistics company has approached TDC with an interest in reviving a compulsory purchase order, CPO, so that they can move from a base in Europe with their clients' 12 aircraft to a more convenient base in the UK, and Manston is their choice. We will wait and see!

RiverOak are still the main story in this ongoing saga. Many pundits have said this is not the original RiverOak Investment Partners who started the DCO process but a new company called RiverOak Strategic Partners, RSP, which is a registered UK business. This new business was set up not to isolate itself from the US partner, but to simplify any negotiations carried out in the UK as a UK company. So far RSP are the serious contenders, proved by their steadfast commitment to the project.

Regardless of the few complaints from people in Thanet about reinstating the airport the fact is that the UK needs more air cargo facility, and Manston is there, ready and waiting. Because of lack of cargo facility at passenger based airports a lot of cargo has to be carried in the belly of passenger aircraft. This is very expensive for importers and is also very limiting because not all cargo is allowed to be carried on passenger aircraft. It has been said that if dedicated cargo airports are not available in the next fifteen or so years, the UK will be losing hundreds of billions of pounds worth of business (especially with the exit from the EU) and it does not seem that any new runways will be available at Gatwick or Heathrow in the near or even distant future. This is where Manston may prove invaluable.

A contentious subject is the noise factor of aircraft. A lot of people are living in the past with regard to modern aircraft. Noise level restrictions have been set at all of the world's airports and the latest aircraft are so much quieter. You may remember that when Manston was still in use it was used for pilot training for two of the largest jets flying today, the Airbus A380 and the Boeing 777. As part of the training schedule the aircraft were performing 'touch and go' manoeuvres. This meant approaching to land and at the last minute applying full power to lift off again and this was repeated time and time again. The aircraft were so quiet that, as far as I know, there were no complaints about noise.

Anyway this is just my view on the subject but bare in mind that CITY AIRPORT in London is now stacking its aircraft above Thanet due to the fact it is uncontrolled airspace, and this is producing a continuous drone above the Isle.
