Our Friend Nigel

This month we fondly remember Nigel Eagle, who passed away earlier this year. Nigel is deeply missed by all of us who knew him. This was shown by the huge turnout for his funeral at St. Michael's church and afterwards at the Harcourt Arms.

Nigel loved his family and friends and was very much part of the fabric of the village having lived and worked in Stanton Harcourt and Sutton all his life. He gave so much to our community as a Parish Councillor, Tower Captain of the bell ringers, "Boss" of the Festival 'tug-o'-war, supporting the church and pretty much every event happening in the village, he was a local legend.

Everyone knew Nigel and he was always there as a friend to us all, welcoming new people and talking to old friends on his walks with Isla, his dog. He was always there to help with kind words of support along with bucketfuls of sage advice on his many passions, gardening, fishing, bell ringing, and village history to name a few.

Nigel restored bell ringing to the village almost 40 years ago and has been tower captain since, his legacy is an active team of bell ringers. Many of us think of Nigel as the bells ring on Wednesday evenings and before church services on a Sunday. One of Nigel's last missions was to facilitate repair of the church clock chime, leaving us with a restored chime, but he was thinking bigger to restore the church bells to keep them ringing into the next century what more fitting tribute would that be.

In a world where people end up busy and separated, Nigel brought us together and reminded us of what a village should be. No-one ever drank alone on a Saturday night, and a glass is still raised to him routinely by his friends each week over a pint of ale. To our dear friend Nigel, may he rest in peace.

WODC have issued the consultation report for local plan

Following the consultation that took place over 6 weeks between August and October last year, WODC have now released the report from this. The consultation was a chance for people to give their opinion on what key issues they would like to be in the local plan. The consultation was a great success, with over 5,000 people visiting the consultation platform, and 441 people and organisations responding. There were also 1,143 contributions and comments made, and just under 3,000 people signed up for news updates.

The public will have further opportunities to contribute through upcoming consultations. The next consultation is scheduled for the summer and will focus on three things: turning the ideas generated from the last consultation into specific aims and objectives; opening up discussions on how and where the District might develop in the future; and gathering suggestions on potential new land uses such as housing, employment, green space and renewable energy. Further details of these sessions will be made available once confirmed.

Shared prosperity fund – market towns asked for improvement ideas

West Oxfordshire District Council has commissioned Heartflood, specialists in place management & development, to identify potential UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF) projects to support West Oxfordshire's Market Towns. As part of this work, Heartflood is conducting a

survey to gather the views of the public, businesses, and other local organisations.

The UK Shared Prosperity Fund is part of the government's Levelling Up Agenda, with funding centred around building communities, supporting local businesses and improving employment and skill building opportunities.

West Oxfordshire District Council has received £1,000,000 from the UKSPF over three years. Revitalising the town centres is one of the Council's key priorities, with potential projects including improved signage and wayfinding, better information for visitors and public realm improvements as well as supporting independent businesses. We are committed to developing these areas to ensure that our market towns continue to be great places to live, work, and visit.

The district has several market towns, including Burford, Chipping Norton, Charlbury, Eynsham, Carterton, Woodstock, and Witney, populated by approximately 114,200 residents.
