Oli for Creld1 Warriors

From the 9th to the 15th December, Oli is taking on a massive challenge!

He will be running SEVEN MARATHONS IN SEVEN DAYS to raise awareness and funds for Creld1 Warriors, a vital organization dedicated to research and support for children affected by Creld1.

Creld1 is a rare genetic disorder that affects the development and function of multiple organ systems. Children with Creld1 often face severe health challenges, including heart defects, immune dysfunction, and neurological issues including severe seizures.

Tragically, many of these children do not survive past early childhood due to complications from this devastating condition.

Earlier this year our beautiful boy, Angus, was diagnosed with Creld1. Since Angus was 6 months old, he has suffered from multiple seizures ranging from fairly mild to very severe and resulting in a coma. Finding out about his diagnosis was extremely tough. We don't know what the future holds for him, but we do know we





will do anything we can to help him, and every little warrior, get the funding they need to kickstart ground-breaking research into this rare condition.

Currently, there is only one medical paper written on Creld1 and no effective medicine. By supporting Oli's marathon journey, you will be directly contributing to fund critical research, raise awareness, and provide support to affected families.

The pain of running all seven marathons will end after a week or so (hopefully!), but the pain of the Creld1 warriors won't end until proper research is done.

We live just at the bottom of Chaddleworth.


OUR AGM ROUND UP

Dear Friends.

It always feels strange writing about Christmas events when Remembrance Sunday has only just passed (certainly as I type!) but it feels like now is the time when we can break the lid on all the amazing things that are planned across the Benefice this December.

The Church of England's theme for Christmas this year builds on the "Follow the Star" motif and reminds us that Christmas is Calm and Bright (the line from the Carol, Silent Night). In the frenetic activity of December, it is a helpful reminder that our churches are places of sanctuary — places of the peace that comes only from the Prince of Peace.

It reminds us also that they are places of Light and Hope. The Downland Volunteer Group (Registered Charity 1112181)

Help is required taking residents to their medical appointments.



You may have heard of the Downland Volunteer Group (DVG) or even used our service. We are a registered charity set up in 1986 to help residents in the Downland Villages attend their medical appointments at surgeries, hospitals, dentists, etc in the surrounding area.

The residents we support are mainly the older members of our community, but we are here for anyone unable to drive or get transport to their appointments. In the period April 2023 to March 2024, we made nearly 1,000 such trips.

We are one of a number of volunteer groups around the country assisting the NHS and the local community especially where public transport is limited

Car Drivers: Could you spare a few hours each month? The demand for driving residents in our area to their medical appointments is increasing as the NHS tries to clear the backlog of appointments.

We need volunteer drivers, using their own cars to take patients to the surgeries, dentists or hospitals in our area. As a volunteer driver you can claim 50p per mile, tax free, whilst transporting a patient.

Office Volunteers: Could you spare two hours a couple of times a month? We need volunteers in our office in the Compton surgery which is open Monday to Friday from 9:30am to 11:30am. If you dealing with telephone happy requests for transport to medical appointments, we would love to hear from you.

Volunteer work is rewarding for both the volunteer and those we help. If you can spare some time and want to help others, do please contact us.

Stay well this winter

The winter months can be difficult for many of us, with the colder weather and shorter daylight hours affecting everything from our finances to our feelings.

The Patient Participation Group recently met at Chieveley Surgery:

Practice Update

Flu clinics have been completed during October, with Covid-19 vaccination also administered and new vaccination Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) also made available to those eligible.

This is a registered GP Training Practice and mentors, supports and supervises qualified doctors who are training to qualify as General Practitioners. Downland has 2 new Registrars who joined in August they are Dr Tim Eden and Dr Chen Xi Gong. Both Drs hold their own

clinics and patients are offered to be booked in with them as they would be with any other GP.

The Practice provide Long-acting reversible contraception (LARC) clinics to patients. Dr Sally Lewis and Nurse Amy Brewer lead on this service and currently the waiting time for an appointment is just 2-3 weeks compared with 6-9 months at the Royal Berks Hospital.

The Practice has been able to reduce the cost to patients of providing Gun Licences by utilising less staff intensive methods to review medical records. The cost will be reduced to £85 from 1st October.

Pharmacy Update

Improvements continue at the Pharmacy. Have recently recruited 2 new Counter Assistants and an additional Dispenser.

The new Superintendent Pharmacist (SIP) Mr Ali Jaffar is able to see and treat, where appropriate, patients conditions identified in the common national Pharmacy First consultation service. These include sore throat. impetigo and sinusitis. This frees up valuable GP appointment time and the day's Duty Doctor will often refer patients onto Mr Jaffar.

The Pharmacy is now providing walk-in Blood Pressure reading service for patients. Ambulatory Blood Pressure monitoring (ABPM) is also available for some identified patients.

The Pharmacy is looking to produce a monthly news update which patients can subscribe to. More details to follow.

- Create a voluntary charitable contribution (via Council Tax payments) scheme

- Cease providing the Adult Respite in the Community (ARC) Service
- Remove Downland Sports Centre from the Leisure Management Contract

- Remove a proportion of the litter bins and dog waste bins from the Grounds Maintenance Contract


