
With Simon the scholar

1. Hello



Use this plan and follow the numbers to see my favourite things. Start at number 1.




My friends and I have lived here in this porch for over 100 years but are much older than that. We came from another building a few miles away.



2. Welcome

Near the door is the FONT

It is made of stone and water is put inside for baptisms.



A baptism is the when people, usually babies, are welcomed into the church family.

During the ceremony we are reminded that God is the **Father** who created everything **Son** who became a man, Jesus and **Holy Spirit** who inspires and helps us


Many things are in 3s to remind us of this.



3. Loud Music

The PIPE ORGAN is played using hands and the feet!

The sound comes out of the pipes, there are more than 500 more behind the ones you can see.



During daytime BATS sleep in the roof opposite the organ.



When it starts to get dark, they fly around inside the church before they go outside






Can you see any tiny bat droppings near here? Don't touch them!!!

When all the pews are full, how many people are sitting in them?


5. Under and over

Over 500 years ago when this priest was alive, the roof of the church was much lower.




Look at the back wall and draw in where the roof used to be.

2. Lily = Mary




 Red cross on white = St George

8. Remembering


Under the big window is a large table called an ALTAR.
