DARENTH PARISH COUNCIL COVID-19 RISK ASSESSMENT

PARISH COUNCIL FACILITIES/SPORTS FIELDS/PLAYGROUND

Facilities are currently closed to users as per the Regulations to prevent persons without a specific purpose and without authority from the Clerk to the Council from entering the premises; as a result, sporting clubs and groups resuming training and other activities must be mindful of this.

The Council is aware that sporting bodies, affiliations and groups are advising their members that they can resume training/activities and have forwarded guidance to their member clubs and groups as to how to carry this out.

Following the outbreak, the Council must ensure the highest standards of health and safety are maintained and that the risk to all those using the sites is minimised/eradicated as far as is reasonably deemed possible as well as adhering to any current government guidance and/or following sporting affiliation guidance on how to train safely. If it is not deemed possible to minimise those risks to an acceptable level then the facilities may remain closed for formal training and sports postponed until such time as social distancing and hygiene requirements can be met safely and robustly.

The playing fields are a public open space; therefore, the council has to be mindful of users of the playing fields as well as the sports teams and clubs resuming activities.

It is not feasible for Darenth Parish Council to provide the following:

- Provision of stewards
- Arrange a booking system
- Clean equipment daily
- Provide cleaning equipment/hand washing facilities

Darenth Parish Council will carry out the following in relation to the re-opening of the Playground equipment -

- Arrange for an early RoSPA inspection of the play and gym equipment and react to any adverse reports arising from those inspections
- Carry out Risk Assessments prior to opening, including COVID-19 risk identification
- Produce any required signage

The Risk Assessment will be shown to all organised groups and clubs utilising the sports facilities/pitches – the Risk Assessment set by the Council is nonnegotiable although the Council welcomes constructive solutions/suggestions at any time. A current copy of the Assessment will be displayed on the Council website. The Council will review the risk assessment of a monthly basis during the COVID-19 crisis and until such a time as there are no restrictions on every day activities – as dictated by the Government guidance.

It should be noted that the Council reserve the right to stop users who do not adhere to Government guidance as it may be amended from time to time. The Council must be satisfied that the risks as highlighted below can be mitigated continuously – if not, then the playing field will be closed for organised sporting activities as will playground equipment (as far as is possible) with immediate effect and possibly until such time as the risk can be mitigated/eradicated. The Council has a duty of care to all users.

The Council's facilities are not permanently manned and so operating is on a trust basis. Failure to comply with the actions/measures within this Risk Assessment may result in the facility being locked-down due to the risk to health and peoples' lives or clubs/persons being denied access.

Risk Levels are graded 1-5 with 5 being 'High Risk' and 1 being 'Low Risk'
