She has collected many friends along the way and loves being part of the village community, and this is why she decided to join the PC a couple of years ago, as she wanted to give something back.

Having lived here a while she feels that she has a good insight into what people want and need. She describes herself as approachable and despite being very busy, wants to play her part to keep our village thriving.

She sits on the Communication and Community Spirit Working Groups which play to her strengths. Having been a primary school teacher for over 20 years, she is very used to planning and organising things. Meet Rachel Inglefield

Rachel Inglefield and her family moved to the village back in 2014 when her children were tiny. They immediately joined Little Dragons, where they met some wonderful friends. She joined the Parish Council in 2018, having initially approached it about the speed of the vehicles by the Hallam junction on the A346, to ascertain if they could lobby Wiltshire Council to extend the 50mph speed limit. At the time, the PC was happy to support the campaign, rather than lead it themselves, so Rachel set about lobbying Wiltshire Council herself. She was subsequently asked to become a Parish Councillor.

She is Chair of the Transport Working Group and sits on the Communications Working Group, and being a Communications Consultant, with a 20-year career in corporate and crisis public relations, this is clearly an ideal match for her skills and interests.

Rachel describes the current Parish Council as proactive, having achieved a great deal in a short amount of time, all fitted in around Committee Members' busy lives. They have loved bringing the village together through events such as the Christmas Tree Light Up, and the 2022 Jubilee celebrations. They are slowly working to improve the ambiance of the village through installing new notice boards, village signs and white gates, picnic tables, benches, and dog poo bins. They are all united in their desire to make residents safe, and to reduce the speed of vehicles travelling through the village through initiatives such as the new Speed Indicator Device.

During her term she's keen to introduce some new events such as Beating the Bounds in 2024, and to improve the facilities for older children in the village. The Transport Working Group will continue to work with Wiltshire Council on new traffic calming measures.

When it comes to what she most likes about living here, she cites the beauty of the countryside around us, and how it never ceases to amaze her how beautiful this part of Wiltshire is. In her leisure times she loves exploring the countryside with her two dogs, and her garden gives her huge joy, alongside her menagerie of chickens, ducks, dogs, and cats. She describes herself as a lucky mother of two and says she admires her children for their never-ending optimism and the pure delight they see in life.

Little Dragons

Launch of the second Solar Together scheme

Solar Together offers cost-effective solar panel and battery storage installation for households and businesses across Wiltshire and Swindon to save on energy bills and to generate their own electricity by purchasing high-quality solar panels and battery storage at a competitive price. Wiltshire Council and Swindon Borough Council are working with iChoosr, independent experts in group-buying, to launch a second Solar Together scheme, following the success of the first scheme launched in May 2022.

Over 1,500 homeowners across Wiltshire and Swindon have so far installed over 8,500 solar panels and 720 storage batteries to benefit from generating their own renewable energy. This is estimated to shrink the carbon footprint of these households by more than 650,000kg of carbon dioxide.

The prospect of choosing an installer and making the change to renewable energy can be daunting, but Solar Together makes the switch to clean energy as hassle-free as possible.

The scheme supports people every step of the way, providing clear and objective information that people can trust, so that they can make a well-informed decision and receive expert guidance throughout the process.
