2023 will mark 41 years since Salbris in France first established a link with Dymchurch, initially via our two fire brigades, before being formalised into The Twinning Association we know today. Twinning aims to develop cultural, tourist, economic and social relations with exchanges between the two towns, occurring twice a year. In 2022 Dymchurch members were able to visit Salbris once more for a long weekend and as always, enjoyed a wonderful time visiting Châteaux, enjoying all the delights of French cuisine and the hospitality of our individual hosts.

In September Salbris members visited Dymchurch and we provided a welcoming buffet donated by our members. On Saturday we took them by coach to Gusbourne vineyard where they were treated to their finest sparkling wine and a locally sourced picnic hamper, from there we went to Tenderden visiting the very interesting museum before finishing the day with a meal in Singleton Barn. On Sunday the hosting families made their own arrangements for their guests before returning to Dymchurch for fish and chips, a favourite with the French.

The Association hold social events during the year to raise funds for hosting with a donation from the Parish Council who they represent. REFLECTIONS ON THE PAST FOUR YEARS FROM THE PARISH CLERK

Back in 2019 I was asked to pop down from my regular Council at Lympe to help out at Dymchurch for a few hours to guide the new Councillors as they started their four year term of office. I never escaped!! After a bumpy first few months of office the brand-new Councillors for Dymchurch settled down and really started to get a grip of local issues. I always like to remind people that Parish Councillors are volunteers receiving no monetary rewards and giving up hours of their time to help make our local environment a better place, often with little thanks and often against some critical voices. Without these volunteers, local Parish Councils could not operate and residents would lose a place to get local solutions for local problems. I spent some time looking back through 4 years of minutes and was amazed to see what this Council have achieved, and all this through the Covid Pandemic. There is too much to fit into this newsletter so here is a taste of what has happened- I'll start with the boring un-seen stuff; New financial arrangements and accounting systems were quickly introduced along with the employment of Mr Adrian Lawson to work along side the Clerk and Groundsman Dave Henley. All financial transactions are open to scrutiny and are published monthly with the minutes. The mantra of "if you want to know what we are doing just ask" was quickly taken on board by every one working at the Parish Council. Meetings with KCC Highways to increase road safety have been held and continue. A slow process, but will not be dropped from the Council's radar. Now onto the fun stuff- Early on the Recreation Ground received protection from development through a Deed with the Fields in Trust and work to arrange a lease with the Friends of Dymchurch Recreation Ground Charity is near to completion. The Village Hall Car Park was resurfaced reducing the chance of a twisted ankle in a pot hole and later electrical charging points were installed, the first in the area. A new crossing at Tesco, new notice boards, full refurbishment of village benches, seawall residents parking scheme, enforcement of the disabled drivers carpark on the seawall was achieved. Drop in events at the Parish Council, which incidentally has recently been refurbished, were held. New Christmas lights for the winter celebrations and summertime hanging baskets decorated our high street. A visitor's hub was installed at the recreation ground. New trading licences were issued for new businesses, some doing well and others falling by the wayside. The return of Donkeys to our beach this year is very much welcomed and in addition last year we negotiated the introduction of lifeguards and a huge cherry on the cake was to be awarded the Seaside award 2022 and being voted Kents best beach, and this was all done without increasing the precept for the duration of this administration. There is much more and those that know me know I could go on for hours! A lot of the work would not have been completed without working with local Councillors, KCC, Charities and funders, but it shows you what can be achieved if you put your mind to it and have the support of the community in which you serve, and we thank you for that. In May the local elections take place and who knows what will happen in the next four years. What I do know is that if we can attract a group of Councillors who want to serve their community for the good of the community we will not go far wrong.

Seasonal passes for the Village Hall car park are now available to purchase

in person from the Parish Council office on Monday & Tuesday mornings 10am -12noon. A residents pass costs £25, for employees and employers it's £30. Car park charges are in operation from 1st April, for 2023 a new £1.40 hourly rate applies, 7 days a week.

**NEW LEGAL REQUIREMENT
TO VOTE AT A POLLING STATION
FROM 04 MAY 2023**

There is a new legal requirement for voters at the polling station from 04 May 2023.

Voters will have to present a valid form of photographic ID to be issued a Ballot Paper. This requirement is for all elections, including any by-elections that take place after this date.

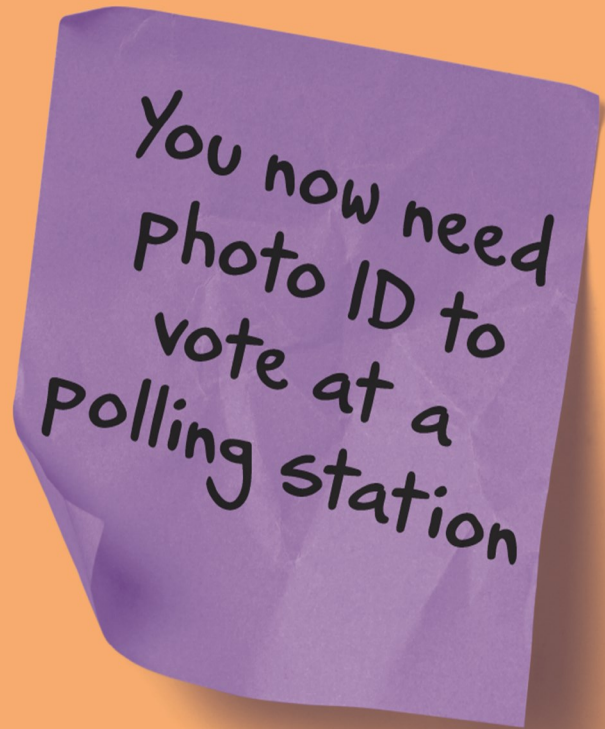
It will be the law - If a person can not provide ID they will not be able to vote.

If a voter does not have valid ID, they can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate (VAC) at the gov.uk website, in person at the Civic offices or by post. If you have any questions you can also contact the electoral commission on 0800 3280280. Your local Parish Clerk may also be able to assist with information.

You do not have to provide photo ID if voting by post, however if you vote by proxy (allowing someone you trust to vote on your behalf) they will need to show ID.
