That same cold wind and dull weather on the Sunday spoilt our plans for the picnic outside after the afternoon church service. But it gave an opportunity to use the new pew arrangement, showing how we can make use of the space in the future when the reorganisation is complete.

Reminders

The Wotton tomb. We are still waiting for the diocesan engineer to assess the stability of the marble stones, before making any decisions for their future care and protection. They remain a poignant memorial to these impressive Tudor personalities, and to the social and religious events of the time. There will be pamphlets, giving a potted biography with portraits, available in the church and in the Village Hall at the Tuesday Coffee Mornings. Much more information can be found in Wikipedia, on line.

Re-organisation of the pews has moved on apace, enabling us to already get an idea of how we can use the extra space for social and hospitality events. We look forward

to the long oak refectory-type table being in-situ. It was good to see at least 24 people seated there for the Jubilee tea. Will keep everyone up to date as things progress.

Village Coffee Time has begun opening at 11am each Tuesday and continues till 2.15pm when the Post Office closes. It gives plenty of time for everyone to 'drop in' for a chat. Donations for the first few weeks amounted to more than £100 and will be sent to help Ukraine.

Personal donations for Ukraine can still be taken to the back of St.Mary's church in Lenham. Directions are in place when you get there and it is open from 9-5pm every day. Main items needed are; Nappies, baby wipes, baby food/milk (not glass), sanitary items, medical kit basics, pain killers, tinned meat and fish (with ring pulls), blankets and warm socks.

We were delighted to welcome Theo and Scarlett Hibbs-Newman into the church family on 19th June, Lucy and Jake's children, Mair and James Chantler's grandchildren and great-grandchildren of Irene Ayling and of Andre and David Chantler. A Message From Boughton Malherbe Parish Council Chair

SUPPORT IT, OR LOSE IT. That is the message.

As I hope you all know, our annual Parish and Parish Council meetings took place in the evening of Monday 30th May.

No members of the public attended the annual Parish meeting.

A huge effort was made by all those representing local groups to provide reports to the annual Parish meeting about their activity over the past year, these reports were their showcase to all our parishioners in the hope of attracting support. The reports were printed into a booklet by our editor of the Malherbe Monthly. Copies were available for everyone who might have attended the Parish meeting. The non attendance was disappointing.

It was equally disappointing that only two members of the public attended the annual Parish Council meeting.

The wide range of interesting events provided for our community are generally well attended, but attracting support to run them is difficult, and the non attendance on the 30th May made me reflect on what we have lost since I came to the village some 60 years ago. These losses were often because of a lack of volunteers.

Despite age, regular volunteers carry on regardless if they can, and when they retire replacements are necessary, or the organisations cannot continue to serve the Parish.

On checking what we have lost over many years and what we might lose without sufficient support, I came to the conclusion that I must bring this situation to the attention of everyone, hence this message.

Our biggest blow was the recent loss of our village shop and post office with what now appears to be little chance of a community run replacement in the village, but an alternative might transpire. We do now have a pop-up post office in the village hall every Tuesday between 12.45 and 2.15 pm. Use it or lose it. At the same time free tea/coffee and nibbles are also provided from 11.00am to 2.15pm and a donation is invited. Please volunteer to help the ladies who run this social activity.

We have a 59-bus service which is more frequent than it has been in the past, but it no longer goes to the centre of Maidstone, hence it is little used. KCC are responsible for the change, and could now use lack of use as the excuse to withdraw funding instead of reinstating the service to Maidstone centre. Losing the 59-bus service may

be inevitable, despite the efforts of John Collins, our East of Maidstone bus group representative who is doing all he can to save it. Please use the 59 bus if you can.

Other services withdrawn by Maidstone Borough Council or Kent County Council due to financial constraints or claimed lack of support include, but are not necessarily limited to our school, a mobile library and a very popular rubbish freighter that called every month for an hour to take large items to the dump for free.

Supermarket home delivery has replaced the old milk and bread home delivery rounds, and we do now have an excellent fresh fish delivery service which could be at risk without more support. To try it, call 07976 435 217.

We will no longer have the pleasure of seeing the Morris Dancers performing in Grafty Green, because they are disbanding this year through lack of membership support. Unfortunately, it is too late to volunteer.

In the past we had football, cricket, table tennis and youth clubs, plus branches of the WI, Toc H, and Brownies. Our local garage and Tea Rooms are long gone, we even had three pubs, but after losing the Pig and Whistle we still thankfully have the Kings Head and Who'd a Thought It. They are well visited, please continue your support.

The Baptist Chapel is long gone and is now a residence. Our St Nicholas Church congregation is reduced to just a few who attend regular services, but it is fighting back with the introduction of an Eco shop, and in the future tea and cake will be served following the Songs of Praise service on the afternoon of the last Sunday in the month at 4.30 PM. The popular weekly Summer Sunday afternoon teas with home made scones, cream, and jam in the churchyard are unlikely to return without new volunteers to manage and run them.

Who will replace Mike Hitchins, our editor of the Malherbe Monthly who has done a fantastic job over many years keeping us all informed about local activities?

Who will replace Rosemary and Mike Smith, who have done a superb job over many years maintaining the village green. The Parish Council does pay a fee for this service.

The village hall is safe for the time being, and it has provided the venue for many essential and popular social activities for 100 years, but running it requires a sizeable committee. Please offer support or its days could be numbered in the long term.

This brings me to the Parish Council. New councillors will be needed when the next elections take place in 2024, perhaps sooner. We currently have five councillors, and three are of the older generation, the oldest being 85. The council may not be

sustainable without its present membership numbers, in which case we will lose it, and Maidstone Borough Council will take over. Then we could all become Maidstone residents without a voice, Grafty Green could be lost as we know it and the attraction that brought us here in the first place could be gone forever. Please volunteer at the next election or when there is a vacancy for a councillor.

Hard copies of the booklet to which I have referred were available in the village hall and the church entrance and have now all been taken. However, it is also published on the Parish Council web site and can be downloaded, go to "Parish Council", then "Parish Meetings" in the drop-down menu. Thank you for reading a little history and my encouragement to volunteer.



M01/05/22 Election of Chairman

RESOLVED: Cllr R Galton was elected as Chairman to Boughton Malherbe Parish Council for the next year. Cllr Galton signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office.

It was agreed not to elect a Vice Chairman.

M02/05/22 Election of Planning Committee Chairman

RESOLVED: CIIr G Kernnaird was elected as Chairman of the Planning Committee for the next year.

M03/05/22 Election of Finance and Staffing Committee Chairman

RESOLVED: ClIr R Turner was elected as Chairman of the Finance and Staffing Committee for the next year. M04/05/22 Apologies

Cllr Kennaird's apologies were received and accepted.

M05/05/22 Declarations:

Any interest in items on the Agenda – none declared

Any changes to the register of pecuniary interests - none declared

M06/05/22 Approval of Minutes

RESOLVED: the Minutes of the meeting held on 7th March 2022 were taken as read, confirmed and signed as being an accurate record of the proceedings.

M07/05/22 Public Session - two members of public present

A member of the public stated that, without improved attendance, the Church would inevitably close.

There was some discussion of possible ways in which attendance could be improved.

A member of the public raised the matter of Community Speedwatch. They had volunteered to join a team but no others had come forward. Cllr Turner reported that another resident had expressed their willingness to be involved: the Clerk to inform Cllr Kennaird.

M08/05/22 Annual Reviews

Current arrangements for delegation to committees, employees and other authorities were confirmed; it was agreed that Cllrs Adams and Eastwood would continue to hold the Highways portfolio; and Cllr Kennaird would continue to lead on Community Speedwatch.

M09/05/22 Platinum Jubilee Event

RESOLVED: the Platinum Jubilee Event organising group was adopted as a Working Group of the Parish Council in accordance with the Terms of Reference prepared by the Clerk.

It was noted that the Power for awarding the grant for the event was the Local Government Act 1972 s145: Provision of entertainment.

The terms of reference for the Planning and Finance and Staffing Committees were noted and will be reviewed at the first meetings of the committees.

M11/05/22 Nominations to Existing Committees

RESOLVED: All councillors will be members of both committees.

M12/05/22 Review of Standing Orders and Financial Regulations

Members had before them revised Standing Orders and Financial Regulations based on the latest NALC models.

RESOLVED: to adopt the revised Standing Orders subject to:

This month's anniversary is 3rd July, the 170th anniversary of the birth of Leoš Janáček (3 July 1854 – 12 August 1928). He was a Czech composer, musical theorist, folklorist, publicist and teacher, inspired by Moravian and other Slavic music, including Eastern European folk music, to create an original, modern musical style

Until 1895 he devoted himself mainly to folkloristic research. While his early musical output was influenced by contemporaries such as Antonín Dvořák, his later works incorporate his earlier studies of national folk music in a modern, highly original synthesis, first evident in the opera Jenůfa, which was premiered in 1904. The success of Jenůfa (often called the "Moravian national opera") at Prague in 1916 gave Janáček access to the world's great opera stages. His later works are his most celebrated. They include operas such as Káťa Kabanová and The Cunning Little Vixen, the Sinfonietta, the Glagolitic Mass, the rhapsody Taras Bulba, two string quartets, and other chamber works. Along with Dvořák and Bedřich Smetana, he is considered one of the most important Czech composers.

Christian Message July 2022

What is He like?

"Aslan is a lion - the Lion, the great Lion."

"Ooh" said Susan. "I'd thought he was a man. Is he quite safe? I shall feel rather nervous about meeting a lion". "Safe?" said Mr Beaver ..."Who said anything about safe? 'Course he isn't safe. But he's good. He's the King, I tell you."

These famous words are from the C.S. Lewis classic 'The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe'. Like so many others, it was one of my favourite stories growing up. At this point in the story, Susan is trying to get her head around what this Lion is like and how she should approach him. As a Christian, C.S. Lewis was very deliberately drawing a comparison with another King who, like Aslan, also gave His life for the sake of those He loved.

I often find myself in Susan's shoes as I seek to discover more about what my King is like. In Susan's case, Mr Beaver assured her that Aslan was good and that gave her a starting point to begin to understand him more. Knowing that he was good gave her a vital piece of information which she could build from.

Over time I've realised that our picture of God has a significant impact on how we view the world and our lives within it. What we believe about God makes a massive difference. So, like Susan, it's certainly worth our while considering what He is like. Is He good? One way to discover what God is like is through the Bible as it is full of insights as to what our King is like. In the book of Exodus, we read one the numerous passages that show us what God is like:

"Yahweh! The Lord! The God of compassion and mercy! I am slow to anger and filled with unfailing love and faithfulness. I lavish unfailing love to a thousand generations. I forgive iniquity, rebellion, and sin."

I want to know my King more. I want to understand my compassionate, merciful and slow to anger God. Wherever you're at in life, why don't you determine in your heart to find out more about the King who gave everything that we may live in freedom? Let's discover His unending goodness, enjoy boldly approaching Him and finding compassion and mercy.


