Emergency Plan Update

Your copy of this month's Malherbe Monthly is accompanied by your free copy of the Boughton Malherbe Parish / Grafty Green Emergency Plan. Please keep it in a safe place should it ever be needed.

The plan is mainly intended to be used in the event of a major disaster such as a plane crash into the village where many people might be affected, and we have to respond until all the emergency services arrive, after which our co-ordinators will assist. The plan might also be used if, for example, we have another extended power failure, homes are cut off by snow or a major storm strikes.

However, the plan also contains useful information for self help if your home is at risk or you are in personal danger.

Please take a few minutes to read the plan, we have kept it as short as possible so that you do not give up from boredom.

The plan will not become fully active for about three weeks while the full version is being finalised for the emergency services and for the coordinators. The next issue of the Malherbe Monthly will confirm if the Plan is active, but in the meantime an emergency should still generate a response from any co-ordinator.

It is hoped our plan will never be needed, but if it is, it provides the framework for co-ordinated help.

We maintain an emergency system to help the elderly and vulnerable if needed. If you know anyone who might benefit, including yourself, please tell Ron Galton (01622 850369) and a confidential note will be kept on file in case of need.

If you live outside the Parish, but have received a copy of the plan with your magazine you are not excluded from assistance in emergency. We will always try to help if possible, but if your Parish has its own plan you should use it in preference to ours.

Important Announcement from Boughton Malherbe Parish Council

It is an open secret that the Grafty Green Garden Centre has been sold. The purchaser is Quinn Estates who intend to develop the site.

This is not a Greenfield site, it is a Brownfield site with classification for retail use, and because of this the considerations for future planning of this site are quite different to those of previous sites that we have had to consider, and redevelopment of the Garden Centre is inevitable in one form or another.

Quinn Estates propose to develop 6.5 acres of land with a very high quality low density development of 14 large 4 / 5 bedroom houses, a small number of offices, and extensive landscaping, all in keeping with the local landscape. We want to hear your opinions and suggestions before Quinn Estates finalise their proposals and submit a planning application.

You are invited to attend an exhibition of the proposals in Grafty Green Village Hall which will be open on **Friday 1st May** from 7.00pm to 9.00 pm and **Saturday 2nd May** from 10.00 am to 12.00 noon for viewing. Representatives from Quinn Estates and the Parish Council will be in attendance for discussion and to listen to your comments.

This is a mouth watering curry from north of India. Serve with rice or crusty bread. Although it has a few ingredients, the cooking process, as with all my recipes, is very straight forward.

Kashmiri Lamb

4 dried red chillies 2 large onions, sliced thinly

3 fresh green chillies 1kg (2 lb) lamb, washed, pat dry and

1 teaspoon cumin seeds cut into 1 1/2" pieces

1 teaspoon Kashmiri garam masala 1/2 pint plain yoghurt

1 inch piece of root ginger, peeled and 1/2 teaspoon turmeric grated 1/2 teaspoon saffron

5 cloves garlic, crushed 20 blanched almonds

4 tablespoons desiccated coconut A handful chopped coriander

3 tomatoes, chopped salt to taste

6 tablespoons oil

- 1. Grind the red chillies, green chillies, cumin seeds, garam masala, ginger, garlic, grated coconut and tomatoes together into a smooth paste.
- 2. Heat the oil in a pan and fry the onions until golden.
- 3. Add the spice paste and fry it until the oil separates from the mixture. Now add the lamb pieces and the salt and cook until it is almost done. Stirring frequently. Add the yoghurt, turmeric, saffron and the blanched almonds and mix well.
- 4. Cook over low heat until the meat is tender and the gravy is thick. Garnish with chopped coriander leaves and serve.

Christian Message April 2015

In a month's time we will be going to the polls to elect a new government. No, I am not going to tell you which way to vote. But I am going to say that it's time for us all to engage with politics and community. The Church of England bishops got themselves into hot water with the government (again) last month by publishing a letter pleading for a fresh way of thinking.

Of course, there were howls of rage from the politicians: "keep out of politics – stick to saving souls." Sadly, our politicians just show their own ignorance and naivety when they speak like that. The church should be about so much more than "saving souls."

Jesus – showing us what God is like – had a lot to say about the political and religious leaders of his day. It was by no means complimentary! He had a passion for downtrodden, ordinary people. He – like God – longed for justice and right-living, for peace and love to be the marks of society, not greed, self-importance, power, lust and selfishness. Jesus' message was one of being right with God; but equally about the importance of living right and loving our neighbour (whoever they are, whatever they look like) as much as we love ourselves.

Whatever our politics, it's important that our voice is heard. Many will say "what's the point? Politicians are all the same." Let's not tarnish everyone with the same brush and let's bring some hope and vision back into our national life. The bishops' letter suggests that we are in danger of being a "society of strangers", rather than a "community of communities." We can strengthen our community by voting, by getting involved, by helping those around us, by looking out for each other. We can develop our gifts of hospitality by befriending our neighbours; we can learn to be generous with time, money and talents. Our four churches, for example, are raising money year on year to provide fresh water boreholes for four villages in Zambia. Girls can now get an education instead of trudging miles each day to fetch water from dirty wells. They, too, are our neighbours.

There is always hope. Even in the most desperate of times, we can hope, and we can be part of the path to a better society, a community of communities. The message of Easter is one of hope. Out of Jesus' death comes new life and that new life brings hope and the power to do right.

I will be voting. I hope everyone will. And I will be praying for our community, our country and our world as we face the continued pressures that affect us.
