Many of you will know the very successful and valued first responder pilot scheme run by our Fire Service has now been stopped. We recognise the value this scheme has brought to the Parish and surrounding villages and are looking to start a community first responder scheme to replace it. Community first responders attend local emergency calls and provide life saving first aid in those vital minutes before an ambulance arrives. Community first responders are trained to assess the situation, provide first aid if needed, and establish the patient's previous medical history. Sometimes they can simply be a very vital second pair of hands to an ambulance crew when they arrive. If you have any interest in this the please do contact the Council. Whilst we don't have full details at the moment, we do know that full training will be given and there is no minimum commitment so please do consider helping the community with this scheme.

The Parish Council is looking forward to serving you over the next four years and please feel welcome to attend any of the meetings at the Youth and Community Centre, Low Street on the fourth Thursday of each month (except August and December).
