# **Parish Council Report**

Covid-19

The low incidence of Covid-19 infections in South Oxfordshire during the summer months was welcome but this may not last. Cases are rising across the UK and it is likely that restrictions will be implemented in our area at some time this winter. The Moulsford support network worked very well for our shielding residents earlier this year and once again stands ready to help out. We are not proposing any specific actions at this time but are planning in case we need to. If you feel that you would like some additional support, or alternatively can offer support to others, please contact Bernadette Sachse in the first instance as she co-ordinates the network.

#### Housing in Oxfordshire

Some of you may be following the discussions on Government changes to national planning processes, the progress of the Oxfordshire Plan 2050 and associated development of SODC's local plan. There is clearly Government pressure to increase the housing stock and Oxfordshire is not except from that. Importantly for Moulsford, it seems that the protection afforded by being within the North Wessex Downs AONB will not be weakened and may be strengthened. We will continue to monitor changes and our thanks to our local SODC Councillor and Moulsford resident, Anne-Marie Simpson for keeping us informed.

### Recreation ground project

Recent planning applications have highlighted how important the recreation ground is as both the literal and social heart of our village. We are pleased to report that, despite Covid-19 constraints, the project to review how to make best use of this asset is making progress. We are currently in the feasibility stage and are looking at various options to enhance the utilisation of this open space and meet the needs of the different parts of our community. Although it is early in the process, we intend to conduct further consultations as we identify options, ideas and costs.

This project started with the need to mend or replace some of the existing playground equipment. This is still going ahead but now within the context of an overall strategy for the recreation ground as a whole. Watch this space ....!



### New Rural Gigabit Voucher Scheme

The importance of high-speed internet access has become a priority issue with so many people working from home and the increased demand for binge watching Netflix/Apple TV/Sky/Amazon Prime/Britbox. A Gigabit Broadband voucher scheme has been launched by the Government and for our area it is being administered by Oxfordshire County Council. The scheme provides funding of up to £7,000 to upgrade rural properties and businesses with superfast fibre optic cable. Domestic applications cannot be from individual households, so groups of neighbours need to team up before applying. This is not something we can do on behalf of the village as it is aimed at specific domestic or business needs. We have established that Moulsford is an eligible location and if you are interested please look at the details online at gigabitvoucher.culture.gov.uk. The vouchers are expected to be snapped up quickly so please act without delay and share information with neighbours (and the PC!) if you find out any helpful information.

## Sad news

We are sad to report the death on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> October of Miles Powell who had served the village community for some 16 years, as both a member and more latterly chairman of Moulsford Parish Council.

His legacy includes the village pavilion for which he tirelessly ran a fund-raising campaign around Friday socials, coordinated the many grants which contributed a large portion of the funding and drove the project through planning and construction phases to completion.

More recently he ran the project to update the building's driveway, including safety lighting, to make access easier for those less able who wished to attend social events.

Behind the scenes his contribution was greater. He successfully worked with both district and county councils to arrange support for the village – most tellingly during the flooding when Moulsford received a disproportionately high share of resources and equipment.

Those who worked with him on the parish council will remember his selfless contribution of time freely given while continuing a demanding career and undertaking various professional training courses.

He managed to combine his career with family life, while rarely missing a parish council meeting. He was able to successfully knit together the various skills and abilities of his council colleagues in serving the needs of the village. Most importantly he remained humble throughout while never losing his sense of humour.

He will be sorely missed by all who knew him.

My dear friends,

Remember, remember... November is the season of remembering. The festivals of All Saints and All Souls on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> of November encourage us remember those loved ones who are no longer with us, and give thanks for the love that they showed us and the influence for good that they had on our lives.\*

Then on 5<sup>th</sup> November we remember how Parliament was delivered from an early act of terrorism and mass killing by the notorious Guy Fawkes. It is also perhaps a reminder to us that despite the frustrations that many have with the government and politicians, we should be enormously grateful that we continue to live in a relatively safe, peaceful and democratic society.

Then on 8<sup>th</sup> November we have Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day on the 11<sup>th</sup>, when we remember with gratitude not only all those who have given their lives that we might enjoy freedom and peace, but also just how precious it is to be able to enjoy such peace and commit ourselves to doing all that it takes to preserve it.

So remembering and thanksgiving often go together. They are also an essential part of Christian worship. The Holy Communion service which is at the heart of Christian worship is all about *remembering* what Jesus Christ has done for us, namely dying in our place on the cross so that we might enjoy God's complete forgiveness and a new life. The broken bread and poured out wine were established by Jesus as a means to help us both to remember and to

receive the blessing of all that he did out of his love for us. Sometimes Holy Communion is referred to as *the Eucharist*, which is a Greek word meaning *thanksgiving*.

So in all these instances, remembering is not about nostalgia, which is a kind of wistful longing for how things used to be, but remembering the past in order to be reminded of present blessings that flow from that past. This kind of remembering adjusts our perspective and enables us to see the present more clearly.

So as the nights draw in, and maybe you find yourself looking back to times gone by, focus on the things that you can be thankful for – and think how they can continue to bless you today: maybe it's re-connecting with that friend with whom you had a great holiday; or putting into practice what you learnt from a loved one no longer alive; or perhaps taking steps to re-connect with that faith which was once an important part of your life.

## Moulsford Recreation Ground: the green heart of our village

Events of this year have proved how valuable our Recreation Ground is to village life. Its importance was highlighted in the numerous responses to the Friends of the Elderly planning application and throughout the ongoing months of lockdown, it has been somewhere to relax and take a breather, or play, exercise and even somewhere to celebrate.

Coming out of the need to review the playground area, we are now exploring ideas for future enhancement of the Recreation for both play and leisure and also for the benefit of the village environment. We've seen that the use of the Rec is gradually changing and we know that the playground equipment is going to need replacing over the next few years. So, with the assistance of a grant from District Councillor Anne-Marie Simpson, the PC is working with the team from ASA Landscape Architects towards creating a future plan for the Recreation Ground. We are aiming to find great creative solutions to make the very best use of this green space at the heart of our village. It's also important that we make the best use of our resources and we'll be getting advice from the team on grant applications as well.

We are in the very early stages of exploring ideas at the moment, as things develop, there will of course be community discussions and eventually fund-raising. We will keep the village in touch with the project through Moulsford News and also the usual PC meetings.

We are really excited about this project and its potential, and are now setting up a working group to take it forwards. ## Remember... fireworks safety on November 5th





As Bonfire Night approaches, Oxfordshire County Council is reminding residents that the safest way to celebrate is to attend a professionally organised public event that is confirmed as COVID-19 safety compliant, following local and national guidance.

However, as it will not be practical for everyone to attend organised public events, particularly this year, Oxfordshire County Council Fire and Rescue Service is providing guidance for anyone having their own fireworks display:

#### Top safety tips for Bonfire Night:

- Only buy CE marked fireworks from reputable and licensed shops.
- Keep fireworks in a closed, metal box.
- Light the firework at arm's length with a taper and stand well back.
- Keep naked flames, including cigarettes, away from fireworks.
- Don't put fireworks in pockets and never throw them.
- Never return to a firework that has not gone off, and never throw used or unused fireworks onto a bonfire.
- Never drink alcohol while lighting a bonfire or setting off fireworks.
- Always supervise children and don't give sparklers to a child under five.
- Keep your bonfire at least 18 metres away from houses, trees and hedges. There should be a barrier around the bonfire to keep spectators five metres away. Before lighting a bonfire, check it is stable and that there are no children or animals inside.
- Only burn dry wood, never use paraffin or petrol on a bonfire and think about the direction of smoke travel.
- Keep some buckets of water nearby.
- Have consideration for those around you, including notifying neighbours who may have pets or farm animals.
- Consider where fireworks and debris might fall, ensuring safety distances are provided for people to keep safe. Safety distances are provided on each firework label or package.




