759	To receive apologies for absence It was RESOLVED to accept apologies for Cllr Cornford and Cllr Morrish	
760	Declarations of Interest There were none.	
761	Minutes It was RESOLVED that the minutes of the meeting of 8 th May 2017 be signed and approved as a true record of the meeting.	
762	Chairman's announcements The chairman explained the usual housekeeping rules.	
763	To report resignation of Cllr Rickett The Chairman reported that ex-councillor Mr Rickett had allowed his resignation letter to be circulated and published on social media and the Chairman felt that responses to the allegations contained in the letter were required. The Chairman explained that contrary to the comments that the Town Council had not achieved anything in its first two years the Town Council had actually achieved the following:- <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Successful agreement with Thanet District Council for the asset transfers of the Lymington Road recreation ground, football pitches, pavilion and beach shelters back to Westgate • Running of allotments • Licenses for the football pitches to be used this season by local clubs • Licenses for the renovation of the beach shelters in time for the summer season 	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • becoming a local employer, now employing four people • The introduction of a varied Events Program under Cllr Nightingale; such as funding Christmas Lights, organising Pancake Races, taking over the organisation of the Remembrance Sunday parade • Developing Westgate-In-Bloom • Covering the Christchurch clock repairs • Funding the Youth Project to ensure its survival in the town <p>The Chairman re-iterated that the Council had achieved a great deal since its inception and much more was anticipated in the coming year.</p>	
764	<p>Public Participation Session There were no public participation requests.</p>	
765	<p>Parking Charges Consultation It was agreed to submit the response provided by Cllr Pennington and Mr Reg Bell. Cllr Pennington was thanked for his work with Mr Bell on this matter.</p>	
766	<p>Chairman's Report The Chairman reported that there is to be a training and information evening on Tuesday 6th June for all councillors held at the United Services Club function room by the Local Monitoring Officer and urged everyone to attend this important engagement.</p>	
767	<p>Committee Structure After some discussion it was agreed to defer this item to the next meeting of Full Council.</p>	
768	<p>Town Clerk's Report Asset Disposal at Thanet District Council Thanet District Council have agreed to transfer Lymington Recreation Ground to Westgate-on-Sea Town Council.</p> <p>Neighbourhood Planning Grant The Town Council has been granted £1835 towards the next stage of the Neighbourhood Plan. Locality reduced the grant funding of the prize draw to only £50 therefore a short fall of £100 exists due to the questionnaire being published advertising up to three prizes of £50 to be won. A contingency for the consultant was submitted however the exact quote of £885 was agreed therefore the group are minded to ensure no additional consultancy fees are instructed at this time. Expenditure must be claimed between the periods of 17/05/2017 and 30/09/2017</p>	

	<p>Councillor and Staff Identification Cards The Clerk is investigating the costs of photographic ID cards for staff and councillors.</p> <p>National Association of Local Councils Award Scheme Now that the Town Council has strengthened its governance structure it has the opportunity to apply for a NALC Award. For those councils who are already confident that they perform to a high standard the scheme provides assurance to the council that it is up-to-date and progressive by the standards set by the sector. For those who wish to improve, it provides a framework to plan and make the first steps. The NALC Award scheme helps the council improve performance and confidence, with policies in place for continuous development. This scheme is also a way ensure that the commitment and hard work of councillors and officers is recognised and respected.</p> <p>To achieve the Quality Award a council demonstrates that it meets all requirements of the Foundation Award and has additional evidence of good governance, effective community engagement and council improvement. The Clerk will be submitting Westgate-on-Sea Town Council for the Quality Award in the first instance.</p>	
769	<p>Reports from Councillors Cllr Scott reported that there had been a good response to the Neighbourhood Plan Questionnaire and encouraged the public to take part. Cllr Page reported that she had attended the YouCAN launch along with Cllr Rolfe and that the new house was a fantastic place to provide respite to cancer sufferers and their families. Cllr Nightingale reported that following a meeting with the Royal British Legion the chairman was very supporting of the Town Council taking over the Remembrance Day Parade and keen to create a branch of the legion in the town.</p>	
770	<p>Reports from District Councillors Cllr Carol Partington addressed the meeting and confirmed that all ward councillors had attended a meeting with officers at Thanet District Council concerning the asset transfer of the Recreation Ground to the Town Council and all were supportive of the proposal. The proposed parking charges were discussed and Cllr Partington confirmed that the Joint Transportation Board is due to consider the changes on 22nd June. Following that, if the proposal is</p>	

	<p>approved, Thanet District Council will launch a full statutory consultation.</p> <p>Cllr Partington reported that the two trees removed from Minster Road had been diseased but there was no plans to replace them and the Tennis Court nets in Westbrook were damaged and she was pressing for replacements.</p>	
771	<p>Reports from County Councillors</p> <p>Cllr Gregory addressed the meeting and confirmed that the reason for the waste recycling centre in Margate being closed at the weekend was due to the skips being full after taking extra waste whilst another local tip was closed.</p> <p>Cllr Gregory also reported that following the request from the Town Council to install 'Welcome to Westgate' signs at the boundary ends on Canterbury Road this was being worked on by KCC officers.</p> <p>Cllr Gregory also pledged support for the petition against the parking charges.</p> <p>Cllr Gregory, Cllr Partington and Cllr Bambridge left the meeting.</p> <p>Cllr Scott left the meeting at 19.55pm</p>
