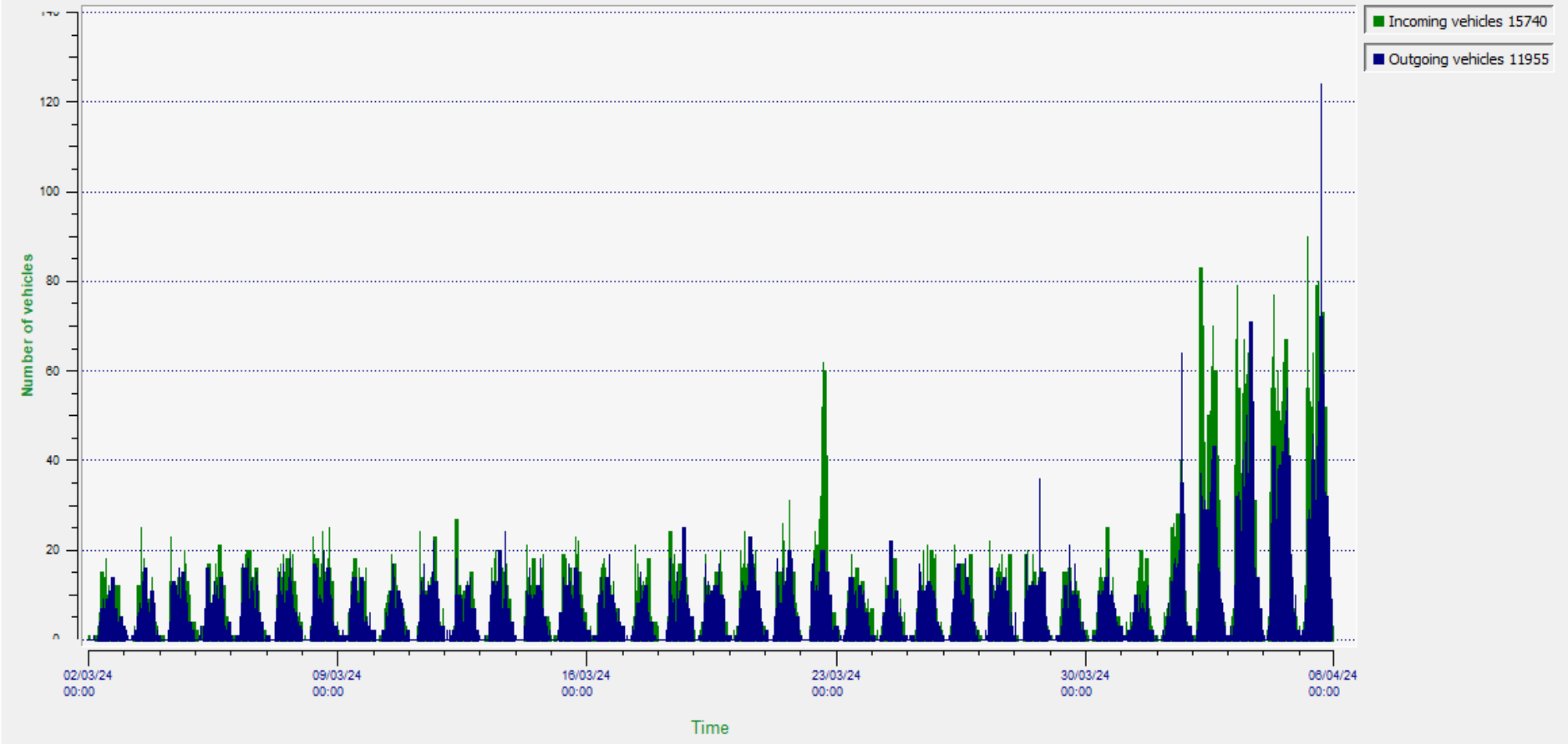

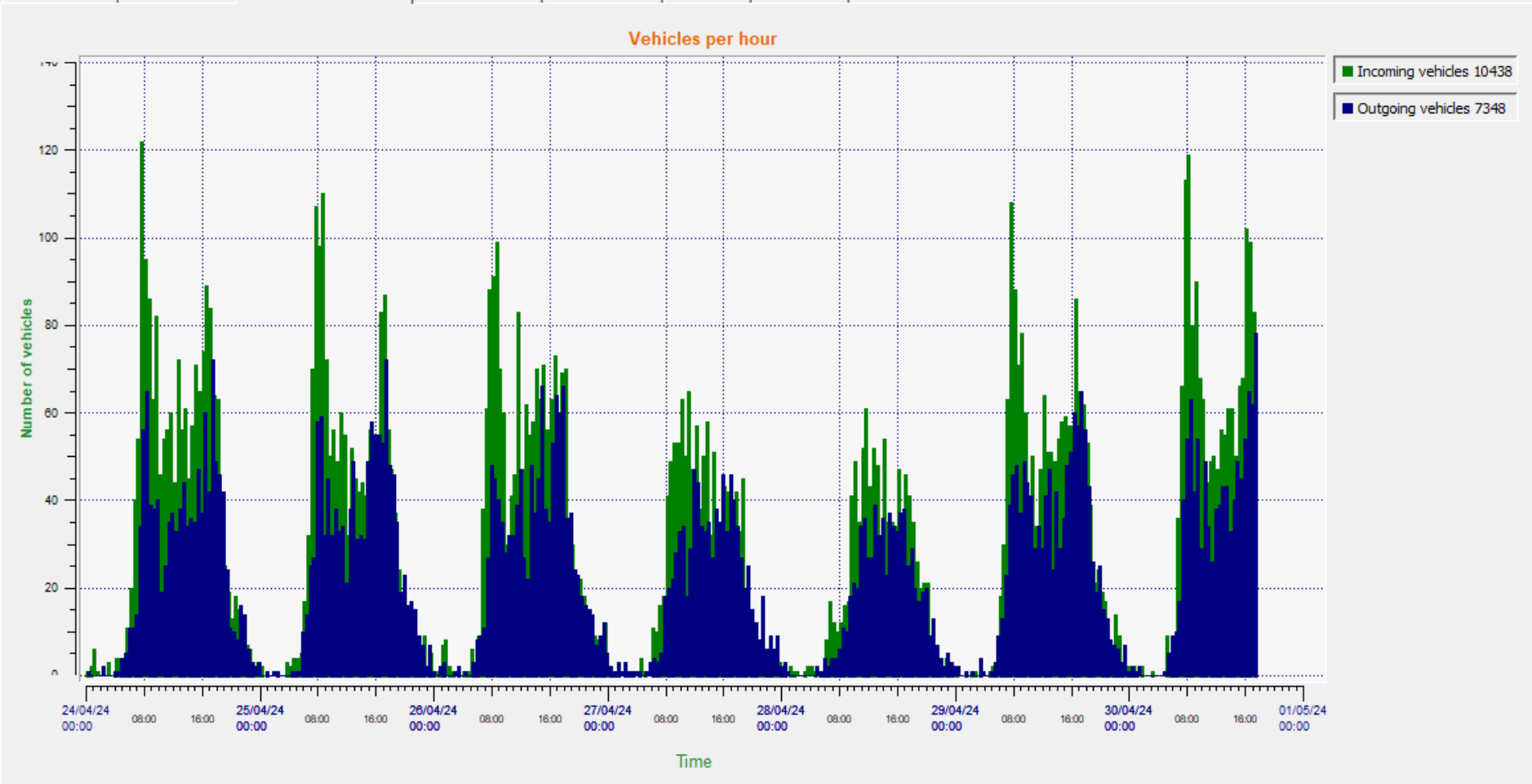

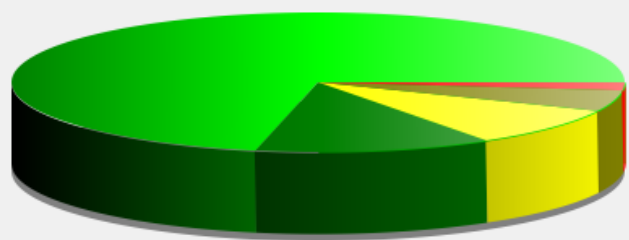

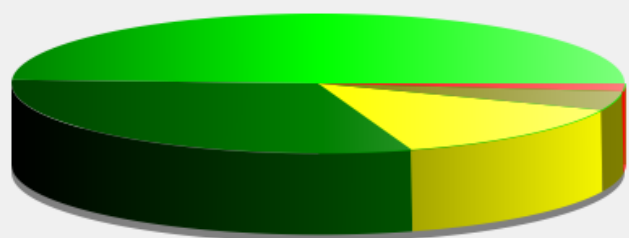
Vehicles distribution among velocity range

10. Wessex Water

“We undertook survey work in January as planned, but some parts of the sewer network were surcharged by groundwater and could not be completed. We returned on a few occasions to complete those lengths, but we did not identify any points of groundwater ingress.

It is likely that the water table fell below the level of the pipework in between our visits – we will attempt another survey or surveys next winter to pinpoint where the groundwater ingress is occurring. We will keep a space free in our 2025/26 lining programme for Berwick St. James so that any defects we find can be addressed as soon as possible.”

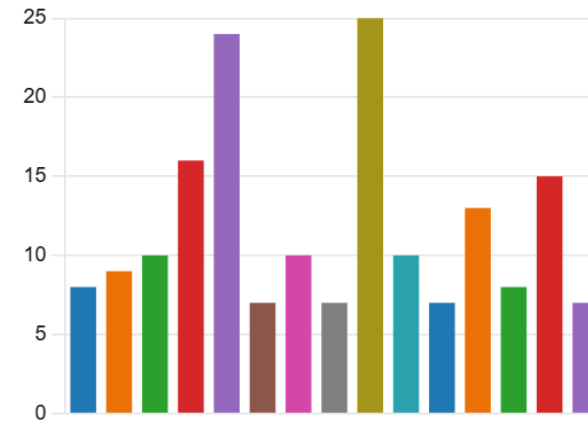
