Village Hall – Since our last newsletter there have been many developments regarding the village hall. In April of this year the Hall Committee took the difficult decision to hand the hall back to the control of the Parish Council. Since then, we have taken new bookings and have a growing variety of classes available at the hall as well as new bookings for a number of local organisations and events. We are also pleased to confirm that the Parish Council meetings have returned to the hall at the slightly later time of 7.30pm on the first Thursday of each month (full details can be found on the noticeboards or our website).

WAPC have been kept busy obtaining quotes for refurbishment works to the property and we are hopeful that we will be in a position of awarding a contract in the next few weeks.

The survey referenced above contains a section regarding the facilities and offerings you would like to see available at the village hall. This is a very important facility sited in the heart of the village and it is vital that we can provide an amenity that will benefit as many of you as possible.

A new committee is being established, we invite you to join us and be a part of the coming transformation.

Play Equipment Project – You may have noted some works taking place on the playing field. Earlier in the year we were pleased to award a contract for new play equipment and a small adult gym to be sited on the field. Unfortunately, due to issues outside our control, the project had to be delayed by some months however, the works are now completed. We have further good news in that we are in discussions with the school and the contractor about the addition of a second phase - watch this space!

Waste Services – After an exceedingly long unsettled period it was good to receive news that South Hams District Council are taking back control of the waste collection services with effect from October 2022. This may not be the end of the troubles we have all been experiencing with our collections; however, we are all agreed that it is a step in the right direction.

Please do not put garden waste in the grey waste bin.

Use the recycle centers - All three recycling centers located in the South Hams are operated by Devon County Council and take garden waste. Full details, including

Use a licensed waste collector who will responsibly take away your garden, or household, waste items. Please check first with the Environment Agency to see if they are registered: https://environment.data.gov.uk/public-register/view/search-waste-carriers-brokers

Scam Emails – There continues to be a huge amount of scam calls and emails, please do not provide your personal or banking information to anyone unless you are 100% certain that they are who they claim to be. Report it – Like it or not, most of us have experienced problems with potholes, full bins, damaged signs, overgrown vegetation, and other more unusual issues such as finding a stray dog or noticing building works taking place that may not have been approved.

It used to be the case that you would have to phone through the issues, thankfully these days it takes just one minute to submit a report online, sometimes even less than that as some higher incident objects (i.e., bins) have QR codes on them.

Please use the below links to submit reports on all the things in the parish that need some attention. You can do it as you notice the problems or if you are busy wait until a rainy day and submit a few reports at one time!
