REFLECTION

During this season in our Benefice without a rector, different church members are delighted to share a monthly reflection with you. This month it is written by **Mark Spindlow**.

What do you do when you are waiting for someone? I scroll mindlessly through Facebook or play solitaire on my phone. Then again, I do that at other times too! It's estimated that the average person spends 2 hours and 24 minutes on social media every day. It's a great distraction and I know I'm not alone in wasting significant amounts of my actual free time in waiting mode - and

yes, that's the Church season we are in now, Advent, which means waiting.

We are waiting for Christ's arrival. Spiritually speaking, waiting has far more in common with attention than distraction. The Psalmist describes the soul waiting for God 'more than watchmen for the morning', and the first Christmas story is full of people who do this preparation well. Elizabeth spends a lifetime obediently following the law and finds herself at the centre of a miracle in old age. Wise men patiently study the night sky and observe an unusual star even as it is 'rising'. Righteous Simeon 'looks forward to the consolation of Israel' and immediately recognises the infant Jesus as the Messiah when he is presented at the Temple. This is waiting redeemed, and these people are inspiring.

But God comes also to a young, unmarried girl told she will now mother the Son of God, to Joseph in his sleep and to shepherds utterly terrified by the unexpected arrival of angels. The spiritual life, I find, is one of striving and failing - and where it is failing, I take comfort in a God that bursts into the world whether it is ready or not. Emmanuel: God is with us.

Join us for our Christmas services and hear the Christmas story, with new attention, afresh again this year.

My huge thanks to the kind souls who have given their time every year's end to sell tickets and collect money - not an easy task - and to everyone who has bought tickets over the last two decades. Without you, none of this would have been possible.



under King James 1, resulting in the Plot which failed to blow up the Houses of Parliament in 1605, and the execution of the conspirators for Treason. The custom still continues to this day as an annual event to light bonfires, let off fireworks and burn effigies of Guy Fawkes.

Members are looking forward to our December meeting, when we join with the WL Mothers Union to hold a celebratory Christmas Festive Tea.

We meet at West Lavington Village Hall on the second Thursday of the month, in winter (November-March) at 2pm and in summer (April-October) at 7pm. We welcome guests at most meetings, but need to know numbers in advance because of the capacity of our meeting room. You may attend one meeting free of charge, after which a guest fee of £5 is chargeable.

Early Blooms: A Strange December Garden

Have you noticed strange things happening in your garden? Are things in flower that shouldn't be? My Prunus autumnalis has already flowered, which feels far too early. Clematis cirrhosa is in bloom, cowslips and primroses are out, and my salvias and geums have only just started flowering after the summer drought. My Coronilla is out too. Even the lawn is growing like mad. Friends have told me their daffodils and Rhododendron luteum are already flowering, another sign that this winter is unusual.

It all feels out of sync, and it's hard not to worry about spring. Will anything have the energy to flower again? Fear not, most plants will manage a second, more normal spring flowering even if they've had an early wobble. Prunus autumnalis usually flowers again in late winter. Many spring plants, like primroses and cowslips, form buds well in advance, so even if they open a few early, there are more waiting. Clematis cirrhosa will probably continue in fits and starts, and salvias and geums should settle into their usual pattern once the weather cools. The only real risk is a sudden hard frost catching new growth.

What we can do now is focus on resilience. Mulching is one of the best things you can do. A good layer of organic matter protects roots from frost, keeps moisture steadier, and stops soil compacting. Leaving stems and slightly untidy growth over winter protects crowns and provides shelter for wildlife.

Choosing resilient plants is more important than ever. Ceanothus, Hellebores, Ferns, Cornus, Euphorbias, grasses like Miscanthus and Stipa, and hardy salvias and geums cope well with extremes. Deep rooted perennials and evergreens are particularly valuable. Even if this winter feels strange, most plants find their rhythm again. We just need to support them so they are strong enough to do it.





WEST LAVINGTON PARISH COUNCIL



December is upon us and one of the last Parish Council discussions of the year was the Corporate Plan. This is where we plan how we will spend your money and what initiatives we need to focus on in the coming year. We discussed:

How to communicate to more villagers: early in 2026 we intend to launch a broadcast only What's App Group for village events so that we can send information about such things as the Village Fete and Scarecrow Festival direct to people's phones. We will send more information on how to subscribe in the New Year.

Do we have the right facilities in our recreation ground, Village Hall and playgrounds? In the New Year we will invite every household to submit a survey response asking what things you would like to have in the village. You may want more sports facilities or classes and events, different facilities for children. All ideas are good so watch out for the Survey which should be with you by February.

Our Rights of Way Team will run some working parties for footpaths and bridleways in the winter. If you see any paths blocked by fallen trees or overgrown hedges, you can contact the Team by email at footpaths@westlavington.org.uk We also work closely with the footpaths team at Market Lavington, so tell us about blocked paths even if you are not sure of the responsible owner and we will make sure it goes to the right team. Our volunteers have done a fantastic job this year making sure overgrown footpaths are clear, and working with householders that need to cut back hedges and borders. Thank you to everyone who has participated - walkers who enjoy using the paths have seen the difference.

Winter has very much arrived with its usual wet and windy start - leaves are off the trees and we saw the first road floods in November. Water run-off is our biggest risk, so please keep an eye open for blocked drain gullies near your home. A quick sweep of leaves means water can drain away and reduces any risk to homes, walkers and drivers. It is a simple way to help ourselves be more resilient. The Parish Council has a small stock of Gel instant sandbags and rock salt for paths and pavements. Should you need any please get in touch in the usual way.

We have one vacancy for a Parish Councillor. The role is not arduous - one meeting a month and participation with some of the initiatives that we work on from footpaths to housing and planning. You don't need to have expertise, just a desire to help our community and give a little time for our village. 

Perfect Love Casts Out Fear

When my family was younger, I underwent a period of real worry about my children. There are many things parents are concerned about. We instruct our children to be careful near traffic, teach them to be cautious around strangers, warn about the dangers of drugs, and so on. However, this can easily change from proper parental concern into controlling anxieties.

Whilst in this situation, I would experience sudden moments of cold panic, worrying about where my children were and what might happen to them. It would have been very easy to give in and allow that anxiety to become the governing power in our family. I could have chosen to keep my children constantly in my sight, to control their every movement. To do so might have looked like the product of love, but in reality it would have been a response to an idol of fear. Instead, what I had to do was deliberately take an axe to it and refuse to let it rule my life. In and of myself, I wasn't capable of doing this. I needed to give my uncertainties to the true God and allow Him to bring me into freedom and peace.

1 John 4:18 tells us that 'perfect love casts out fear,' and in order to find idol-destroying strength, we need to cultivate delight in God. This is the kind of love that means we throw ourselves unreservedly on the grace that is ours in Christ Jesus and choose to make Him the centre of our affections, thoughts, and actions. When we do, there isn't space for any other god in our lives. And while fears may still be very real, they lose their power to control us as our delight in God compels us to serve Him rather than our anxieties.



The season prepares us for both the celebration of Jesus' birth - the first coming and His eventual return (the Second Coming). Our hope, joy, peace and love arrives and reminds us of who we are in Christ.

Christmas and a grace too powerful to name

The musical Hamilton has been a big hit, with acclaimed performances on Broadway and in London's West End. The Hamilton in question is American politician Alexander Hamilton (circa 1755-1804) who was involved in the Revolutionary War against the British and became the first US secretary to the Treasury under George Washington. Hamilton helped to frame the constitution of the newly established republic.

The life of a Founding Father seems like an unlikely subject for an all singing, all dancing musical, but it works.

My wife and I recently saw the film version of a Broadway performance of the musical, released to mark the show's tenth anniversary. We went in part to see what all the fuss was about and quite enjoyed it. Act II certainly packs an emotional punch. Without giving away too many spoilers, Hamilton becomes estranged from his wife, Eliza. A terrible tragedy then strikes their family, following which they are



reconciled. The drama of the moment is carried forward by the song 'It's Quiet Uptown'.

In the song, a grieving Hamilton acknowledges that he is undeserving of his wife's love. Surveying the scene, Eliza's sister Angelica reflects, 'there is a grace too powerful to name'. As the couple hold hands as a gesture of reconciliation the chorus sings, 'forgiveness, can you imagine?' Watching this unfold, I'm thinking, 'Preach it. Amen to that!'.

Better still, what happened at the first Christmas revealed that grace indeed has a name. In the New Testament Paul writes of God's grace 'which has now been manifested through the appearing of our Saviour, Christ Jesus.'

Grace is God's love for underserving sinners, lavished upon us in Jesus. The Son of God came to die in our place that we may be reconciled to God and have our sins forgiven. Forgiveness, can you imagine? You can do more than imagine by receiving God's gift of forgiveness by faith in Jesus. That's the power of grace.




