

The Way Forward

There has been a great deal of speculation about the appointment of a replacement for Paul Cox. At a meeting of the Churchwardens on 5th January, which reviewed the appointment, it was decided not to readvertise but to consult with the PCC's and the Bishop was so informed.

On 6th May the Archdeacon will meet with the Churchwardens and the clergy to agree a way forward. The Diocese is encouraging parishes to bring together lay ministry leadership teams that, in partnership with the clergy, take forward the life of the churches. We will aim to have two teams in place by the end of the year.

The response from the parish groups that I have met has been most encouraging. With the help that the Diocese will provide and with Paul Filmer being ordained priest on 28th June at Canterbury Cathedral, the future appears very challenging and exciting.

One great encouragement has been the acceptance of Sheila Porter by "ABBM" for training for the ministry. This training will be undertaken locally at the South East Institute for Theological Education in Canterbury. We hope that you will continue to encourage her by prayer and support her in the three years of training that lie ahead.

There is so much that lay people can offer. Now we have only to provide the vision, offer the leadership and nurture the gifts for the churches to continue to grow as many are now doing.



Kent police working with the community

Did you know there is now a 24 hour a day telephone system to deal with crime enquiries. You can talk to those manning the phones, and request information about your crime or, if necessary, report a crime. These officers will be able to answer your questions or take details from you. This will save delays and frustration when you need the information, e.g. for your insurance company, or you want to let the officer have some details which you maybe forgot earlier. Gone are the days when the person on the other end of the phone doesn't have a clue what you are talking about!

The expansion of the system, which we call 'Genesis', means your information is immediately available to everyone and valuable time is saved. It is a lot more than a crime logging machine though. 'Genesis' is a multi-million pound project which is sending Kent Police into the 21st Century at the forefront of British policing.


It will track the activities of criminals in our midst and allow us to focus and target them more than ever before. It keeps our information up to date and keeps the pressure on the criminal, where it belongs.

So how can you help? What part do you have to play? It is not uncommon for a television to be stolen and the loser doesn't even know if it was a Sony or a Sanyo! Technology is only as good as the information going in. Imagine how frustrating it is to recover stolen property and then fail to find the person from whom it was stolen, Lefs attack this very real problem. You do have a major part to play.

The hymn writer remembered this month was a prominent literary and political figure in Restoration England. He was:- Joseph Addison. B Milston, Wilts. 1st May, 1672. D 1719.

HYMN: 109

When all thy mercies, O my God, my rising soul surveys, transported with the view, I'm lost in wonder, love and praise.

Addison, the son of a Dean of Lichfield, enjoyed a full and distinguished career. He became a prominent scholar at Oxford, and was for a time a Fellow of Magdalen College. He was a Member of Parliament all his life, holding important political posts as Under Secretary of State and Chief Secretary for Ireland, but also found time to develop his talent for writing, becoming an eminent journalist and man of letters. He moved in high society, married the Dowager Countess of Warwick, became a founder member of a London club, and at his death had the honour of being buried in Westminster Abbey.

Today, he is remembered for his literary achievements. His prose writings, praised at the time by Dr Johnson, appeared in a number of periodicals. Addison also wrote within the political arena and founded 'The Freeholder', a periodical devoted to politics. Quite early on he had proved to be no mean poet, drawing the admiration of Dryden by his Latin verses, and in 1705 writing the poem 'The Campaign' to celebrate the victory of Blenheim.

The poems which were eventually used as hymns were only five in number, all of which appeared in 'The Spectator' - issued daily - within weeks of each other, in the year 1712. All five were eventually set to music by J Sheeles (1688-1716), adapting tunes from his composition 'The Skylark' published around 1720. Any further information on Sheeles has been difficult to find - no mention of his name appears in the new Grove Dictionary of Music and Musicians, and other reference books have drawn a blank. Only three of Addison's five hymns are included in modern hymn collections. They are:- 'The spacious firmament on high' (103), the only one that retains the tune by Sheeles: a tune popularised by the Methodists. Unfortunately, it is not a hymn often heard - possibly never within the living memory of either Elmsted or Hastingleigh congregations! The words, however, represent one of the gems from

English Poetry, and if not sung they certainly deserve to be read. 'The Lord my pasture shall prepare' (111) is based on Psalm 23, and concluded an essay entitled 'Divine Providence'. It is interesting to compare Addison's rendering with Herbert's (110) and Henry Baker's (126) on this Psalm.

The third hymn, 'When all thy mercies, O my God', concludes an essay by Addison on Gratitude, appearing in 'The Spectator' for 9th August, 1712. It was originally in thirteen stanzas. However, this poem along with others was hotly disputed over authorship. It was contended for a while that this hymn was written by Isaac Watts, the problem being that Addison used a single letter as a pseudonym - in this instance 'C'. The confusion was eventually resolved. This hymn and 'The spacious firmament on high' were included in 'The Charlestown Hymn Book' compiled by John Wesley and the first of a series that both John and his brother Charles were to participate together in their future work. Both hymns were added to the Paraphrases of The Scottish Psalter in 1781.

'When all Thy mercies' gives us a window into Addison's Christian faith. Here was a gifted man who had great wit, intelligence and humour; one of our foremost essayists; a political figure; a man of his age. Yet this worldly success and the social fopperies of the time never deterred his feelings of indebtedness to daily mercies which he deeply believed came from God's guiding hand. He looks back to infancy, through 'the slippery paths of youth', indeed, to every period of his life, and testifies to what a later twentieth century poet, John Masefield, was to describe as 'The Everlasting Mercy'. What is more, Addison looks towards eternity where he will repeat the same song.
