



Dear Friends.

It is mid-March as I write this letter to you. At the moment, it seems hard to think about the approaching joys of the season of Easter while we hear each day of the suffering experienced in Ukraine. We marvel at the peace we experience here, in our part of the world. The seasons are beginning to change once more, as the first spring flowers appear in our fields, hedgerows, and gardens. Bird song fills the air, while the warm glow of the sunrise greets us each morning.

We are indeed grateful for the peace we experience here, and yet, at times, we feel helpless in the face of the suffering and warfare experienced by others, especially by the people of Ukraine. We ask ourselves what can we do? How can we help? Charities and individuals are doing incredible work in Ukraine and on its borders, particularly for refugees. But we can feel so far away.

I remember some wise words I once heard from a friend of mine. We trained together at Theological college and he is now an Anglican priest in Miami, Florida. When a Hurricane approached his parish a few years ago, the same feelings of helplessness surfaced. *What can we do?*. In response, he simply said this: 'Remember, continue to love God, and continue to love your neighbour.'

Love God, and love your neighbour.

And all will soon be well.

Jesus himself explains that this simple commandment, to love God and neighbour, is the greatest of all commandments.

Why? Because not only does it sum up the entire story of God's relationship with us, but it also points to the everlasting hope we have in Him. This is a God who loved the universe into being. This is a God who loved us, you and me, into being. This is a God who, in Jesus, ministered to those despised and rejected by society; through love. This is a God who, through love, conquered death on the cross. And, ultimately, this is a God who invites us to experience love. It doesn't matter how we see ourselves, how others see us, whether we think we are deserving or not, God invites us to love and be loved by Him. Then, we are compelled to share this love with those around us.

By loving God and by loving others, even in the simplest of ways, we can all help change the world.





RUSHBURY'S ARCHIVES: A WAY TO MEET AND GREET A REFLECTION OF OURSELVES



Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee will see the country celebrate between the 2nd and 5th of June this year. Keep an eye out for local celebrations and activities at Rushbury Village Hall during that period, as there will be something for everyone.

This great historical occasion will no doubt start a lot of reflection and trawling through memories recalling times past, so if your memory, like mine, can be a bit fickle over facts and what was actually going on so long ago, then thank the Records Trust & The History Group at Rushbury Village Hall who between them have collected and stored local historical information that would otherwise been lost. All their work has been achieved on a purely voluntary basis and at times is on display to the public through themed shows at Rushbury Village Hall. There are also AGM's, planning meetings and occasional talks by members, all details in the Parish Magazine. For more details on the groups ring 01694 771405. I was lucky enough to be able to arrange a visit to the Archives and have access to their marvellous, eye opening material. You will be enchanted and surprised at what you find, you will not be looking at items and testimonies from strangers, but at information that feels as if it is from a current neighbour you have not seen for a while. History and its interpretation may change, so might fashion, so might social graces or lack of them, but connecting us directly to the past are the people. L.P. Hartley in his novel The Go-Between came up with the memorable phrase, "The past is a foreign country, they do things differently there." That is true, but people are people as I hope to prove; even if some of us wore flared trousers in the 1970's and still regret it.

So why do I think Rushbury's Archives are a way to meet and greet a reflection of ourselves? Because of the 6 items I chose at random to look at. The wealth of information, the variety of subjects covered and those personal testimonies from the people who lived and worked around Rushbury are a unique treasure, but not just unique to this area, they reflect perfectly times gone by in villages across the United Kingdom. Let me give a few examples of what I found.

The oldest printed piece I found amongst the 6 random items was an edition of a newspaper called The Churchwoman from 1902, {see photo}. I think it was a national weekly paper as its price was 1 old penny, with a years subscription being 6 shillings and 6 pence, postage included. Our connection to this 120 year old publication is quite immediate with the familiar adverts for Hovis Bread and Dunlop Tyres, although the Dunlop Tyre advert puts tyres for Cycles first, then Motors second and sadly Carriages last. You will also find adverts for Cadbury's Cocoa and Beecham Pills.



Do the last 2 generations think they were the first to think of health foods?

Well, think again, as the splendidly named Pink's Jams proudly advertise themselves as purveyors of the finest jams with "No Artificial Colouring. No Chemical Preservatives." And who says that the hard sell is a modern phenomenon? Wait till you see the Advert for Aberystwyth proudly proclaiming to be "The Biarritz of Wales," without any sense of guilt! No Trading Standards Officers to worry about back then. And holiday suggestions also ranged abroad with an intriguing one offering a holiday apartment in Weimar, Germany. The paper also seems to be right up to date with an appeal from Westminster Hospital wanting £20,000 immediately. That is about 14 million pounds in todays money!

The personal testimonies, with some lovely handwriting, give a flavour of the needs, wants and worries that are not so far removed from our own and that thirst for modernity. The account that was written detailing how a relative climbed a hill in the 1850's so that they could witness history as the first steam train made its way to Shrewsbury. Some details are precious as they tell of working practices that must be very rare now, such as harvesting bark off trees for tanning. Measuring out a space using roods, which when I looked it up equates to 8 yards to one rood, or if you prefer 24 feet to one rood. What is that in metric measurements? I don't know.

The great use of animals in all aspects of life, especially farming are well documented, hinting at a way of life that took hundreds of years to perfect to get the balance right, but not forgetting the hard life for those that worked the land. Who amongst us does not get wistful at the sight of a team of horses ploughing the

land, immediately forgetting how early someone had to get up to feed and "clothe" the 4 legged "tractors" before any work could be undertaken. Staying in bed a little longer on a Winters day and only having to turn a key to start work has its attractions.

A 19th century court case caught my eye, as one neighbour sued another for "Criminal Conversation," which turned out to be an accusation of adultery with his wife. I think I am beginning to see a Victorian link here with covering up piano legs! Sadly there is no record of the lady's thoughts on the matter.

In amongst one folder there are a lovely set of photos and memories, some of it covering World War 1. There is a copy of a leaflet from The Board Of Agriculture & Fisheries entitled, "Type Of Horse Suitable For Army Remounts." It gives such advice as "Soundness in eyes, wind and limb is essential, no animal with worn upright or overshot joint and none with curbing hocks are passed." A piece of the British character here don't you think? We love our animals and the rules for animals to "join up" seem much more stringent than those applied to men wishing to volunteer for the Army in 1914. Even amongst the horrors of that war the British sense of risque humour was alive and well, so those of you with bare piano legs might want to cover them up before proceeding further. There is a postcard showing a soldier kissing a W.A.A.C. (Women's Army Auxiliary Corps) with the caption, "a lot of fellows in the Army chew gum-but some prefer W.A.A.C.'s."

Then there is the first Parish Magazine from January 1972 in black and white, but only a few years later on February 1978 you will find an edition with a coloured photo on the front showing a group of children happily playing with toys and not a computer screen in sight. But have no illusions, those children in 1978 were no doubt being told what the children on 2022 are told, "You have it too easy, not like in our day." Fashions change but not the woes and worries of life.

Finally there is splendid typed piece from an infant teacher at Rushbury School during 1950's. What a happy experience she had in Rushbury. She was only meant to lodge with a family in Wall for a short time while looking for permanent accommodation. But despite Wall having no electricity then she found such a warm welcome form the family she stayed with them until she left the area. She was obviously very well fed as her comment suggests: "the meals that followed in the years to come - and the inches." She obviously

talks a lot about the young children she taught and came to cherish them as she ends her reminiscences of them with the line, "Bless them all."

So there you have a very brief snapshot of what is in some of the Archives at Rushbury Village Hall, Shropshire. If you are able to view some of the collection when the Records Trust has one of its themed shows you just might see material from the past that makes you worry less about the future. I just hope I have done the Archives and those within it justice.

New online coaching service for people who struggle with reading

It's taken for granted that we all learned to read and write at school, however there are many local people who struggle with this essential life skill. Just imagine how your life would be if you couldn't read forms or letters, follow medicine instructions, or read a new recipe?



Free, confidential, one-to-one help

Read Easy Shropshire Hills matches up adults who want to learn to read with a trained reading coach and they work together through reading manuals, in private, at a time to suit them both. It's as easy as that and its free!

What's important is that everyone can learn at their own pace without feeling rushed. There's no pressure or targets or exams to worry about and no reminders of what it was like at school.

Before the pandemic all coaching sessions were held face-to-face in quiet locations such as cafes and libraries, but out of necessity we have had to find new ways to keep on coaching.

Online coaching, using Zoom, has been so successful and convenient for many reading pairs, that we have decided to use it to reach a much wider population. New readers are provided with a tablet if they don't have access to a computer. It is set up by Read Easy beforehand so it can be used without any computer knowledge or keyboard skills. However, Zoom isn't for everyone and for some of our readers coaching by WhatsApp or phone are better options.

We will continue to offer face-to-face coaching to people who would prefer to meet in person if there is a suitable local venue.

Jay Blades proves it's never too late to learn

Jay Blades, presenter of BBC's Repair Shop, finds reading a challenge. He concealed his inability to read until he was in his 30s, after he struggled to learn to read as a child and compares looking at words on a page to a 'book of ants'. Jay, 51, has been learning to read online with Read Easy in Birmingham and his story was shown on BBC TV earlier this year.








Shropshire Hills

Funding for farmers and landowners in the Shropshire Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

Launched last summer, the Farming in Protected Landscapes programme has so far awarded £176,529 to 14 projects in the Shropshire Hills AONB. The grants support one-off farming projects which deliver benefits to nature, climate, people and place.



Are there areas that are difficult or expensive to farm? Could these spaces be better managed for wildlife? Are there areas suitable for 'slow the flow' measures which help with natural flood management? Could repairs help to conserve an historic site or monument, or are there opportunities to interpret a site of interest and/or encourage appropriate public access?

We would love to see this funding used to deliver large nature, climate or access projects across a number of farms, and we are encouraging farmers and landowners to think beyond their boundaries. Example projects might be to work to restore an area of upland peatland and manage it extensively with cattle, or habitat creation and management for a specific threatened species.

Looking at your land in a different way can be a daunting task. A good starting point is to make sure you know what you already have in terms of good and potential wildlife habitat, historic monuments, or what public rights of way or watercourses cross your land? We can help with this, or you can access the information yourself on MAGIC maps, an online mapping tool, which highlights priority habitats, Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSIs), historic monuments etc

We will be holding a webinar in April to update farmers, landowners and land agents on the funding programme and answer questions - for more information on this please email shropshire.gov.uk. There is also lots of information about the funding programme on our website, including summaries of the projects which have been supported to date.

An Easter treat to make for you and your family/friends.

BIRDS NEST CUPCAKES.

These are really scrummy and well worth the effort. Ask a grown up to help.

As well as the cake ingredients below, you will also need:-Vermicelli(chocolate strands), mini eggs, cake cases and icing sugar.

Heat oven to 180 deg C/ 160 deg C fan/ gas 4.

In a large bowl, mix gently 170grams plain flour, 50grams cocoa powder, 250 grams caster sugar, I teaspoon baking powder and half teaspoon salt. Add 70grams butter spread and break up gently with a fork to look like breadcrumbs

In another bowl beat 2 large eggs and stir in 210ml (7 fluid ounces) milk. Gradually add to the dry mix and beat well. The mix will be quite runny. Put 12 cake cases into a bun tin and half fill each with your mixture using a spoon. Bake for 20 mins. Cool.

Decorate with icing. In a small bowl put a small knob of butter, a dessertspoon of cocoa powder and 1.5 tablespoons hot water (adult help here). Stir until butter melted and slowly add enough icing sugar to make spreadable icing.
