## Coronavirus

Covid-19 is still a real threat in the community and we'd like to remind villagers what to do if you find you have symptoms...

- Symptoms can include: a high temperature, a new or continuous cough, or a loss of / change of sense and smell.
- If you do have symptoms you and your household must self-isolate and stay home!
- Get a test if you have symptoms and the track and trace will contact you with further steps.
- You may also need to self-isolate if you have come into contact with someone who has tested positive. Normally this means two weeks of isolation at home but your family members can still go about their normal business.

We know this can be disruptive (especially if you've had to self isolate multiple times like our assistant editor!), but it is essential to stop the spread of the virus.

If you are 16+ we recommend considering downloading the track and trace app. Hopefully, with time and patience, we can get this virus under control.

#### **Merry Xmas**

The Parish Council would like to wish all residents a Merry Christmas. A celebratory Christmas tree has been placed on the Stanton Harcourt Green by your Parish Council please enjoy this special period whilst staying safe.

#### Oak Tree Planting

The Parish Council would like to thank those who provided oak trees, all home grown, and those who helped to plant the trees in front of the village hall and on the Jubilee field last week.

#### **Temporary Road Closure**

Road resurfacing is scheduled for the Main Road Stanton Harcourt between 14 December 2020 up to and including the 16 December 2020. This will operate between 08:00 and 15:30. The area on the map appears to show the Main Road approximately 50 meters before and after Steady's Lane. Access will be maintained for emergency service vehicles and for those frontages within the closure area.

Please note – Foiled wrapping paper and glittered cards cannot be recycled. Black bags, carrier bags, squashy plastic film or textiles must not be put in your recycling. Glass bottles and jars should be recycled using your black kerbside box

## **Expansion of Bartholomew School**

Consultation on the plan to extend Bartholomew School is underway.

The Eynsham Partnership Academy, supported by Oxfordshire County Council, now proposes the following changes to meet the needs of local population growth:

- Expand Bartholomew School from 1,300 secondary school places to 1,900 secondary school places;
- Achieve this by establishing a "satellite school" within the Garden Village development, which will accommodate Years 11-13;

• Extend the age range of Bartholomew school from 11-19 to 2-19, to include 3 forms of entry in primary provision, totalling up to 630 primary pupils and 120 nursery pupils.

#### **Additional Electrical Charging Points**

West Oxfordshire Council are installing electric charging points in some of their car parks. Initially they will be installed in Woodford Way, Witney; Back Lane, Eynsham; Black Bourton Road, Carterton; Hensington Road, Woodstock and New Street, Chipping Norton.

#### **WODC** support for local business

Local businesses in West Oxfordshire that are affected by the national lockdown are able to apply for a Support Grant from 16 November 2020 with payment expected prior to Christmas.

#### Sewage pollution of local Rivers

The campaign against the dumping of sewage in our waterways is gaining momentum. West Oxfordshire Councillors have backed a petition demanding action against the pollution of rivers with sewage by Thames Water.

## Potential Rail link Witney to Oxford

As part of the upgrading of Oxford Rail Station a new 16km, £260M rail link from Witney to Oxford is being considered. With an aim of reducing transport on the A40 and creating new transport options. The line would run east from Witney to Yarnton, where it would join the main line running south into Oxford.

#### Commemoration of the fallen

The Parish Council have worked with Hayfield, the developers of the Airfield site, to place a fitting memorial plaque on the site to ensure the origin of the site and those who lost their lives defending this country are not forgotten. The plaque will be installed on 14<sup>th</sup> January 2021

#### Village Volunteer Group

The Stanton Harcourt with Sutton Volunteer group is a Parish Council initiative run entirely by a large group of volunteers and exists to support anyone in need within our village. Prior to COVID-19 many villagers were helping their neighbours with a variety of tasks including local shopping, changing light bulbs or catching up over a cup of tea, this is simply an extension of the fabulous community spirit, in such unique times.

We are offering to help any villager in need, free of charge-post letters, walk the dog, collect shopping or prescriptions, etc. We are also happy to keep in touch by telephone if you are feeling isolated. We will simply do what we can to assist whilst following government guidelines.

If you need help, call any of the following numbers. You can leave a message any time or if you want to speak with someone call between 9:00 and 18:00 from Monday to Saturday, and they all have access to a large group of volunteers linked together via a WhatsApp group so can find the support your need.

# From the Festival Committee:



# **Village and Church Information Leaflets**

We have created two information leaflets for our villages.

# **Village Herb Beds**

The village festival committee have also funded (and dug) three small plots of herbs which we hope will brighten up the immediate area but primarily to provide a source of herbs for villagers to use.



All three beds contain Sage, Rosemary and Thyme and two also include a small bay leaf tree.

They are situated in the following locations:

- By the Green (behind the pillar box)
- Halfway along Blackditch (outside Long cottage and opposite Foxbury court)
- At the junction of Steady's lane and Main road.

Our thanks go to those residents living close to these plots who have agreed to water, prune and keep them tidy.

So, if anyone wants or needs a bayleaf, some rosemary, sage or thyme do help yourself!
