Heating

A response from Carnell Warren regarding the change to electric heating was discussed:

If there was a "move to a direct electric heating, with immersions and electric panel rads for instance there would be a saving for the installation, but the running costs will be high and we will not comply with building regulations as we will be making the energy consumption/CO2 production worse."

At the tender interviews and on other occasions, the group had been led to believe that the installation would be much cheaper and that electricity would likely to be comparable with gas. We also needed to be aware that, in the future, gas heating will need to be phased out. There was no mention of electricity making the energy consumption and CO₂ production worse, which would affect Buildings Regulations.

Since electricity is increasingly being generated by renewable energy, MK agreed to investigate further by contacting the department at RDC concerned with Building Regulations.
