The Skate Park Advisory Group (Chris Allen, Andrew Broadberry, Wayne Brooks, Jane Guest, Tom McGill, Rosie Scott and Claire Weeks) has been meeting since October 2016. The Fire Station has kindly provided room for the Group to meet. We would like to update you on our progress so far and let you know how you can support the project. Consultations have been carried out with many village groups and residents over the last 14 months to find how we can improve the Skate Park. We want to make it safer and more suitable for younger children on scooters as well as challenging for older users. We also want to improve the area around the new Skate Park and have already made a successful grant application for a new path around the Skate Park to Nottinghamshire County Council which has been matched by the Parish Council.

At the recent consultations at Collingham Show and the Co-op we showed three fantastic designs for a new concrete park from two different companies, Wheelscape and Freestyle. The design brief given to these companies was based on the feedback from earlier consultations. Visitors to our stand had the opportunity to view the designs in detail and vote for their favourite.

Further consultations (with the opportunity to vote) are being arranged with John Blow Primary School and other village groups over the next few weeks. The votes from all the consultations and the Facebook/Survey Monkey poll will then be counted up and comments made taken into account to decide which is the winning design.

The next stage of the process will be to obtain letters of support from as many residents, village groups and businesses as possible to support grant applications that will be made to national organisations. Letters of support are vital for grant applications to be successful.
