
Lorraine Lawrence, Charles Lawson and Helen Ranslev have been welcomed on to the committee.

'So they do say...!'

In the past few hundred years, people unexpectedly died during the night and though it was thought strange, it did not seem uncommon for this to happen without explanation.

Hedge cutting and general maintenance of trees was, and still is common for farm folks who in the past then burnt the branches both during the day and at night, to keep the house warm. They didn't realise that elder wood, when burnt, releases cyanide poison into the air. The

leaves, twigs, branches, seeds, and roots of Sambucus plants can contain cyanidin glycoside. The plant is considered toxic with the most poisonous parts contained mostly in the bark, leaves and stems.

Beechwood fires are bright and clear
If the logs are kept a year,
Chestnut's only good they say,
If for logs 'tis laid away.
Make a fire of Elder tree,
Death within your house will be...

uring the last year, improvements to the Hall have continued in that our Car Park, which was in a bad state and in urgent need of repair, has been completely resurfaced. The Hall Executive Committee have commissioned Mrs Fox of Elmsted as a gardener which has taken the pressure off those kind volunteers, especially Sheila, Jean and others, whom we thank for looking after the garden for many years. Thanks are also due to Paul and Robbie Boxall for keeping our windows and gutters in a sparkling condition and to John & Jill Argar for disposing of the Hall's rubbish. In October of last year, Oliver Block, who had taken on the cleaning of the Hall in 2015, handed in his notice. We are very pleased that Angela Dray, a resident of Hastingleigh, has taken on this role.

The Hall website continues to be

well used and provides users with easy access to bookings, the Hall calendar, etc. I should like to thank Shelley and Sue for their ongoing involvement with this.

I would also like to mention how pleased we were to see Bodsham School once again using the Hall for their Nativity Production last year. We hope that the School will continue to use the Hall for their Year 6 Leavers and Nativity productions long into the future. Another new regular user of the Hall is the "Bop Shop", a dance session for Mothers and Toddlers. This is run as a subsidiary of the Toddler Group and, by all accounts, is doing well. On the subject of the Toddler Group, we are delighted to hear that their numbers have increased considerably during the past year, to the extent that they asked the Hall for additional small chairs and tables, which the Hall with financial help from a local resident donor, were pleased to provide.

Our two main fund raising activities, the Christmas Bazaar and the Jumble Sale were, as ever, successful events. These, along with the regular Coffee Mornings, Whist Drives and Trevor Wye's Christmas Musical Evening, have helped to keep our rents as low as is practically possible.



Places or things that existed or have changed over time

Evington Mansion or Court later Evington House or Place

uring the reign of Henry III (1216-1272) the early deeds of this place mentioned that it was named after the Evington family. It came into the hands of the Gay family and then the Honywood family. (Hasted's History of Kent)).

An inventory of about 1585 gives its accommodation as (beds in brackets): Hall, Great Parlour, Little Parlour, Chamber over Hall (2), Chamber over Parlour (2), Chamber over Little Parlour (1), [? Mens] Chamber (3), Buttery Chamber (4), Hall Place, Buttery, Cellar, Kitchen, Larders, Back House, Out House, Brew House, Brew House Loft, Milk House and Wheat Loft.

Eventually it had to be replaced. Hasted, on page 311 of vol iii in his

first edition, says this, "... the church stands on a hill in the middle of [Elmsted] ... lower down in the bottom is Evingtoncourt, a good house of brick and sashed, to which the present Sir John Honywood has added much, and laid out the parkgrounds round it ...". The Honywood family occupied this property until 1900 when it was leased to the Earl of Guilford. The house and its estate was sold to Lord Ashburton in 1906. Leased to Lord Robertson c.1909. Sold to Sir William Crundall in 1916. Leased to Colonel and Mrs Irby. A Mr Richard Price later offered it for sale in 1935. Removal of the roof and partial demolition took place in 1938. The remainder of the house was later pulled down leaving only the brick-vaulted cellars.

Sir Filmer Honywood comments that the addition of a third storey, is believed to have followed damage by fire in 1812 in which Elizabeth Charlotte Honywood died (an infant daughter of Sir John Courtenay Honywood 5th Bt, and his wife Mary). I imagine that only urgent repairs were carried out

immediately, as the estate finances had been under official administration until John Courtenay came of age and following the death of his father. There is a memorial plaque to "The remains" of Elizabeth Charlotte in Elmsted Church.

St James's Church Fair which from early times was held there every 25th July. Demolished in the 1960s. Rachel Gibbs, nee Youard once of Elmsted Court in an earlier article remembered Mrs Sheddon the owner putting on plays there. John Argar remembers his grandfather saying that he played his fiddle there.

History enthusiast

The Ice House

Situated opposite the site of the demolished Evington Place on the side of the hill towards Bodsham. Probably used by the Honywood family as a cool storage place. Shown on the first edition of the 25" to 1 mile OS map of 1872 but was marked as disused on the 1898 map.

Sir Filmer Honywood comments that the Ice House was definitely in use by the family until around the 1890s when chunks of ice were placed in it during each winter.

Tithe Barn next St James's Church

Probably the site of Elmsted's

ECP Spring Fair

Farming Notebook

am pleased to report that, at long last, that we are progressing well with potato planting. Still a few days more to go but the end is in sight.

Although we started planting only a few days later than normal the extraordinary weather has intervened. After a damp April we then had a mini heat wave with soaring temperatures which almost baked the soil surface and made seedbed preparation a challenge. We started to plant and made the most of the conditions. All was going well until the "beast from the east" arrived. I have never seen anything like it.... Depending on where you happen to live, between 2 and 3 inches of rain fell in 18 hours. Everything stopped and it was all hands to the pumps, literally. Drains were inundated, the house started to flood, and fields developed large lakes. Fortunately, no lasting damage was done, and the fields drained quickly. The newly planted potatoes looked in a very sorry state. The soil had washed badly, even exposing the seeds in some places, and then the surface dried into a hard cap. The

hills were saturated and cold. Not an ideal environment for a seed potato! Soil temperatures in the baulks are rising and are now 18 degrees C at 150mm depth. Hopefully the seeds will now shoot and push their way upwards, through the crust, and emerge.

We lost a week because of the torrential rain and had to start from scratch creating suitable soil conditions. Recently planting conditions have been excellent and as a result I am happier with the later sown crop than the earlier ones. But we are now three weeks late completing planting.

With the improving forecast it was decided to mow the herbage seed for silage. There was a heavy crop from the very leafy grass. To improve the quality the crop was turned three times to help the wilting process. The bales have now been wrapped and stacked, and the field cleared. Nitrogen and some growth regulator will be applied as soon as I have a tractor available. The grass will now produce a seed (the last lehead in about three weeks' time and this will develop, self-pollinate, and produce the crop which we will harvest at the end of July.

Other crops are moving through their growth stages very rapidly. The oilseed rape has almost finished flowering and the small seed pods

are clearly visible. The winter barley in now in ear. And the winter wheats have their flag leaves af) fully emerged. The flag leaf is often referred to as the "engine room" of the crop as it is from here that all the sugars are produced which will fill the grains. The leaf has a much bigger surface area than any other leaf and is well suited to maximising the use of the sun's energy. We take great care of the flag leaf as any damage from disease can seriously reduce yield.

Spring beans and the spring oats are now growing well after a late start.

Calving has come to an end for now. There are a few cows who are not due until July.

All the cattle are now out on grass and looking very content. The calves have been de-horned (although many were found to be "polled" or hornless - a genetic trait that we think has come from the bull), double tagged, and, in the case of the males, castrated.

Over the next few days we intend to bring the cows into the yard to have a bit of a sort out. Some of the cows are not suitable to run with the bull again, for a variety of reasons. These animals, with their calves will

be moved to outlying fields, far away from temptation, for the summer.

As there is plentiful grass at the moment we have kept all of last year's heifer calves. A few are big enough, and are suitable replacements for the herd, to be able to run with the bull this summer. The rest will be kept together and have a further assessment later on. Some may be put to the bull in the winter with the Minnis cattle.

There is some irony that at a time of year when there is so much to do outside I have spent days and days locked in the office trying to fill in my Basic Payment Scheme forms on line before the 14th May deadline. It could be assumed that after 27 years of form filling under differing acronyms, Integrated Agricultural Compensation Scheme, Single Payment Scheme and now BPS, it would be routine. Lam sure it would be if Department of the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, the Rural Payments Agency and the Rural Land Registry didn't keep on moving the goalposts and changing the rules. In the last few years arable farmers have to meet target Environmental Focus Areas. These could be nitrogen fixing crops such as peas or beans. An easy choice for us. This year we cannot do this, but we can count hedges. The RLR helpfully provided maps on which were marked our hedges. Every

single field was wrong!! One 1.5 Ha field was split into eight parcels for no apparent reason. It looked like a shattered mirror! (It had been correct for 26 years!!!)

So, I had to apply for hedges, adjacent hedges, and trees in line, even ones that did not appear on the maps on the BPS forms. Then I have had to fill in a RLE1 form for each field with the correct hedges marked, wrong hedges deleted, and correct boundaries reinstated. With maps and forms together, the package was over 80 pages of A4 and had

to be sent as a small parcel! DEFRA have announced that they will process all RLE1 forms submitted before 11 July before they process the BPS forms. I still have not been paid for 2017 (due from 1st December 2017). There is not the faintest chance that anyone will get paid on time for 2018. Apart from spending 30% of the agricultural budget on admin, DEFRA probably will be fined for late payments. You really could not make it up.......

Now at least I can get back out of the office, and enjoy a glorious evening.
