**For all concerned: Exploration of alternative footpath/byway routes between Winterbourne Stoke and Berwick St James.**

**The hazard:** in 2023 there were minor accidents along this stretch of road.

Pedestrian and equestrian traffic has increased substantially with the opening of the campsite and an equestrian stable. Pedestrians can be tourists with little awareness of the road condition or speed of vehicles coming around the bends.

More equestrian activity now also takes place within and around Berwick St James.

Walkers must take the B3083 on a blind bend in a 50mph zone.

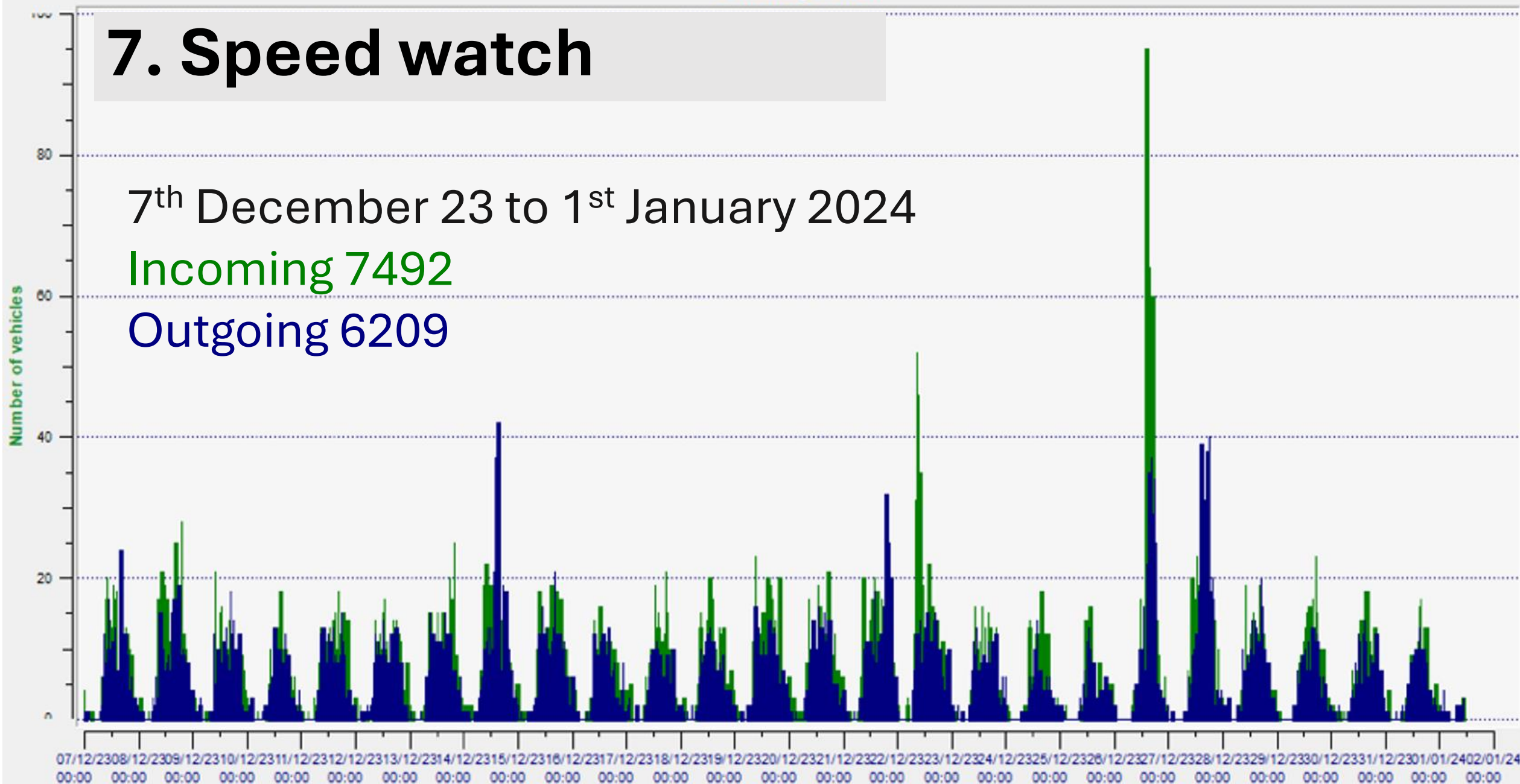

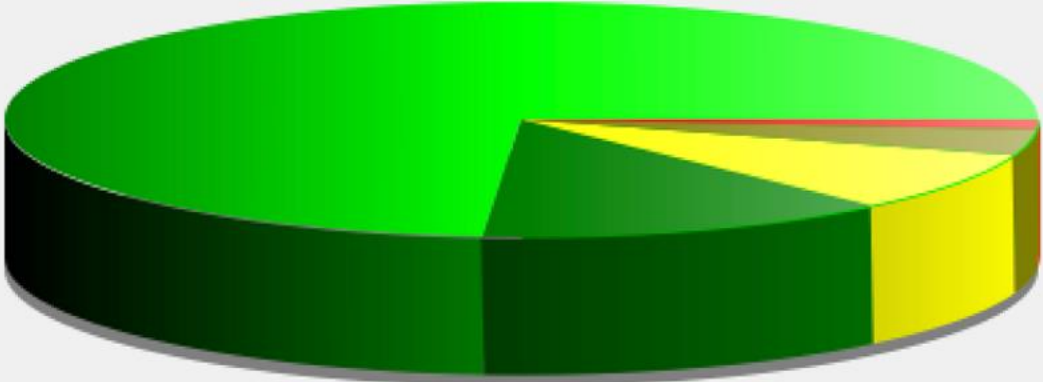

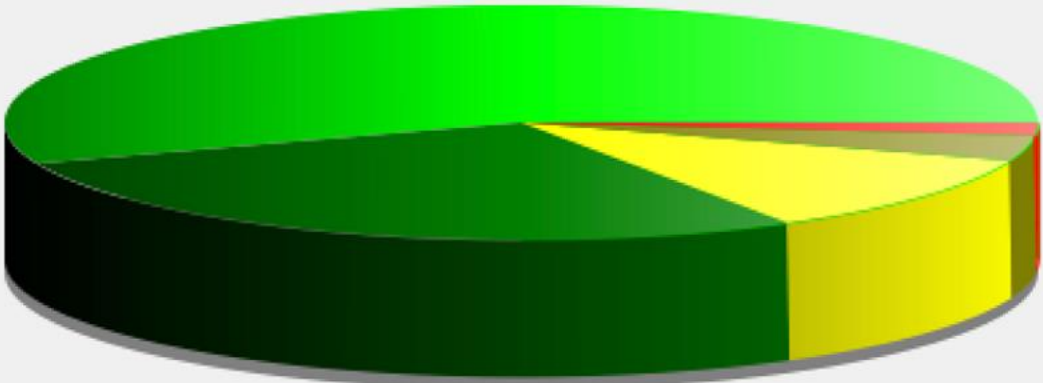
Vehicles distribution among velocity range
