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#### **5** | PUBLIC SESSION

- **5.1 Old House at Home developers' Appeal** Joanna Bell sought clarification on the current situation of the Old House at Home and the Appeal procedure. Everyone who previously objected to the application for change of use has been contacted about the Appeal and advised that any submissions to the Inspector should be made by 24th April.
- i. Red Oak Taverns has taken the opportunity to go to Appeal on 'non-determination' as the case officer allowed the case expiry date to lapse before he finalised his report.
- ii. It is understood the officer's recommendation is for refusal and his report will be available shortly. This will mean that BDBC will be also backing refusal at the Appeal.
- iii. The case officer will forward all responses originally submitted to BDBC to the Inspector.
- iv. Dale Ingram from Planning for Pubs continues to act on behalf of the Parish Council.
- v. Dale has requested the Appeal be assessed by Public Hearing.
- vi. Dale recommends that all those who previously commented, email to confirm their original comment, and may also include their support for a Public Hearing. All representations now go to the Inspector, not to BDBC. The Appeal will likely take eight months to conclusion.

**5.2 Potential for the pub's future** Should the Parish Council be successful in purchasing the Old House at Home, the Pub would be let as a Tenancy with the proviso the tenants live in as part of the agreement. The Parish Council would fund the purchase and renovation with a low interest loan acquired via DCLG who also now administer loans previously dealt with by the PWLB (Public Works Loan Board). The Parish Council can charge a reasonable rent as it needs to cover the cost of the loan and maintain the building, not make a profit. Low rent, no accommodation costs, plus refurbished premises, will all benefit tenants relaunching a business. The Parish Council has received several expressions of interest.

#### 6 COUNTY & BOROUGH COUNCILLORS

#### **Report from Ward Cllr Paul Gaskell**

- **6.1 Basingstoke Town FC** The chairman of Basingstoke Town FC, Rafi Razzak, is leaving the club, with plans for the Camrose ground to be sold for redevelopment. The club has agreed a provisional ground-share arrangement for 2017-18 with Farnborough FC.
- **6.2 FP 12** (From Old School Road by Foster's Business Park to A30 Country Hotel via Woodlands.) It is proposed the footpath will be diverted away from Woodlands following what may have been its original route to meet the track further from the house. Woodlands are supportive of the proposal to raise the level of the footpath using scalpings with possibly a membrane beneath.

AGREED: Work to be undertaken in the summer with mini-digger potentially using a grant from HCCCS and Lengthsman hours.

ACTION: Paul Gaskell to discuss with Footpath Warden Nigel Downes.

- **6.3 FP 4** (Barracks to A30) The footpath as installed by the Holdings, is now cleared beyond and navigable to the A30. (Note included top of the HCCCS priority vegetation cutting schedule.)
- **6.4 East of Basingstoke** and Redlands Draft Development Brief was recently consulted on and sets out guiding principles for development across both sites. The Brief and supporting documents are available on the BDBC website.

#### 6.5 Sewage Treatment Works

- Paul Gaskell reported works going well with three digesters, electricity generation and gas storage. A bund has been constructed and trees planted screening it from the footpath.
- Thames Water is trialing a substance that causes phosphate to coagulate so it can be removed fom the outflow, but with mixed reviews. Increased phosphate levels leads to sudden blooms of plant growth which quickly dies leaving areas of the river turning black with low oxygen levels.

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Richard Wilson reported increasing lighting from the sewage works and the incinerator lights always being on, contrary to the official line which says they are on only as needed. Paul suggested photographic evidence is needed.

#### 8 OLD HOUSE AT HOME

#### 8.1 Instruction to Dale Ingram

Approval received via email on 23rd March 2017 from Councillors Ann Blyth, Paul Gaskell, June James, Richard Wilson:

- i. To instruct Dale Ingram (Planning for Pubs) to continue to act on behalf of the Parish Council and represent the Parish Council at Appeal
- ii. to set aside £850 from 2017/18 Parish Council funds for this purpose.

AGREEMENT confirmed by all Councillors present.

#### 8.2 Offer for the Old House at Home

AGREED That an offer should be now be made for the Old House at Home.

It was considered that:

- i. Red Oak Taverns declined to enter into any negotiations to sell the pub in May 2016. Fluerets made it clear in documents produced on behalf of Red Oak Taverns in July and October 2016 that the Old House at Home was not then for sale. **SEE APPENDIX III.**
- ii. In their Appeal Statement at item 30, PlainView, on behalf of Red Oak Taverns, say that: 'No formal offer has been received from a member of the community or the parish council prior or during the application.'
- iii. As the case officer is recommending refusal, it may now be more attractive for Red Oak Taverns to consider selling the pub rather than have Appeal costs awarded against them.

AGREED To arrange a meeting of the OHAH Community Steering Group.

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#### 9 NEWNHAM GREEN

- **9.1 Maintenance** Green to be drag harrowed and rolled prior to mowing.
- **9.2 Posts** preventing vehicle access from Tylney Lane beyond Apple Tree Cottage.
- AGREED Six inch taper-topped oak posts as first estimate received not required. Posts need to be rural / in keeping and functional only. Five x 5', 3" fence posts, 3' out of ground sufficient.

#### 9.3 Access point onto the Green.

- AGREED to go ahead with constructing an additional access point onto the main Green from the junction of Tylney Lane with the gravel track serving the houses facing the Green (Quince & Well Cottages and Apple Tree Cottage). The access point to be wide enough for the mower but not wide enough for cars. Proposal is to lay shingles over a 12" plastic pipe, contained by oak boarding and covered with grass reinforcement meshing. Funded by grant from Cllr Elaine Still (see 7.4).
  - **9.4** Hook Fun Run 21st May. ACTION: Notice to go in the Villager requesting Marshalls.

### 10 | TRAFFIC / HIGHWAYS

- **10.1 A30 Baredown junction scheme** Implementation scheduled for May/June 2017.
- **10.2 Newnham Road culvert**s Highways employed a jetting company to clear culverts Newnham Road to the Green on 1th February. Awaiting report.
- **10.3 Lengthsman 2016/17** Used the last of the 2016/17 funding clearing grips and gullies in Blackstocks Lane up to the A30. Agreed to use Parish Council funding to finish clearing the ditch to the A30 and culvert mouth (£90 additional). **SEE APPENDIX IV.**
- **10.4 Lengthsman 2017/18** Schedule of works to be drawn up.
- **10.5 Rights of Way** See 6.2 and 6.3.

#### 11.1 Parish applications registered (since last meeting)

- <u>17/00619/FUL</u> (17th Feb) Land to the rear of Nately Place, Scures Hill. Erection of a six bedroomed detached dwelling with garage and revised access. *Parish Council Planning Statement and comments submitted not considered compliant with SS6 New Housing in the Countryside.*
- <u>17/00224/FUL</u> (1st Feb) Highview Business Park, The Barracks. Erection of one 2-bed, one 3-bed and two 4-bedroomed dwellings, with access and landscaping. Amended scheme to replace that approved at 16/00742/FUL. *Parish Council* 'no objection'.
- <u>16/03282/RET</u> (Amended 20th Jan, reg 15th Sept) Manor Farm, Blackstocks Lane. Continued use as a working farm with flexibility to welcome visitors for educational, leisure and therapeutic use (Class D1 and D2) throughout the year with ancillary tea rooms and associated car parking (retrospective). *No additional comment from the Parish Council*.

#### 11.2 Parish Applications pending

- <u>16/04600/HSE</u> (12th Dec 2016) Well Cottage, Tylney Lane. Erection of a single storey side extension and infill front extension, construction of front and rear dormer windows and installation of rooflights. *Parish Council comment 'no objection'*.
- <u>16/03850/FUL</u> (31st October 2016) Land Adjacent To Nately Towers, Scures Hill. Erection of a five-bedroomed dwelling with double garage and creation of a new access. *Parish Council Planning Statement and comments submitted not considered compliant with SS6.*
- <u>16/00097/OUT</u> (13th January 2016) Land Adjacent to Oakfield Farmhouse, Scures Hill. Outline application for three detached dwellings, including access. *Parish Council Planning Statement submitted (pre adoption of Local Plan).*

#### 11.3 Parish Applications granted since last meeting

- <u>17/00230/FUL</u> (21st March, reg 24th Jan) Nately Scures House, Scures Hill. Creation of a new access to serve new detached dwelling approved by planning permission 15/04234/FUL.
- <u>17/00143/HSE</u> (15th March reg 18th Jan) 3 Kingsbridge End, Old School Road. Conversion of loft to living accommodation with rooflights to the front and rear elevations.
- <u>17/00034/FUL</u> (2nd March, reg 5th Jan) Land Adjoining Scures Hill House, Scures Hill. Detached dwelling and integral garage (amended application replacing approved 15/04234/FUL).

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#### 11.4 Parish Applications - Appeal

- 16/02187/FUL (refused 1st Dec, reg BDBC 16th June) Nately Scures House, Scures Hill. Three x four-bedroomed dwellings and garages including new access onto the A30, and associated landscaping. Appeal seems not to be registered, but 'Grounds for Appeal' on BDBC website challenges the BDBC Guidance on the interpretation of Policy SS6(e) 'locally agreed need'.
- 16/01315/FUL (reg 20th March, reg BDBC 26th April 2016) Appeal ref APP/H1705/W/17/3169774 (22nd March) The Old House At Home. Change of Use A4 Public House to C3 Residential Dwellinghouse. Red Oak Taverns has pre-empted the case officer's decision to refuse by going to Appeal on grounds of non-determination.. Dale Ingram has requested on behalf of the Parish Council that the appeal assessment to be upgraded from the standard 'written representation' to a hearing. (See 8.)

#### 11.5 Hart applications

- <u>16/02243/FUL</u> Granted 15th Feb, reg 23rd Aug 2016) The Gate Of India, Oaklands, Hook Common, Hook. Change of use from Class A3 (Restaurant) to Class A5 (Hot Food Takeaway) and erection of a single storey extension to the rear with associated extraction and ventilation equipment.
- **11.6 BDBC Planning Survey** on 'Views of the Parish Council regarding BDBC's Planning Application process'. ACTION: to be completed and submitted by 7th April.

#### 12 PARISH ASSEMBLY

AGREED to hold Parish Assembly in May. No quiz this year. Subjects for discussion: Major topic will be Old House at Home. The Draft Housing Site Selection for the Hart Local Plan will be published by then; potentially the Baredown Scheme will be underway; plus Lengthsman, Bus shelters.

#### 13 FURTHER REPORTS

- **13.1 Gate at the end of Tylney Lane** To raise issue with tenant.
- **13.2 Broadband in Newnham Village** Considered Virgin won't lay cable to the village. BT provision is poor beyond the Green; 4G suggested as best alternative.
- **13.3. New field access** June James reported the additional field access from Tylney Lane to land separated for the new house, was not part of the original plans but advised by land agents and approved by Grish Lohani of Hampshire Highways.

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


# Appendix I ref 3.4 Local Policing

### Response to 'Hampshire Police and Crime Panel – Rural Crime 2017 – Proactive Scrutiny

The rural police officer is vital as a point of contact within his area - for residents and all organisations - to co-ordinate local knowledge and information for the purposes of deterring, preventing and enabling a speedy response to combating crime. This local engagement and effectiveness greatly improves relationships between the police and local communities and as such their satisfaction with the policing service they receive. Extending the areas of rural policing teams so their presence and effectiveness is diluted and their travelling time greatly increased is not efficient or cost effective. Increases in rural crime will lead to costs spiralling upwards and these costs are also borne by the victims of crime.

It goes without saying that it's vital for Forces to share resources and information – and have compatible IT systems. But this needs to be achieved without losing local interaction and knowledge, 'hearts and minds'. Newnham's local police officer attends our meetings and emails us when there are incidents, allowing us to communicate to the residents via social media, allowing the public to assist in looking out for suspicious vehicles etc. Any new policing structure should enable those such as PC Reid who provide excellent practice and effective policing to continue to work within it. Where rural policing is evidenced by so many to be working effectively then this is a lot to lose and very hard to replace.
