

# Notes from the Elkesley Parish Notes from meeting held on Tuesday 19 April 2022

Councillor Skelton chaired the meeting and there were 4 Councillors present plus Mrs Davies the Clerk, and members of the public

Apologies were received from Councillors May and Grounsell.

In the report from the Chair, it was highlighted that Parish councillors had spent approx. 45 hours on Parish council business during the month. He had also reported the pot holes on Park Lane to NCC through VIA who deal with the roads.

During the public session the following items were raised:

- It was mentioned there were also pot holes on Yew Tree Road. The chairman will report these.
- A resident suggested that a sand pit be constructed in the children's play area. He was willing to do this and provide the sand etc. at no cost to the village. This is to be discussed further at the next meeting.
- It was also reported that when Open Reach have been working on the boxes on High Street at the end of Yew Tree Road, they always leave rubbish behind. Despite this being reported and being told the matter has been dealt with and now closed, it is still happening. Councillor O'Brien will contact them again.

The Chair noted the contribution Mr Headland had made when he swapped his field for one the Parish owned, that is now the lovely field in Trust that is used for all sorts of activities. A minutes' silence was then held for Mr Headland, who recently passed away.

Bassetlaw District Councillor Kevin Dukes reported that the Garden Village proposed for Five Lane End has been withdrawn from the local plan. The travellers' site is also being withdrawn from the plan. Planning permission is required if they wish to stay.

Kevin Dukes then mentioned the Food Banks in Retford & Worksop. They are extremely busy at present and now deliver, using unmarked vehicles. If anyone knows of anyone who is struggling and may need help please let Councillor Duke know or contact a Parish Councillor who can the contact Councillor Duke.

The minutes of the previous meeting were agreed and signed, and Financial details were given and payments due were made.

It was agreed to use a payroll provider, to manage the staff wages payments.

Quotes are to be sought for a notice board at the cemetery, in order to display the statutory rules and regulations

A planning application to erect rear ground floor extension, front bay window porch & canopy at 43 Headland Avenue was discussed and no objections were made.

Further details regarding the celebrations for the Platinum Jubilee event were discussed. Games etc are to held on the field. Food and stalls in the village hall. As more events and entertainments are confirmed they will be displayed in village notice boards and on social media.

It was reported that quad bikes are racing through the village. The police are aware of this and are patrolling the village on a regular basis.

We were so happy to open our doors to parents for the last day last half term where they were invited to join our world-famous Elkesley Egg Rolling before a series of incredible musical performances and a celebration assembly; we cannot wait for the options the future brings now that we are able to join together once again.

On April 21st, we had an incredible opportunity: to perform in the Sheffield Utilita Arena in front of a crowd of thousands. We were joined by the street dance specialists, Urban Strides, who performed along to each song and our children learnt choreographed moves to perform along with them; the beatbox collective, world team champions, taught us how to beatbox and gave us the opportunity to sing along to one of their performances; we sung along with strictly come dancing's Nick Shirm; We performed alongside the signer-songwriter, Twinnie and alongside CBeebies' incredible saxophonist YolanDa Brown. The children formed part of the young vices choir and, along with thousands of children from other schools, harmonised to perform eleven songs. ## Gamston with West Drayton and Eaton Parish Council Notes from the 14th April 2022 Meeting

April saw the first Parish council meeting of the year to be held back at Gamston School.

#### 1. Open session

Mr. Rider informed the Parish Council that the EVIAG were piloting a new App called Speed Cam Anywhere enabling the user to share data with the police to help reduce speeding. He also gave an update on the progress they were making on 20's Plenty with NCC and other bodies.

### 2. Meeting

The Chair welcomed the new Clerk, Mr. Knox to the Parish Council along with two new Councillor's who were co-opted during the meeting, Mr. R Harding and Mr. G Davis. Which means the Parish Council now has a full contingent of Councillors.

The Council proceeded to attend to matter raised on the Agenda in the normal manor.

### 3. Planning

Two applications were discussed with no objections to either.

#### 4. Highways

The Council were updated on various matters raised with Notts County Council Highways and Bassetlaw and it was agreed that these will now be escalated through County Cllr Ogle who unfortunately was unable to attend this meeting.

In other matters the Council were informed that the recent speed tubes on Main St had not been put there by the County Council as part of the ongoing efforts to address speed through the village, although they did receive confirmation that Via were intending to their speed tubes down after the Easter Holidays as part of their traffic survey.

## 5. Defibrillators

Replacement parts for the defibrillators in Eaton and Gamston are on order, and the current estimated delivery date is the end of May. Once these parts have been received and fitted and the defibrillators are back in service the council will contact a training provider to arrange a refresher course on how to use one for anyone in the parish who wants training. The Parish Council will give further updates on this nearer the time.

## 6. Neighbourhood Watch Scheme

The council agreed to register as a Neighbourhood Watch Scheme covering the five villages within the parish. A number of residents have already shown an interest in joining so if you would like to please contact the scheme coordinator at pc.dramsden




