Broseley Neighbourhood Plan

In the New Year the Neighbourhood Plan process will move into the policy-making stage. We are still gathering views to help us create those policies and over the next two months we will be consulting businesses in the town. There will also be a separate consultation on housing and other development. Information about both of these will be placed on the Neighbourhood Plan section of the Broseley Town Council website, and on notice boards in the town.

The housing development consultation should gather a wide range of views as a result of the publication of Shropshire 'preferred sites' consultation document. This list includes two sites in Broseley, off Coalport Road and Barratt's Hill. The list does not mean that planning consent for housing is certain on these sites, but if these are not the best sites for Broseley, then people need to make their voices heard, both to Shropshire via its consultation, and to the Neighbourhood Plan Advisory Group. To assist with that process there will be a public meeting on Tuesday January 29th at the Social Club, High Street, Broseley, starting at 7.30pm. Town Council Infrastructure Projects

In November, contractors working on behalf of the Town Council completed the first phase of a project to improve the drainage on Birchmeadow Park. The second phase of this work will take place next Spring, at the end of the football season. This work is being paid for by the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL), a fund to which developers of new housing contribute to allow local amenities to be improved. The Town Council is also hoping to use this source of funding in future to extend and improve the town's cemetery. Separate from these projects, the Town Council is working with Shropshire Council and others on a plan to upgrade the Town's street lighting to LEDs and to replace some street lamp columns.
