

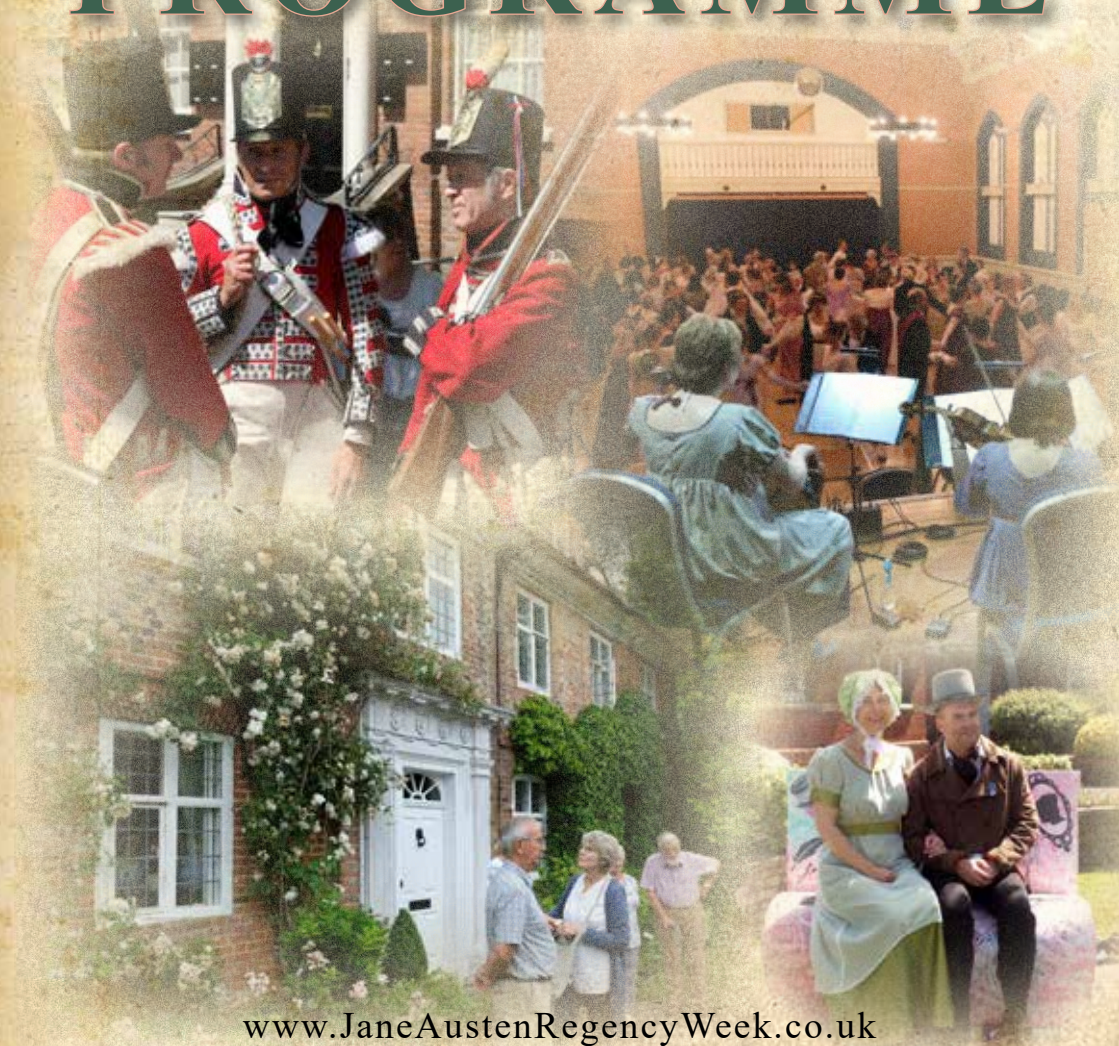

The highly-rated St Lawrence church organ was built in 1866 by Henry Speechly at a cost of £850. In 1966 it was completely restored but retaining most of the original 1866 pipework. Shortly afterwards the Alton Organ Society was founded in 1967.

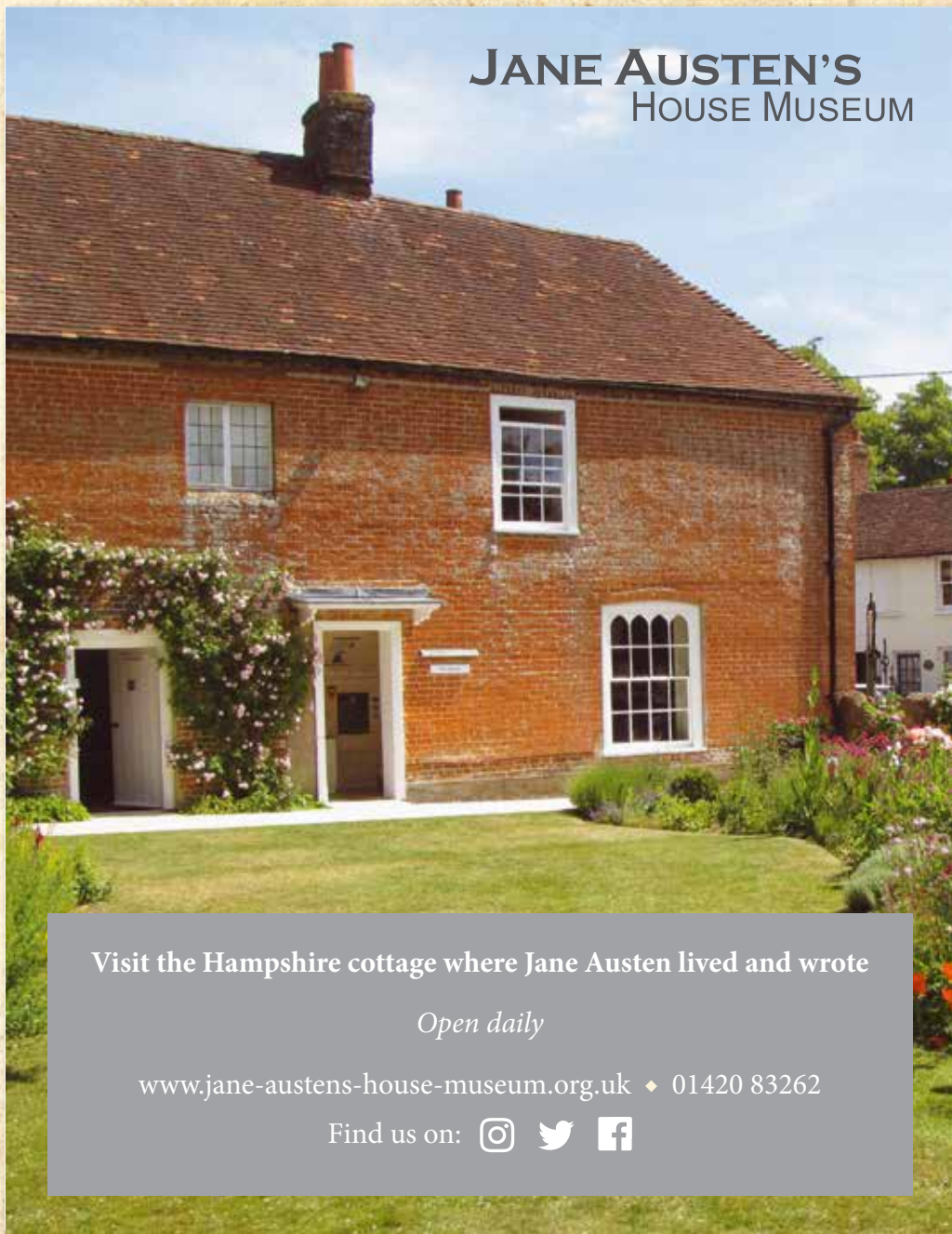
