

VILLAGE HALL NEWS

At our AGM last month Barbara Pearce tendered her resignation from the management committee and so, as we were already one person short of our full complement, there became two places to be filled on the committee for the year ahead. Happily, Jon and Angela Thompson volunteered their services and have brought us up to full strength again. So the committee now comprises myself, Carol Hulm (Secretary), Robert Turner (Treasurer), Sue Burch, Sarah Cutbill, Stefania Graziola, Margaret Neaves, Barbara Pearce, Sandra Pilborough, Jacky Simmons, Jacqui Thompson and Jon & Angela Thompson.

Jon and Angela quite recently moved into the bungalow beside the field where our outdoor events are customarily held and have readily agreed that we can tap into their water and electricity supply for our fete on June 6th. We thank them hugely. Clearly they are going to be a great asset to the village!

At the AGM I presented my report for the year just past. Here's a brief summary:

The regular hirers of the Hall continue to be Headcorn Morris, the Gardening Club, The "Dazzle" drama group for children, Sue Burch's Yoga class, the Bowls Club, the Parish Council and the Church. We have also succeeded in attracting more occasional hirers than in previous years, which has increased our letting income a little.

The main social events we organised were a treasure hunt & barbeque; our traditional Christmas quiz and, most recently, a Greek meal with Greek dancing and belly-dancing. The Committee also assisted again with the running of the Harvest Supper. These events, plus a 'Phil The Bag' fund-raiser and a generous donation from the organiser of the Christmas Craft Fair, have helped us maintain a financial surplus.

However, the decision (taken last year) to remove the coin-operated electricity meters is having a more detrimental effect on our finances than we expected, because the free availability of heating has led to hirers using more. So we are not only losing meter income but also incurring greater usage charges - and the early signs are that last year's increase in letting fees will not bridge the gap, as it was intended to. Consequently, an increase in the rate next year cannot be ruled out, I'm afraid.

This year, we continued to use what surplus funds we had to improve the Hall's facilities. We have installed a larder fridge in the kitchen and have also replaced the broken cooker with a larger new one. This has made catering in the Hall very much

more practicable. Our secretary, Carol Hulm, has also developed a website for the Hall, which is now live.

And our next event? Well, the revival of the village fete, of course, on June 6th – of which much more elsewhere in this magazine!

Grafty Gourmet

This is a great Summer Dessert, and as usual, so simple to make.

White Chocolate & Strawberry Mouse Cake

175g digestive biscuits
75g butter, melted
400g white chocolate
400g strawberries

300g tub full-fat soft cheese
200ml double cream

1. Crush the biscuits with a rolling pin to fine crumbs, add the melted butter and mix well. Tip the mix into a 20cm lined, loose-bottomed cake tin, smooth with the back of a spoon and put in the fridge for 30 minutes.
2. Melt 375g of the chocolate in a microwave or glass bowl set over a pan of simmering water, then allow to cool slightly.
3. Take out 6 strawberries and set aside. Blitz the remaining strawberries in a food processor until smooth, then add them to a bowl with the soft cheese and cream. Beat until really smooth and thick, then stir in the melted white chocolate. Pour on top of the biscuit base and smooth the top. Place in the fridge and chill overnight.
4. Halve the reserved strawberries and place on top of the cheesecake. Melt the remaining 25g chocolate and drizzle over the top, then keep chilled until ready to serve.

WHAT IS DROPBOX?

It's an easy way to store and share photos, documents, spreadsheets, and other types of computer files, using a PC, tablet or mobile device.

Dropbox works by keeping identical copies of selected files on your computer(s) and Dropbox's cloud-based storage system, and **automatically synchronizing** them over an encrypted Internet connection.

Examples of how Dropbox can be used:

- To share a folder full of documents with co-workers, so they can work on spreadsheets and other documents together.
- Back-up photos taken on iPhones, without using cables. Once the Dropbox app is installed on the phone, the photos and movies taken with the phone are automatically transferred to Dropbox's Camera Uploads folder, which can be accessed immediately on a laptop or any other PC or device that has Dropbox installed.
- Instantly back-up files that you are working on in Dropbox. If your computer crashes, they can be easily recovered.

Besides automatic syncing, another advantage of Dropbox is it follows the same conventions that people already use to save files, create folders, and move stuff around on their computers. This means your Dropbox data will always appear in the familiar "My Computer" (Windows) or Finder (Mac) on your computer.

Dropbox is a great collaboration tool. It's easy to share links to folders or files, or give permission to other people to modify files. For more information and to download the application, go to: <https://www.dropbox.com/>
