#### **Grafty Gourmet**

This is a great comforting dish idea only these cold nights. Layers of pasta sheets, meat and spinach are topped with gooey, melted cheese.

#### Chicken & Ham Lasagne

6 skinless chicken breasts 1/2 medium onion, sliced 2 bay leaves 200ml white wine 100g butter 100g plain flour 500ml milk 140g sliced smoked ham, cut into strips200g young spinach leaves225g no pre-cook dried lasagne sheets (about 20 sheets)200g ready-grated mozzarella25g Parmesan, finely grated

1. Put the chicken breasts in a medium saucepan with the onion, bay leaves and wine. Pour over just enough water to cover, around 200ml. Put a lid on top and bring to a gentle simmer. Poach gently for 15 mins or until the chicken is just cooked. Transfer the chicken to a board and strain the liquid into a jug.

2. Melt the butter in a large non-stick saucepan over a medium heat. Stir in the flour with a wooden spoon and cook for about a minute. Gradually add the milk, a little at a time, stirring well between each addition to ensure the sauce stays smooth. Once all the milk has been added, stir in the reserved cooking liquid and continue cooking for a further 2-3 mins. Adjust the seasoning to taste. Heat oven to 180C.

3. Cut the chicken into small chunks and stir into the saucepan. Add the ham and spinach and cook until the spinach has wilted. Spoon a third of the chicken mixture into the base of a 3-litre lasagne dish (about 26 x 18cm). Top with a third of the lasagne sheets. Repeat the layers twice more, ending with lasagne. Scatter the mozzarella and Parmesan on top and season with black pepper. Bake for about 25 mins or until the lasagne is tender, the topping is well browned and the filling hot.

#### Parish Council Update

An Extraordinary meeting of the Parish Council was held on the 20<sup>th</sup> December. This meeting was called to decide the next steps on the proposed traffic calming scheme in Grafty Green. After careful consideration of the comments received from residents on the draft scheme, it was decided to explore the options arising from consultation with KCC Highways before drafting a revised scheme. Specifically, the Parish Council agreed the following next steps:

- Cllr John Collins and Cllr Robert Turner will meet with KCC Highways to explore the options following consultation and obtain advice on which options are acceptable and which are advisable
- Cllr Galton will use the results of this discussion with KCC to prepare a drawing setting out a preferred option
- The Council will then deliver a note to all houses explaining the revised scheme
- A public meeting will be held to present a revised scheme and seek comments before Easter
- An Extraordinary Council meeting will be held before Easter to make a final decision on a scheme before asking KCC to take this forward
- It was resolved that a decision on a preferred scheme would be taken before the Council elections in May 2020

The Extraordinary Council meeting agreed a Parish Council break even budget for 2020/21 and a precept request to Maidstone Borough Council of  $\pounds$ 5,581. Which means the Boughton Malherbe portion of the Council Tax bill will once again be unchanged year on year.

Finally, the Council has received the resignations of Councillors Annie Allum and Cathie Brown. It has been agreed that, as the Parish Council elections take place in May 2020, the Council will not seek to fill the vacancies before the elections. The Council thanked Annie and Cathie for the contributions they have both made to the work of the Parish Council.

As there will not be sufficient Councillors available, it has been agreed to cancel the next Parish Council meeting due to be held on the 20th January.

# SOHL ("Save Our Heath Lands") say NO,NO,NO to 5,000 houses on your doorstep ....

Maidstone Borough Council ("MBC") has proposed a new Garden Community on the doorstep of Lenham which will blight the area and see the loss of our precious countryside forever (900+ acres). If you live in Lenham's neighbouring communities including the Stour Valley and think this development does not affect you, then you should think again.

The demand on our already creaking infrastructure will be irreversible. Our roads, public transport, doctors' surgeries, hospitals, waterways, sewerage, internet, parking availability and other basic services will be impacted and the delays will significantly disrupt how we all go about our daily lives.

If the Council forces this proposal through, the essential infrastructure needed to support an additional 12,000 people, such as the M20 junction, wouldn't be built until 2035 at the earliest . As things stand the proposals will commence with our current roads and infrastructure and this can only lead to further traffic and increased pressure on our local amenities and public services. The council has been so secretive about this development, you cannot help but ask why?

MBC's recent "call for sites" invited landowners to submit sites for possible development consideration. 334 sites were submitted. In the parish of Lenham 19 sites were submitted which could result in a possible 7,000 new homes being built in the area. In neighbouring Harrietsham, 15 sites were submitted with a possibility of over 800 new homes. Lenham will feel like a 'Dormitory Town' compared to its current size. Our beautiful surrounding villages such as Egerton, Platts Heath, Boughton Malherbe, Charing Heath, Charing, Harrietsham and the Stour Valley will be severely affected. Eventually, after the development floodgates have opened, some villages will in effect merge together as one.

If this proposal goes ahead then we will face a further 20 years of construction (or should that be destruction?) Our lives and properties will be blighted. Lorries will pound our roads day in, day out. Diggers will be moving earth with a constant drone of noise and vibrations reverberating across our villages.

Maidstone Borough Council say they are required to increase house building according to a formula produced by National Government. This relies on an outdated population growth estimate from 2014. Why are our elected representatives not challenging this?

Please join us by putting pressure on our elected Borough Councillors to:

1) Lobby National Government and ask them to revise their housing calculation to a level that is sustainable. House building needs to be in the right place for the people that require it. The countryside should not be turned into a dormitory town for London.  Rectify Infrastructure issues currently blighting Maidstone Borough residents, to enable it to cope with the housing increases which have already been accepted. Only when this is achieved should new housing be considered.

It is our intention to unite our local communities and speak as one 'voice' to oppose the Council's plans to develop the Garden Community in the parish of Lenham and challenge its housing strategy.



#### **Grafty Geeks - Google Family Link**

#### Overview

Whether your children are younger or in their teens, the Family Link app lets you set digital ground rules to help guide them as they learn, play, and explore online.



Not all screen time is the same. Help your child make healthy choices about what they do on their device, with activity reports showing how much time they are spending on their favourite apps.

#### How it works

- The Family Link app from Google helps parents stay in the loop as their child or teen explores on their Android device, and lets parents set certain digital ground rules for their family.
- First, a child/teen will need a compatible device, then, parents can start by downloading Family Link onto their own device (Android or iPhone).
- If a child/teen already has an account, Family Link will walk their parent through linking their account to their child's account. As part of that process, the child/teen may also need to download the Family Link (Child/Teen) app on their phone to complete the process of linking the accounts.
- Parents can also use Family Link to create a Google Account for their child under 13. Once complete, children can sign-in to their device with their new account.
- Once the accounts are linked, parents can use Family Link to help them do things like keep an eye on screen time and manage the content they use.

#### **Compatible Devices**

**For kids and teens -** Family Link runs on Android devices running version 7.0 (Nougat) and higher. Devices running Android versions 5.0 and 6.0 (Lollipop and Marshmallow) may also be able to run Family Link. See our Help Centre for more details.

**For parents** - Parents can run Family Link on Android devices running versions 5.0 (Lollipop) and higher, and iPhones running iOS9 and higher.


