<u>Grafty Garden Cuttings – May</u>

One and a half inches (38ml) of rain, overnight - wonderful. It has given my poor, newly planted yew hedge a good watering and me the chance to spoddle about in the ditch, hooking out piles of leaves and twigs threatening to block the system and cause a minor flood. And we even have a waterfall, which these days is a very rare event, plus the ground makes that sizzling sound if you stamp hard, which is yet another rare event. My husband can remember digging potatoes here and washing the mud off them in the water lying between the rows and that at the top of the garden, but that was some 40 years ago !. We were, it seems, lucky not to have this precipitation as the snow that many others experienced.

Hopefully things will warm up and by the end of the month, bedding, baskets, runner bean, marrow, courgette and squash plants etc, can all go outside. Cover with cloches or have fleece ready, just in case.

Keep an eye open for pests and diseases and deal with them early. I have found vine weevil beetles and grubs, which can be squashed, or if in containers, the soil can be spread out for the birds to pick over and the plants re-potted, or treat with Provado Bug Killer. Aphids in small numbers, can be rubbed off, treated with a biological control, or especially if in huge numbers, sprayed with a chemical (if one is not an organic gardener), when the best method is to encourage the blue tits into the garden. They do a grand job.

Early flowering shrubs can now be trimmed into shape and lawn care and maintenance should be in full swing. This is the first year for many that we have not had to mow until April, but no doubt the grass will grow away and make up for that with a vengeance, once it sets its mind to it.

To return to the major issue of water: I see from the Kent Messenger that the hose pipe ban (at least the regulations in force as I write), says we can fill as many watering cans as we like, to water our lawns - please do not waste time, energy and water on the lawn, unless it is very recently laid turf, or newly sown, use it on other parts of the garden, for grass will almost always recover, after a drought, where trees and shrubs may not. And as we can still hose down our cats and dogs, why not stand them on a bed or boarder for the job and kill two animals with one wash?

Remember, it is far better to water very thoroughly occasionally, rather than little and often and spraying over the leaves is really a total waste of time, for most of it evaporates before reaching the roots.

Maidstone Borough Council urges residents to stay calm but vigilant about bird flu

Maidstone council urges residents to remain calm but vigilant after tests on a dead swan in Fife, Scotland found the H5N1 strain of bird flu.

Residents should contact the Department of the Environment Farming & Rural Affairs (DEFRA) helpline on 08459 335577 if they find any of the following:

- Dead swans
- · Dead wild fowl ducks or geese
- · More than three dead birds of the same species
- · More than five dead birds of different species in the same location

Keepers of poultry with more than 50 birds kept for commercial purposes are required to register their flocks with DEFRA. It would also be useful for anyone with fewer than 50 birds to let DEFRA know on 0800 634 1112.

Sian Murphy, Environmental Health Manager at Maidstone borough Council said: "Maidstone council has a contingency plan in case of an outbreak in the borough and is working closely with DEFRA and other partners across the local authority area."

Message 1

SCAM!!!

If you receive a card through your door from a company called PDS (Parcel Delivery Service) saying that they have a parcel awaiting delivery instructions, and can you contact them on 0906 6611911. **DO NOT** call this number as this is a mail scam originating from Belize. If you call the number and you start to hear a recorded message you will already have been billed £15 for the phone call.

If you do receive a card with these details, then please contact Royal Mail Fraud on 020 739 6655.

Message 2

Sheds are an easy target for thieves, especially as they are often not alarmed, and generally hold very expensive garden tools etc. You can purchase a versatile alarm from most Police Stations which can be easily fitted to the inside and will make an audible noise if the shed door is forced open.

Message 3

A theft occurred in early April whereby an open backed vehicle was suspiciously parked on Headcorn Road Grafty Green whilst the driver stole from a local farm, if you see a vehicle parked which you do not recognise please take the number and either phone the Police or me on 858350. It may be innocent; it may also be about the steal from you or your neighbour.



Yes, you may not know yet, but it won't be long before summer is here and "The Four Church Walk" will be here again.


