

<p>Public Participation</p> <p>One of the members of public asked about the current situation of the Emergency Plan. There is to be a meeting about this on 12/11 in the Museum meeting room in order to put a support system in place. The member of the public also asked if it is yet known when “superfast broadband” will be live in the village? Fibre to the cabinet is now in place in Amage Road and will then be taken to the houses through the copper line.
