Look two, one's going, one's gone

Have we all been busy watching the Olympics and Paralympics Olympics? We in the belfry gave them a 'send-off', on Friday 27th July as per the directive from London. It requested that all bells should be rung at 8-12 a.m. on that day for 3 minutes, to celebrate the commencement of the Olympic Games. As we only had 3 ringers available, and the ringing duration was so short, we decided to toll the bells instead of going through the arduous task of ringing up the bells. It takes more than three minutes to ring up any way, and a further two minutes to ring down.

3 Ringers present, Jayne Rose, Larraine Dickinson and myself at 8-05a.m. (Philip Thomas having seen us arrive at All Saints, he came to investigate). Suddenly Philip arrived making 4 ringers (he had been on holiday, unexpectedly returning home sooner than we anticipated). With a brief instruction to Philip what we had decided regarding tolling, 8-12a.m. arrived and away we went. It turned out to be a toll-a-thon from our point of view. Fingers strained through pulling the sally continuously for 3 minutes, turned out to be more strenuous than ringing in the conventional manner, I think we deserved a Gold Medal before the games had even started.

For those of you who are thinking of ringing for the next Olympic Games, a bit of advice, don't do as we did, ring properly.

From my original enquiry regarding the fitting of bearings to our bells, Taylors of Loughborough surveyed the bells submitting their report and recommendations. This being passed on to the Parochial Church Council for their consideration. The P.C.C. applied to the Diocesan Advisory Committee for a Faculty. In a reply to this application, Mr. Mick Exton the bell and frame fitting advisor to the Diocesan Advisory Committee made further recommendations. A further P.C.C. meeting was held at All Saints to discuss with Mr. Exton and Mr. George Dawson of the Advisory Committee Mr. Exton's recommendations. These proposals now have enabled the P.C.C. to proceed with further quotations before re-submitting the faculty application.

We are now back ringing on Monday evenings. We have had late summer recess lasting 3 weeks and are thoroughly refreshed. Anyone wishing to join us will be made most welcome, if you are game for a laugh in between ringing sessions, then the place to be is in the ringing chamber at All Saints, Practice commences after a verbal warm-up session at 7-00p.m. It's quite cosy in the belfry. It will be when I get a new everlasting gas cylinder. Now the nights are getting a little bit nippy, the new gas cylinder is becoming a priority.

By the time you read this we will have had the company of the Church Mouse at the Harvest Thanksgiving Service on Sunday 23rd September. The service is due to be held at 11-00a.m. A full team is booked to ring at 10-30a.m. Following the service is the Harvest Thanksgiving Lunch due to be held in the Village Hall, (thinks, I must set the recorder for the Singapore Grand Prix)

2012 Trent Valley Adventure

11 blokes, 4 days, 3 nights, 147 miles, 11 pubs, 2 punctures, 1 curry & no injuries

The sun shone on the righteous and Harby Mountain Rescue Team from 6th to 9th September, as eleven cyclists enjoyed glorious sunshine and a favourable breeze for the sixth annual Harby Mountain Rescue Team Adventure, from the source of the River Trent back to Harby. Unfortunately, an 11th hour rib injury to Matt Tucker reduced the 'dirty dozen' to eleven and an early start on day 1 saw the bikes loaded on to George Dickinson's trailer as Alan Tucker and Caroline Nolan dropped us off at Biddulph Moor. Roughly following the River Trent, mostly on National Cycle Network routes, the cyclists enjoyed mixed terrain and warm weather for all four days.

The elusive source of the River Trent was eventually located as a spring in a muddy field on Biddulph Moor and a team photograph was taken to record the momentous occasion.

The afternoon of **Day 1** began with a descent from the spring on Biddulph Moor, through Stoke-on-Trent with stops for lunch in Ford Green and last-minute supplies in Hanley, where a Google camera car passed us, so we expect to be on Google Streetview sometime soon. We left Stoke along the Trent & Mersey Canal to The Star at Stone for afternoon refreshments, then on to the famous Essex Bridge over the Trent at Great Haywood and more refreshments at The Clifford Arms. The absent Pete Smithson would have enjoyed the scenic view of Rugeley B Power Station from the Premier Inn and dinner in The Stag's Leap.

John Mawer started **Day 2** by leading us on a couple of warm-up laps of the roundabout next to the hotel before what seemed like an endless 200m climb in 3 miles through Cannock Chase, before descending to Lichfield on route 54. After a couple of hours looking round Lichfield

Cathedral and lunch at Nether Stowe, we pressed on to Alrewas and enjoyed over an hour at the marvellous National Memorial Arboretum. After a mad dash across the busy A38, we picked up route 54 again to Burton-on-Trent, punctuated by refreshment stops at The Royal Oak and the Blacksmith's Arms. A brisk evening walk from the Holiday Inn to The Devonshire Inn was followed by an excellent curry at Balti Tower and slightly less brisk walk back.

Day 3 started with a non-stop 17-mile run on route 54 before a breather at the former station at Mickleover, then on to Derby for lunch and some sightseeing. The afternoon was a steady ride on route 6, through Long Eaton with eleven 99 ice creams at Attenborough Nature Reserve before following the River Trent and the Beeston Canal into Nottingham. Everyone had worked up

a tremendous thirst so we spent an enjoyable hour or so at Ye Olde Trip to Jerusalem before a rather chaotic ride to the Swan Hotel at West Bridgford, followed by food and beers at The Trent Bridge Inn.

With a late kick-off, Matt and Tom Tucker collected the panniers just before 10.00am on **Day 4** so we enjoyed a luggage-free ride along the Grantham Canal towpath, the old A46 to Bingham and route 64 to Newark, before refreshments at The Lord Nelson at Winthorpe.
