Why a survey?

- The Parish Council represents the village, and we hoped a survey would give us another way of gaining parishioners' views.
- We receive finances from the Precept collected from your Council Tax and we receive money from CIL Community Infrastructure Levy. https://www.gov.uk/guidance/community-infrastructure-levy. This is a levy collected from new development and can be allocated and distributed on specific projects. In order to allocate this, we need to have some priorities.
- We wanted some feedback on how we are doing as a Parish Council.
- This presentation is the report in terms of the answers that could be counted within the survey
- Bold type face indicates that more than a quarter of respondents supported an item, underlined items were supported by more than half of respondents.
- Results do not include free-text comments and ideas which will be made available when these have been fully analysed.

How does village maintenance need to be improved

- Footpaths & bridleways need more regular maintenance 72 supporters
- Riparian owners to more regularly clear stream, PC to take action 58 supporters
- Improved verge cutting needed 48 supporters
- PC should clear both banks of stream along its full length -37 supporters
- PC should supplement DC footpath & bridleway cutting -32 supporters
- Improved weeding/sweeping of pavements & car park bays -25 supporters
- Verges in village to be left wild and uncut -24 supporters
- Improved road sweeping is needed -21 supporters
- PC should supplement DC verge cutting -20 supporters
- No improvement needed 9

More popular possible new projects

- Parish Council to take on ownership of the Village Hall playground and fund this through the Council Tax precept. 50 supporters
- A level and mown grass verge footpath from Mallards Green to Monkey Jump 46 supporters
- Add picnic tables and additional benches to the Village Green, 41 supporters
- Extra waste bins in the village, 41 supporters
- Extra benches in the village, 38 supporters
- Permanent Christmas Tree on the Village Green, 38 supporters
- Parish maintained flower beds, 37 supporters
- Parish Council organised annual barbecue, 35 supporters

Less popular possible new projects

- An ornate village sign on the Village Green, 29 supporters
- Wooden sheep on the Village Green, 27 supporters
- Electrical facility for mains illumination of Christmas Tree, 24 supporters
- Picnic tables and benches in the Washing Pool area, 17 supporters
- Wooden sheep near the Washing Pool, 17 supporters
- Permanently fixed cycle rack on Parish Garage wall, 12 supporters
- A drinking water bottle refill point ,11 supporters
- A beacon brazier on the Green to light on special occasions, 8 supporters

Introducing soft traffic calming measures

- Reinstate volunteers for Community Speed Watch, 41 supporters
- Locate village boundary signs in sight of the village with planting and mown verge, 38 supporters
- Cut the village southern verge shorter to give a sense of place, 33 supporters
- Plant low growing shrubs on verges to give a sense of narrowing, 31 supporters
- Installation of village gates, 30 supporters
- None of the above 16

Dealing with planning applications

- There should be no further houses built until the sewer is improved, 75 supporters
- Housing estates must have a minimum of 35% properties held at an affordable, low rent in perpetuity, 59 supporters
- An occasional house on a brownfield site should be supported, 56 supporters
- Houses on greenfield sites should not be supported, 52 supporters
- The PC should develop a formal Neighbourhood Development Plan, 52 supporters
- A new housing estate should not be supported, 43 supporters
- A new housing estate with 10 plus houses should be supported, 26 supporters
- The Parish Council should develop an informal development strategy, 17 supporters

- Communicates effectively with villagers, 36 of 128 agree
- Improves the village, 31 of 128 agree
- Provides allotments to villagers, 28 of 128 agree

What the PC does well -2

- Comments on planning applications effectively, 26 of 128 agree
- Is transparent in all their actions, 24 of 128 agree
- Represents the views of the villagers, 23 of 128 agree
- Spends funds wisely, 20 of 128 agree
- Works effectively with Dorset Council to ensure all areas of the village are well maintained, 18 of 128 agree
- None of the above, 16 of 128
- Has a clear strategy for the future of the village, 2 of 128 agree
