A NEW YEAR MESSAGE, from the Rural Dean - Application Refused.

The story is told of a Parochial Church Council seeking by advertisement a new priest. The following letter was received by the Churchwarden of the parish.,

"Dear.....

Understanding that your parish is vacant, I should like to apply for the position. I have many qualifications that I think you would appreciate. I have been blessed to preach with power and have some success as a writer. Some say that I am a good organiser. I have been a leader in most places to which the Lord has sent me.

Some folks, however, have some things against me. I am over 50 years of age. I have never preached in one place more than three years at a time. In some places I have left town after my work caused riots and disturbances. I have to admit that I have been in prison three or four times, but not because of any real wrong-doing. My health is not good, although I still get a good deal done. I have had to work at my trade to help pay my way. The churches I have preached in have been small though located in several large cities.

I also ought to tell you that I have not got on too well with the religious leaders in towns where I have preached. In fact, some of them have threatened me, taken me to court and even attacked me physically. I am not too good at keeping records and have even been known to forget who I have baptised. However, if you can use me, I shall do my best for you. I hope you will consider this application carefully and prayerfully."

The Churchwarden read this letter to the PCC and asked them if they were interested in the applicant. There was uproar. Those present said that such a person would never be suitable for their church. They were not interested in any unhealthy, contentious, trouble-making, absentminded ex jail-bird - in fact, they felt insulted that his application had

been presented to them, and he was certainly too old. Then, out of interest, someone asked for his name. The Churchwarden answered, "The Apostle Paul."

As this New Year begins our prayers in the churches of West Bridge Deanery are with those parishes in the Stone Street Group with all their hopes and expectations as they seek under God, a priest to share in collaborative ministry with Richard Bateman and Paul Filmer. May he or she, be a person of faith, wisdom, vision and prayer with a pastoral heart and true love for people.

We all have hopes and expectations for 1998 in our family and working life, for our parishes, deanery and diocese. There are adventurous times ahead. May God be with us, as we support each other in ministry.

Our Lay Chairman, Pauline Round joins me in wishing you a very happy and peaceful New Year.

It has always been my intention in these pages to reassure and inform residents of the actual reality of crime within the Area.

As a police force we are continually striving to reduce crime in the Weald area but I am constantly reminded of instances where a little thought could have prevented the crime.

People need not be forever vigilant because the incidents of crime are small but basic security should be automatic.

Burglaries are a major worry to most people yet almost 100 burglaries occurred last year where the criminal didn't even 'break in'! The door or a window was open. Thefts from cars also provide easy pickings. Why do people leave handbags, wallets etc. in clear view of everybody passing their car. Why make it this easy?

£12,000 worth of pedal cycles were also stolen and the thief had only to ride it away. The cost of securing ALL these cycles would have been less than £400. Simple steps could have saved much misery.

On a positive note, though a quarter of all house burglaries fail because the resident did take simple precautions. The criminal was left to look for easier pickings elsewhere. I would ask all residents to look at what steps you could take to secure and protect your property. It needn't cost a lot, maybe just locking your doors, but you could stop yourself from becoming a victim. If you are unsure of what you can do, then contact your local Neighbourhood Watch or PC Terry Wright on 01233-619111. There are a number of leaflets with good simple advice readily available. The Weald police together with your help have reduced crime by nearly 2000 during the last year., That is 2000 fewer victims!

Each victim is one too many so let's continue working together to make this area even safer than it already is. The Weald is the safest area within Kent and Kent is one of the Safest places in the country, let's keep it this way.

Together we are making a difference.

CANTERBURY CHORAL SOCIETY - A JEWEL IN OUR MIDST.

Never underestimate what is on your doorstep. Canterbury Choral Society may be local but it has an increasingly illustrious reputation.

Having Canterbury Cathedral to sing in is a good start - it is difficult to think of a more glorious setting.

Having a conductor of international repute, Richard Cooke, is also a tremendous advantage. Not only is he an exciting musical director but also he has the contacts to secure first-rate young soloists, often before they become well known.

The Society has been going for nearly 50 years. It offers a varied programme of popular and less familiar works in four concerts per year at Canterbury Cathedral.

Canterbury Choral has always presented the finale of the Canterbury Festival and in recent years has also sung regularly in France: Verdi's Requiem in Boulogne, The Messiah Part 1 in Rouen and both Britten's War Requiem and Mahler's 8th Symphony in Lille with the Orchestre National de Lille. The 1997 Mahler was also sung to a packed Royal Albert Hall in London. Their C.D. recording of The Ultimate Last Night of the Proms last year made the Classic FM Top 40!

Richard Cooke has been conductor since 1984. He was a chorister at St. Paul's Cathedral and then a King's College, Cambridge, under Sir David

Willcocks. He was conductor of the London Philharmonic Choir between 1982 and 1991, and has worked with many of the world's finest conductors and orchestras, as well as conducting his own concerts.

HYMN WRITER OF THE MONTH

The hymn writer remembered this month needs very little introduction. John Henry Newman. b London, m 21 Feb.1801. d 1890.

HYMN:ll7. Praise to the holiest in the height, and in the depth be praise: in all his words most wonderful, most sure in all his ways.

John Henry Newman is perhaps best remembered with John Keble, Richard Froude and Edward Pusey as one of the leaders of the Catholic Revival within the Anglican Church, known as the Oxford Movement. For Newman, though, this was but the beginning of his journey which led from his beloved Oxford into the Roman Catholic fold and to the eventual founding of the Birmingham Oratory. He became a Cardinal in 1879.

Newman was one of the great preachers of his day. However, within a busy life his literary endeavours produced two novels as well as poetry, which he commenced writing from an early age. One hundred and nine of his sacred verses appeared in 'Lyra Apostolica', an anthology published in 1836. He also produced a number of translations of ancient Latin hymns, and thirty four of these were eventually brought together in 1853 entitled "Verses on Religious Subjects'. One of the Latin translations appeared in 1861, the first Full Music edition of Hymns Ancient and Modern - 'Come Holy Ghost, Who ever One' - but dropped in the current edition. Others have been used in Catholic hymnals.

Although the prime purpose of his poetic output appears to have been for reading, not singing, editors of hymnals have drawn on a small number and, in current Protestant hymnals, three survive. The first is, 'Lead kindly light, amid the encircling gloom', (No.215) an early outpouring written in June 1833 aboard ship for England - a Mediterranean tour with Froude who was suffering from tuberculosis. During the latter part of the tour, and having left the main party, Newman also had a bout of serious illness. It was then that he came to a fresh realisation of his calling and the task that awaited him in England. 'Lead kindly light' was

written out of that experience. The verses we sing formed the opening stanzas set to a tune by John Dykes. The hymn was popularly received. The second hymn is 'Firmly I believe and truly' (No.ll8) which, after an earlier publication, appeared in 'Verses on Various Occasions' in 1865. This volume also included the poem 'The Dream of Gerontius' from which the third hymn 'Praise to the holiest' (ll7) is taken. The poem describes the journey of the disembodied soul of Gerontius as he makes his way towards paradise. At one point he hears an angelic choir singing, 'Praise to the holiest in the height'. Within three years of the publication of the poem the hymn appeared in the 1868 appendix to Hymns A. & M. set to the rousing tune by John Dykes, and still sung to this day. Elgar set much of the poem to music in 1900 as an oratorio for chorus, soloists and orchestra.

The hymn is associated closely with Lent and Holy Week. But its sentiments go beyond the seasonal since it describes God's love and God's plan for humanity seen in the earthly ministry of Jesus. As the hymn says, in Jesus was 'God's presence and his very self, and essence all-divine'. This pivotal truth is celebrated whenever and wherever Christians meet for worship
