

The September outing to Headcorn/East Sutton Vineyard was an entertaining, such an enjoyable and informative tour of the vineyard with the added bonus of tasting their delicious wines.

Their Wines

- Sparkling, usually 80% Pinot Noir with 20% Bacchus, East Sutton Vine Garden is the only vineyard in the world producing this as a sparkling wine, with dramatically good results.
- Still White, with Bacchus as East Sutton Vine Gardens leading still wine, often with a small percentage of Reichenstiner giving a good balance but flavourful white wine with great keeping characteristics. They have wine from their first vintages in the early 90's that is still good today, utterly unheard of with white wines.
- Red Wine, having had a superb but small vintage in 2011 they have made a red Pinot Noir for the first time, results are not known as yet but they have great hopes.

Their Cider

- Locally produced medium and dry cider this has proved very popular with both existing and new customers and is sold in the shop together with their tasty wines and which is open Thursday to Sunday.

News from Helen Whately - Your MP

It's back to the whirl of Westminster after the summer recess and I've been getting stuck in. A new Prime Minister at the helm of a new Cabinet, means there are fresh opportunities to shape the Government's agenda.

With that in mind, I called a House of Commons debate on fly-parking – lorries parking in inappropriate places – to push sorting this problem out to the top of the Roads Minister's to-do list. As people living in parts of Kent know, trucks fill every lay-by, line up on the hard shoulder of slip roads, crawl onto the verges of country lanes and tuck themselves away in housing estates. None of these places have facilities for drivers, so as well as the problem of huge HGVs parked on the roadside, there's also littering and fouling of verges and hedges with human waste. Residents nearby are understandably upset, and it's pretty bad for the drivers themselves.

So we need more lorry parking spaces in Kent. The Government has committed £250 million for a new lorry park at Stanford West with space for 3,600 trucks, to provide a desperately needed alternative to closing the M20 for "Operation Stack" when there is disruption at the Channel. This will be an enormous relief for residents and businesses across Kent, especially those who live near the motorway. To make the most of this investment, there's surely a strong case for making the lorry park available for overnight parking of HGVs outside of Operation Stack.

I made these points in the debate and afterwards the Roads Minister, John Hayes, committed to looking into how many more lorry parking spaces are needed and how they can be made available. He also wants to do more about litter on roadsides – a particular problem along parts of the M20. I'm looking forward to taking him up on his offer to meet me and other Kent MPs as well as councillors and hauliers to thrash out some concrete solutions.

Helping people who've been handed a raw deal in life is one of the reasons I wanted to be an MP, so I was delighted to host a jobs fair with Maidstone Jobcentre recently. This event was particularly about helping people who are struggling to get into work but could find their lives transformed by a steady job and an income. At the same time, it was a chance to support several local businesses looking for staff.

Over 500 job-seekers, mostly from Shepway and Park Wood but also the wider area around Maidstone, came to meet more than 30 employers. There was a real buzz in the room as candidates sought out opportunities to fit their skills. Afterwards I heard that several candidates had been offered jobs, which was a great result. I also spoke to one job-seeker from Ulcombe about her challenge looking for a job, made harder by not having a car. This highlighted the extra difficulties for people living in rural villages, and afterwards I spoke to the Jobcentre about transport support and how they might be able to help her.

Of course the biggest issue facing the country at the moment is Brexit, and how to build a successful future outside the EU. I'm keen to get a sense of how you feel about the big changes that are on the way, so I've been knocking on doors over the summer asking people what they're looking for in our new relationship with the EU, and how Brexit will affect them personally.

My priorities for Kent remain the same - improved transport, fair school funding, better healthcare, supporting local businesses and protecting the countryside. But I want to hear from people in Malherbe, so that I can make sure your views are represented in Westminster. If you're reading this please do get in touch and tell me what matters to you. Grafty Gourmet

If you are a lover of coconut, this one is for you. The curry flavour works wonders with the coconut and the toasted almonds add that extra flavour and texture to this great dish.

Coconut Chicken

4 tbsp of sunflower oil	1 tbsp of ground turmeric
4 chicken breasts, skin on	1 tbsp of Madras curry powder
4 medium potatoes, cut into 2cm cubes	2 cinnamon sticks
2 onions, peeled, chopped, then blended in a food processor to a paste	175ml of chicken stock
3 garlic cloves, peeled, finely grated	1 x 250ml carton of coconut cream
5cm piece of fresh ginger, peeled and finely grated	1 x 400ml can of coconut milk
	250g of peas

To serve

50g of flaked almonds, toasted
A handful of chopped fresh coriander leaves

1. Preheat the oven to 200C. Heat two tablespoons of the sunflower oil in a frying pan over a high heat. When the oil is almost smoking, add the chicken breasts, skin-side down. Fry for 2-3 minutes, or until the skin is golden-brown, then turn the chicken breasts over and fry for a further 2-3 minutes, or until golden-brown all over.
2. Transfer the chicken breasts to a roasting tray and roast in the oven for 10-12 minutes, or until completely cooked through. Remove from the roasting tray and set aside on a warm plate.
3. Boil the potato cubes in salted water for 10-15 minutes, or until tender. Drain well and set aside.
4. Heat the remaining two tablespoons of sunflower oil in a deep-sided pan over a medium heat. Add the blended onions and fry for 8-10 minutes, stirring regularly and adding more oil as necessary to prevent the onions from sticking to the base of the pan. Add the garlic and ginger, and continue to fry, stirring frequently, for 2-3 minutes.
5. Add the turmeric, curry powder and cinnamon sticks, stir well and cook for a further 1-2 minutes, or until the spices are fragrant. Pour in the stock, coconut cream and coconut milk. Bring the mixture to a simmer. Simmer for 18-20 minutes, or until the volume of liquid has reduced by about a half and the sauce has thickened.
6. Add the cooked potato cubes and peas and return the curry mixture to the boil. To serve, divide the curried potato and pea sauce equally among four serving bowls. Top each with one of the reserved chicken breasts. Sprinkle over the toasted almonds and coriander leaves.

WINDOWS 10 – OneDrive


OneDrive is free online storage that comes with your Microsoft account. Save files there and be able to get to them from any PC, tablet, or phone. It is also a very good and guaranteed back-up for your documents and pictures.



The basics

To save a doc on to OneDrive, select OneDrive folder from the list of save locations.

To move files to OneDrive, open File Explorer and then drag them into a OneDrive folder.




No Internet? No problem.

Files saved to OneDrive are available online at OneDrive.com and offline on your PC. That means they can be used anytime, even when not connected to the Internet.

When reconnecting, OneDrive updates the online versions with changes you made offline.

Note: These files are synchronising, so if you delete any from either location (OneDrive or PC Documents), they will be removed from both locations.



Stay in sync

File Explorer icons show you the sync status of your offline folders and files.

 It's in sync with online version.  It's getting in sync.

 The version on your PC is out of sync. To find out why, go to the right side of the taskbar, select the **Show hidden icons** arrow, press and hold (or right-click) **OneDrive** , and then select **View sync problems**.

Carriageway Repairs in Your Area

Road Surface Treatment

Coldbridge Lane, Boughton Malherbe, Maidstone

When we plan to carry out the work and how long it will take

This is to let you know that, as part of the on-going maintenance and improvement of the highway network, Kent County Council will be treating the surface of Coldbridge Lane, from the junction with Lenham Road up to Coldbridge Farm entrance.

The surface treatment work will be carried out on **6th, 7th and 10th October, 2016** and will take approximately **4** days to complete. This work will be carried out between 7:30am and 7pm. This type of work can be affected by bad weather, so if it is not possible for us to carry it out at this time, we will arrange a new date and let you know via a letter drop to your home. We will also put up signs along the road before we start, showing the date we plan to start work.

What we plan to do.

We will use a product called 'Micro-Asphalt' to treat the road. Micro-Asphalt is quick to apply, which means less disruption to road users, residents, local businesses and the emergency services. It is a cost effective way of prolonging the life expectancy of the road before any major repair works are required. It also benefits from having a low carbon footprint.

Micro-asphalt is applied cold, in fluid form directly onto the existing road, in two 8mm thick layers, that seal the surface to prevent water penetration, restore texture and improve skid resistance. The first layer is rolled in order to achieve a compact surface on which to lay the top layer. The top layer is not rolled as we want the stones to remain proud of the bitumen whilst it cures to give texture to the new surface; this influences skid resistance and durability. The action of a roller would push the stones deep into the bitumen, which is why we rely on the movement of vehicles, which are much lighter, to aid the embedment of the stones.

The finished surface will look quite coarse, uneven and rough immediately after laying, but will improve during the first 4 – 6 weeks of use by traffic, as the material beds in. The laying process may result in the fluid splashing slightly up the kerb face; this is normal and will weather with time. Generally within seven days of completing the works the road markings will be reinstated and within 3 weeks the ironworks (road drain covers, manhole covers, etc.) will be adjusted to suit the new surface. BT covers are excluded from our works, as these are normally raised by BT themselves, but this may not be carried out until a few weeks after the completion of our works.

How can you help?

During these essential works, it will be necessary to close Coldbridge Lane completely (between Lenham Road and Coldbridge Farm) so that we can carry out the works safely for both the workforce and road users. An alternative diversion route will be signed while

the road is closed via Coldbridge Lane, Barhams Mill Road, Southernden Road, Southernden Road (Headcorn) and Lenham Road (And vice versa). Any pavements will remain open at all times.

It is inevitable that residents and businesses near the works will experience some disruption, but we will try to keep this to a minimum. Access to properties will need to be restricted for short periods while work is carried out in front of each property. If you have any particular access needs, please let the workforce on the site know.

We need your help to make sure the work is done as quickly as possible and to the best possible quality. If your vehicle is usually parked on the carriageway, please make sure you park it somewhere else away from the site whilst the works are carried out, so the road is clear for us to resurface.

Speedwatch There have been 4 sessions of late, usually a 2-hour stint, and between 10 and 21 speeding cars were logged. More sessions are needed, Cllrs Collins and Galton volunteered to help.

Highway and Footway Matters

Liverton Hill – the fire hydrants were done last week. The bottom of the Hill has been resurfaced and water runs right through the resurfacing. Cllr Turner to ask Sue LaPorte if the whole Hill can be resurfaced as some routes in neighbouring parishes have been done.

Ditches, gullies, potholes - the gully outside Homestead is still blocked – so badly that the camera couldn't go through it. Also blocked outside Maples where they overflow when it rains.
