- 2 x large football pitches but these are rarely used simultaneously
- No junior football pitches
- Only 1 x tennis court
- Pavilion building has limited flexibility
- Limited amount of conventional play equipment, located at the northern end adjacent to the backs of residential properties
- Located on higher ground and with a only few large trees, the space can feel exposed and windswept
- Space not intensively used and opportunity now exists through the neighbourhood plan to consider ways to reinvent the space for a wider audience

- 1 x junior football pitches (a more useful, more popular size?) and 1 x retained senior pitch
- Tennis retained in current location
- 2 x new children's play areas using natural materials and new gradients and slopes
- New more flexible pavilion building in same location as current building
- Slopes can provide vantage point for watching football
- New central social space and a stronger tree belt across the middle section of the site
- Opportunity to increase biodiversity through use of timber materials, selected planting of new flowering species and creation of new slopes and gradients

- More conventional children's play area adjacent to residents
- Opportunity to increase biodiversity through use of timber materials, selected planting of new flowering species and creation of new slopes and gradients
- Scheme becomes wilder, more open and more natural from north to south
