Reporting a suspicious website

Many will be aware of the speedy ways you are able to report suspicious emails and text messages.

As a reminder:

- Suspicious texts can be forwarded to 7726 (it's free and alerts mobile providers)
- Suspicious emails can be forward to report@phishing.gov.uk

But what do you do if you come across a suspicious website, maybe one you think is trying to scam you?

You can report those websites online at ncsc.gov.uk and the National Cyber Security Centre will investigate.

How to report fraud and cybercrime

If you are a victim of cybercrime or fraud, you can report the matter to Report Fraud online at reportfraud.police.uk or by calling 0300 123 2040.

If you think you have lost money or given out sensitive financial information to scammers, immediately alert your bank. Call them right away to inform them of the

suspicious incident. You can quickly reach many UK banks' fraud departments by calling 159.

Parish Council News

We have had two meetings since the last Messenger and here are some notes about items that were raised.

We have regular reports from both our Country and District Councillors and thank them for keeping us informed. SHDC reminded us that the Garden Waste collection fee for the next 12 months is now due if you use this service. Do this online or by calling SHDC.

South Hams District Council advise us that SSHD apprenticeships are now available, and if you know of young people who might be interested, do suggest they investigate this avenue to full time employment with pay

during training! Their website also has up-to-date information on business rates.

Follow-up meetings after the January gas outage have highlighted like weak links between SHDC and the people on the ground like Parish and Town Councils, and the role of communications with the designated Community Hubs like Malborough Village Hall. However it was agreed in all the meetings that our hall and our excellent facilities had played a large part in helping Wales and West Utilities deal with the work as efficiently as they did. We were also congratulated by having entertainment for the guys on their break on the Sunday by way of the M.A.D panto rehearsal!

The Parish Council are also upgrading their emergency plans, and though we hope Malborough never experiences a flood, we could well have another power upset or other major emergency sadly.

One problem that the guys encountered was that in many cases they were unable to access holiday and second homes, particularly in Salcombe. Although formerly most holiday homes were let through agencies who were contacted, nowadays many are let privately and there is no complete list of contacts. If you have a second home near you please mention what could occur if nobody knows their details, and ask them if they would let you hold this information on their behalf until an alternative list is set up, which is one of the possibilities mentioned. Meanwhile it is recommended that all vulnerable people are registered with the Priority Services Register – read about this in this Messenger.

The MYC (Malborough Youth Cub) continues to have a regular group of young people who come together on Friday evenings generally in the Village Hall Annexe with Sharon Annis and her helpers. Currently they are on their Easter holiday but will return to weekly sessions from April 24th. Call Sharon on 07711 314810 for more information or if you could help!

Finally it is good to hear that the cycle path clearance was appreciated by all that use it and that the Alston Rise path has happened at last, though in this case there is some remedial work and landscaping still to be done.

Priority Services Register

Are you of pensionable age, have a long term disability, a child under 5 or use electricity for medical equipment?

These are some of the reasons why it is suggested that you are on the Priority Service Register. In this way the utility companies will know that you are vulnerable in the event of a gas outage or power cut.

Those on the PRS receive prior knowledge of any planned power interruptions etc. In the case of the recent gas problems in the village, these customers were among the first visited and supplied with heating appliances, warm packs and in some cases hot meals, which no doubt were greatly welcomed.

It is easy to register for this scheme by going online and we do suggest you consider it a must for your vulnerable friends and neighbours – please encourage them to do so by accessing the website at theprs.co.uk.

National Trust South Hams Centre

As a result of our fundraising events in 2025, we have been able to donate a total of £4,950 to Overbeck's Garden and to the English Riviera and South Devon NT rangers, supporting various projects including tree planting and bridge building. Also, to Coleton Fishacre, celebrating their centenary with a new bench.

Our recent talks have both been well-supported by members. In February we were delighted to welcome back local author and historian, Roger Barrett, with another excellent presentation on two great events in the history of the Kingsbridge Estuary. A couple of weeks later, following our AGM, Ian Trought gave a very interesting talk about his "journey" from RHS Wisley to Overbeck's where he

became Head Gardener on 1st January 2025. Ian also described some of the new projects that have been undertaken in the gardens, highlighting what has been made possible by recent donations from the South Hams Centre. We look forward to following this up on 14th April when we have arranged for a small bus to take us up to Sharpitor.

Members have now received the new summer programme, which includes six coach trips and a cream tea in Kingsbridge. Visiting gardens has proved popular recently, so we have arranged a couple of trips in springtime this year. For the coach outing in mid-May we are going to Cornwall, with visits to Tamar View Nursery and East Down Barn, a privately owned, award-winning garden near Menheniot. The continued wet weather through winter meant a lot of the projects have run behind, as it's been too wet to drive on the fields, however spring flowers are well underway with primroses, red campion, bluebells and wild garlic bravely flowering amongst the huge temperature ranges through March.

UK British Butterfly Monitoring Scheme at the beginning of April, surveying weekly until the end of September at East Soar and Bolberry along with other sites through the south Devon coastline. These surveys are carried out nationally

Butterflies that overwinter have also been on the wing with peacock, red admiral and small tortoiseshell being seen in the sheltered lanes along with the beautiful yellow brimstone butterflies. Our butterfly survey volunteers will start their work checking transects as part of the

and are really important in tracking the success or not of different species. Many butterflies species still struggle due to loss of habitat and the specific foodplants they feed on or lay their eggs on. However last year was a fantastic year for most species with the long settled sunny weather.

You may have seen some new benches on your walks at Bolberry Down, the coast path towards Bolt Tail and at East Soar (there are also new benches at Wembury Point and Revelstoke Drive.) These have all been funded thanks to the South West Coast Path National Trail, and show images of wildlife and farming from the area – a welcome spot to rest on the hilly trail. The SWCP have also funded new fingerposts through South Devon, access-for-all toilets at Wembury Beach and path improvements at Little Dartmouth.

We have also secured funding from the South Devon National Landscapes team to redesign the access path at Snapes Point, which runs from the top of the car park to the headland. This was constantly growing in and not fit for purpose, so we have widened it out and resurfaced it, creating a bund by the field to help keep material from the field creeping onto the path and enabling lots of vegetation growth. This is one of the few flat areas on the site so will enable visitors with mobility restrictions to enjoy this beautiful headland and the views over towards Halwell. We will also repair the water damage on the access path at Bolberry Down.

The work on the new permissive footpath and bridleway at Bolberry was delayed due to the fencing contractors being unable access the site; however it is now well under way with new gates being installed, levelling of the ground and fencing to separate out the access from the farming. There is no launch date yet but we are hoping it will be during late spring / early summer.

I saw my first swallow of the year on Wednesday 25th March – a sign that summer is on the way!

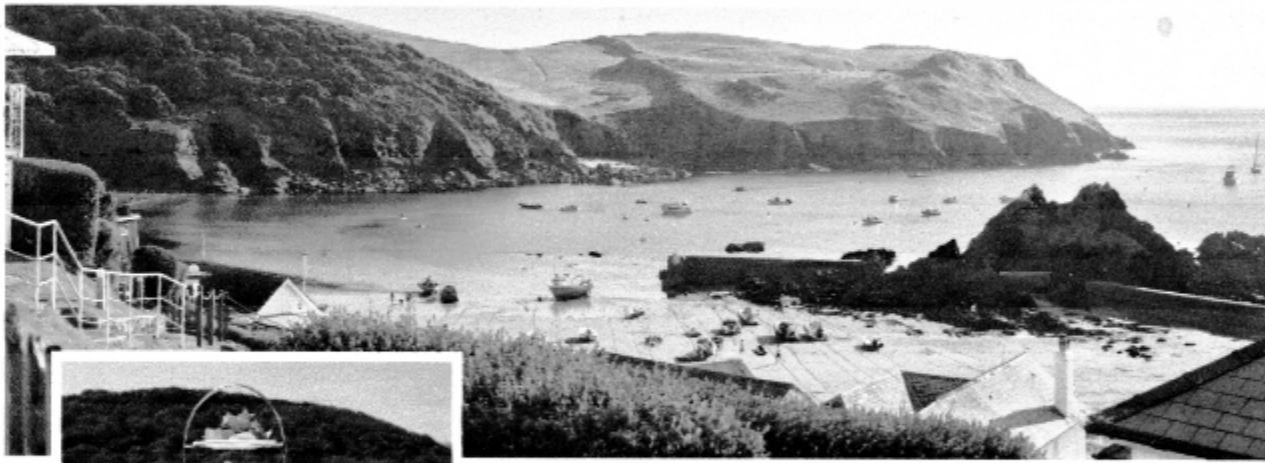
