

House Fire - Tuesday 13th October

Unfortunately the village suffered another house fire late morning on 13^{th} October – a fire which started in an airing cupboard due to an electrical fault and spread to the roof threatening to engulf the two semi-detached properties. Potentially very serious but mercifully by the quick actions of a passer-by and that of a near neighbour the fire was quickly reported, subsequently the very prompt response by the fire service checked the fire in the nip of time. Returning home to see five fire appliances is heart stopping.

In total four fire engines and a water tanker attended and crews deployed a relatively new piece of kit – fog spike, literally a spike which can be jabbed through the fabric of a building or structure and then deliver a high pressure mist which quickly reduces temperature and spread of fire, the fire then being completely extinguished by conventional fire fighting. The net result both properties are still habitable albeit there is fire damage and significant water damage to one plus of course material and personal losses.

It is perhaps timely for a reminder about having working smoke alarms (at least one on each floor level) and checking them weekly. Electrical fires remain a significant statistic for Kent Fire and Rescue and the advice is always to switch off at the socket all appliances and pieces of equipment you are not actually using, particularly tumble driers, washing machines, any kind of charger, furthermore never leave these items unattended or use them over night despite the temptations of cheaper electricity tariffs. All household electrics should be checked by a suitably qualified electrician every few years.

At this time of the year as we head into colder weather chimney fires are all too regular – often as a result of un-swept chimneys / flues or burning unsuitable 'fuel' – chimneys / flues should be cleaned and checked annually. There have been a significant number of injuries recently with persons attempting to fight fires themselves – advice is simply - 'get out, stay out, call 999'. Just 3 breaths of any smoke can kill – carbon monoxide is produced during the burning of any fossil fuel – wood, gas, oil, coal. Carbon monoxide alarms are recommended to provide that vital early warning.

St.John Burch – I would like to thank all those who sent messages of comfort; your words and thoughts are very much appreciated.

I have been prompted to tell you a little more of the life that St.John lead; here is one from the mid 60's – written by St.John's friend Rita.

Sue Burch

St.John and Rita on a Three Masted Schooner

In the sixties when St.John and I were working at Autocue a mutual friend, who had just come back from a trip to Sweden, told us about a beautiful old three masted schooner and a delightful English skipper who was looking for crew to man the ship on a trip to the Greek Islands where he was planning to charter it out. We decided this sounded like a cheap holiday, although neither of us knew anything about sailing, and we told our friend to inform the skipper that we were on our way.

We got a ferry to Gothenburg and tracked down one of the small islands where the ship was moored. Instead of a rapturous welcome, we were enlightened to the fact that skipper and 4 crew, already aboard, had assumed that as 'television people' we obviously had loads of dosh to pay our passage to Greece as paying passengers.

Within a couple of days, however, good fortune smiled on us as two crew members, chief engineer and cook, resigned, and returned to Hull. We were invited to fill the breach, working our passage.

We now had to find about 10 people paying £1 a day which would pay for expenses, ie food mainly as we were living on a diet of rice and tinned reindeer balls. The plan was to put ads on message boards in youth hostels as we sailed to Oslo via the Oslo fjord. We managed to recruit about 8 people and so we set off.

We sailed to Denmark and through the Kiel Canal to Hamburg and thence to Amsterdam which was to be our last port of call before Greece. Charts were purchased, rice and reindeer balls overflowed from cupboards and our mutual friend arrived to accompany the skipper in his lonely position of responsibility.

We set off in a force 9 gale, and the skipper, long ago re-named Capt Ahab, announced that he no longer had any intentions of going to Greece, and was returning to Gothenburg. Fury was unleashed, and he said he would tack up and down the N. Sea until all agreed. Mutiny ensued between Skipper and mutual friend versus the rest. Tempers were high, utensils were thrown and injuries incurred. Fortunately we were off the coast of Esbjerg in Denmark where we were able to put into port for medical assistance.

Escape was now possible, and we fled back to England on the next available ferry with the last of our pocket monies.

Although my culinary skills had been sorely tested, St.John as chief engineer never had to prove himself. Surprisingly, mutual friend remained a friend, although we were never to learn the outcome of the affair.

Chocolate Tart with Crunchy Hazelnut & Frangelico

For the Praline:

150g blanched hazelnuts 125g caster sugar

For the Tart:

300g plain chocolate with 70 per cent cocoa solids, broken up into small pieces

150ml Frangelico 150g unsalted butter, softened at room temperature 4 large eggs, separated 150g icing sugar, sifted 200ml double cream, at room temperature

- 1. For the praline, heat the oven to 180°C. Line a baking tray with non-stick baking paper and set aside. Put the blanched hazelnuts on another baking tray and roast in the oven for about 10 minutes until the nuts turn a light golden colour. Tip on to the baking paper lined tray.
- 2. Pour the caster sugar into a frying pan and, over a very low heat, without stirring at all, allow the sugar to melt. Once melted you can swirl the pan around a little to ensure the sugar cooks evenly. When the sugar has become a rich, brown caramel immediately pour over the hazelnuts and leave to cool completely. Once hard, break up into pieces and place in a food processor. Process to a fine crumb and set aside.
- 3. For the tart, base-line a 22cm spring-form cake tin with a circle of baking paper. Place the chocolate and Frangelico in a pudding basin over a saucepan of gently simmering water, making sure the basin does not come into contact with the water. Melt the chocolate then, using a wooden spoon, beat in, a tablespoon at a time, the room temperature butter. If the mixture starts to separate, stir in a little tepid water to bring it together. Take off the heat and leave to cool for 15-20 minutes. Beat in the egg yolks.
- 4. Place the egg whites in a large mixing bowl and beat to stiff peaks. Gradually beat in the icing sugar. Fold into the chocolate. Whip the cream to floppy peaks and fold into the chocolate. Finally fold in half the praline. Pour into the prepared tin, cover with cling film and refrigerate, preferably overnight, until very firm. To serve, run a knife around the sides and release the spring-form mould. Place a flat serving plate over the chocolate tart and invert. Lift off the metal base and peel off the parchment. Dust the surface with the remaining praline and cut into thin slices. Serve with cream laced with a little Frangelico.

WINDOWS 10 – Security

Windows 10 includes an in-built Security application called Windows Defender. This was also available in Windows 8.

What does this mean to you?

- 1) If you are upgrading you existing PC, there is no need to worry about changing anything regarding your virus protection. If you have applications like Norton or McAfee there is no need to renew your subscriptions and you can uninstall them if you want. This could speed up your PC, but you may need to download a remover to do this. (**Note:** there is no need to uninstall them if you are happy with them).
- 2) If you are buying a new PC, there is no need to purchase additional Virus protection.



Windows Defender works in the same way as MS Security Essentials which was the Virus Protection recommended by the Egerton Telecottage. You need to keep it Updated and Scan you PC regularly, which can be set automatically.

We also recommend installing a *Malware* remover, which you can download free, and

run manually weekly or monthly. You can search for these on the internet, eg: SUPERAntispyware (http://www.superantispyware.com/). Remember to make sure you read the instructions properly and do not download additional applications by accident. Also make sure you check/uncheck boxes that ask if you want marketing material etc.

'Malware' is an umbrella term used to refer to a variety of forms of hostile or intrusive software, including computer viruses, worms, trojan horses, ransomware, spyware, adware, scareware, and other malicious programs.


