## <u>DRESS ON THE GREEN – FURTHER AMPLIFICATION</u>

Following the issue of the Memorandum of Understanding in regard to Dress on the Green it has been further represented, and established that suppliers and manufacturers of bowls wear are increasingly incorporating minimal colour in their products.

We are a harmonious and friendly club and as such have been able to take a pragmatic approach to this problem and re-assess slightly the club requirement of white above the waist, in line with this change in trend, whereby an all white garment, especially warm winter wear is becoming increasingly difficult to find.

Therefore the small use of colour or banding around the sleeve or collar will be perfectly acceptable as will a small amount of coloured piping down the sleeve. As a general rule minimum colour is perfectly acceptable provided the main body of the garment is predominantly white.

All members are to be aware that our designated coaching team whilst undertaking any form of instruction on the green are entitled to wear the distinctive clothing appropriate to their individual coaching qualification.

In addition your Committee discussed in some length whether to include the Dress Code within the Constitution but decided that rules will be kept separate in order that any changes can be authorised by the Committee rather than have to be presented to an EGM/AGM for approval. Please refer to the September Executive Committee minutes for further information.
